

IN EASTERN THEATRE SOON

Events Shaping For Decisive

French and British Continue To Hold Firm Against Terrible Onslaughts of Germans Who Have Kept Up Attacks Almost Continuously For Four Days---British, Almost At Mouth of Enemy's Cannon, Fight Hand-to-Hand with Germans---French Troops Bearing Their Share of the Fighting.

Bulletin—Paris, Sept. 28, 11.08 p. m.—The following official com-munication was issued tonight: "First—On our left wing the reports on the situation are favorable. "Second—On the centre our troops have successfully withstood new and very violent attacks. We have made some slight progress on the heights of the Meuse. In the Woevre region a thick fog has caused a suspension of operations. "Third—On our right wing (Lorraine and the Vosges) there has been no change in the situation. French and British on the left wing have repulsed for days the at-tacks of the Germans who have been endeavoring to take the allied positions by assault.







From this junction of the Biver Aisne with the Oise to the forest of Argonne the battle rages with the greatest flarconess, especially around Bheims, Graonne and Soissons, with varying fortunes, both the Allies and the Germans occasionally gaining a village or the crest of a hill. More significant, perhaps, is the state-ment of the French War Office that the Allies have made progress along the Oise, reaching Lassigny, west of Noyom. This threatens the German right flank. Another report states that the Allies have come in contact with the German line at two points between Marcoign and Le Catelet, which would indicate another effort to turn the German line, possibly by British reinforcements.
