FIRST REPORT

OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE OF THE DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NOVA SCOTIA,

PRESENTED AT THE GENERAL MEETING OF THE SOCIETY,
MAY 22, A. D. 1839.

AT a Special General Meeting of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, held at Halifax in the National School House, on Wednesday Evening, the twenty-second day of May, A. D. 1839—

The Venerable Archdeacon Willis in the Chair,—who proceeded after singing, and Prayers for the Divine blessing and help, to state the objects for which the Meeting had been called. The Assist. Secretary, H. PRYOR,

was then directed to read the Report of the General Committee, prepared by the Secretary, the Revd. W. Cosswell, which was as follows:—

REPORT.

The General Committee of the Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia, desire to tender their congratulations to their Brethren the Representatives of the different Local Committees of this Society, on meeting them for the first celebration of the Anniversary of this Society, and to present to them and to the friends of this Society now assembled, their First Annual Report of the proceedings of the Society, with which they are connected.

The Committee are desirous of redeeming the pledge contained in the Address lately circulated by them in the public prints and otherwise, and to submit such considerations as may it is hoped assure the public of the activity of this Society, of the purity of its principles, and the consistency of its designs, not only with the particular interests of the Church of England, but with the best spiritual and temporal interests of our fellow subjects in this Province.

The Committee confess themselves, however, constrained to limit their assurances concerning the activity of the Society to proofs that it has not been inactive, but has been rather preparing the way for active exertion, than actually occupying the field which is spread out before them. The Committee need not repeat statements which have already been presented to the public, of the need there was for the patronage and co-operation of the great Societies in England, in order to the efficient operation of this Society; and of the kind and liberal manner in which those Societies have extended to us the sanction of their names, and fostered our incipient designs with handsome contributions of money and of books. Through the interest displayed by the Rt. Revd. the President of this Society, in whose absence this Commit-

tee would take the opportunity of expressing their grateful sense of his diligence on their behalf, the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and that for Propagating the Gospel in Foreign Parts, were induced readily to accept the office of Patrons of this Society, and to contribute, as has been stated, to the means of its operation. At the very institution of this Society in Halifax, a number of persons readily came forward to its support, and put down their names as contributors to its The names of other persons have since been added to the list, and tho' it was continually stated to them as they' were solicited, that the object was not so/much to obtain any large amount of money, as it was to unite the feelings of the different Members of our Communion in a bond of love and charity, yet up to the date of this Meeting the sum of £332 14s. 10d. has been received. Immediately upon the return to their homes of the several Clergymen who were present at the institution of this Society, some of them proceeded to form Committees in their Parishes and Districts; and others have since effected their establishment among the people of their charge. From these various Committees different sums have been received, as will appear by the accounts annexed. Partly for the general purposes of the Society, partly for specified objects named by the Committee; amounting together to the sums of £99 14 7½.—For general purposes £73 12 11 -and for special objects named in the account £26 1 81.

These sums are all that have been available to this Committee; as the sum of £300 which was presented by the Society for Propagating the Gospel in Foreign Parts, has been by the request of the Right Rev. President who communicated the donation, reserved till his return among us, and is deposited at interest in one of the Banks.

In the appropriation of their funds, the assistance of Schools and building Churches have principally received the attention of the Committee, tho' the other objects of the Society, as far as they came within the cognizance and the means of this Society, have been occasionally furthered.

These at least have been the objects principally attended to, in subordination to the very desirable purpose of procuring a large supply of Books and Tracts from the stores of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, whose circulation will be of itself no trifling benefit. For this purpose the sum of £75 was placed in the hands of the President on his sailing for England, which sum has been increased by subsequent votes to the amount of £100 sterling; which, together with a sum already on hand as the proceeds of the Books which had been presented to this Society, enabled his Lordship to transmit to our Stores, a quantity of Bibles, Prayer Books, and other Books, to the value of upwards of £250: which Books are now on sale at cost and charges at the Depository of this Society, under the care of Mr. James Maxwell, at the National School. And by a Resolution of the General Committee, passed unanimously on the 24th of January last, it was Resolved, - that the Depositary of this Society be authorized to place small quantities of Books in the hands of such Clergymen or others, Members of this Society, as may apply for them on their own responsibility, to be paid for by them so soon as they shall have been disposed of, an account thereof to be annually rendered by them to the Secretary.

Towards the assistance of Schools in different parts of the Province the following sums have been voted:—£10 in aid of Schools in the District of Margaret's Bay; £5 in aid of a School at Port Piswick.

Towards the erection and enlargement of Churches the following sums:—£15 in aid of the new Church at Three Fathom Harbour; £5 for enlarging the Church at Porter's Lake.

An application was made during the past winter for the assistance of this Society in the education of a young man now at the Academy at Windsor, who is desirous of entering the sacred office of the Ministry, in accordance with the 4th spe-

cified object of this Society: and as it was stated that he would probably ere long have means of refunding any sum that might be advanced to him, without inconvenience, the amount of £25 was voted as a loan to him to be repaid when perfectly convenient to himself. The Committee trust that the character he has borne warrants them in supposing him desirous of entering the Ministry from the purest principles, and that this small appropriation will materially aid him in the prosecution

of his studies for that purpose.

Circumstances have rendered it impossible for this Society to establish a travelling Missionary at their own expense; but as the best mode which was within their reach for carrying out the design of the 2d object of the Society, the sum of £5 has been voted to Mr. C. Handley, of Spry Harbour, and a like sum to Mr. Shelmet, of Sheet Harbour, to encourage them in continuing the assemblage of the people of their settlements for Divine Worship, until a Missionary can; be sent among them. For the various purposes then, of procuring a supply of Books, of aiding the erection of Churches, assisting Schools, promoting the celebration of Divine Worship in destitute settlements, and furthering the education of Candidates for the Ministry, the Committee have expended the sum of Two Hundred and Three Pounds Fifteen Shillings and Ninepence.

In addition to this amount, the General Committee at their Meeting held yesterday at the residence of the Venerable Archdeacon Willis, and subsequent to the writing of this

Report, appropriated the following sums, viz .-

£10 to the Revd. Mr. Gray, in aid of the erection of a new Church at Hammond's Plains.

£10 to the Revd. Mr. Townsend, for the same purpose at Pugwash.

£15 to the Revd. Mr. Shreve, of Guysboro', to assist in providing a suitable Person as a Schoolmaster and Lay Reader at Country Harbor.

£10 to the Revd. Mr. Leaver for the same purpose at

£5 to the Revd. Mr. Coster for the same purpose, at Diligent River, Parrsborough.

£12 to the Revd. Mr. Parker, to assist in paying the travelling expenses of a Lay Reader for the distant parts of his Parish, which can only be visited by him every third or fourth Sunday.

£10 to the Revd. Mr. Stannage for the same purpose.

Thus making the whole amount of expenditure by the Committee £275 15 9—leaving in the hands of the Trea-

surer as available funds, the sum of £56 19 1.

With regard to the purity of the principles on which this Society was formed, and the benefits likely to accrue from its formation, not alone to Members of the Church of England, but to their fellow-subjects throughout the Province, what need your Committee say more than that it is the leading object of this Society to promote a spirit of love among all Christians, to lead to an intelligent acquaintance with the doctrines and discipline of the Church of England among her Members, to furnish the means of religious instruction to those yet destitute of them, and to inculcate those sentiments of loyalty and virtue, which, without in any degree taxing the sentiments of others, this Committee believe to be intimately connected with a sincere attachment to the Church of Eng-Conscientiously attached to the Communion of that Church, and believing her Doctrines to be strictly those of the Blessed Word of God, and her discipline most in accordance with Apostolic models, this Committee are desirous of extending the knowledge of her doctrines, and the bounds of her communion wherever a field may be open for their exertion. "Peace and good will towards men," they would desire to have as their watchword in all their efforts, and they would bid God speed to any that are earnestly seeking and labouring for the salvation of souls. In the furtherance of

these designs in the promotion of their principles in the inculcation of this spirit, the Committee would earnestly call upon their brethren of the Local Committees and other Members of this Society, for earnest and diligent co-operation—they would appeal to them not to withhold their exertions in the formation of Local Committees in their respective parishes—nor to limit their contributions for the promotion of the great object of this Society; and they would humbly trust that by the blessing of their great Head, their efforts as assistants in the great work of the larger Societies, whose Patronage they gratefully acknowledge, may be effectual in extending the limits of the Redeemer's Kingdom, and in giving occasion to many souls to glorify the Lord that bought them.

The Hon'ble. Chief Justice Hallieurton then addressed the Chair, and moved that the Report be adopted by the Society, and printed under the direction of the General Committee—which being seconded by the Revd. Mr. Coster, with an amendment,—that a resolution of the General Committee, passed on the 24th of January, 1839, be embodied in the Report, which was unanimously passed,—

The Revd. Mr. Owen then moved the second Resolution, after having first made some excellent and appropriate remarks connected therewith:—

"That this Society entertains the liveliest hope of the favor and blessing of Almighty God upon the design they have in view of promoting his honor by spreading the knowledge of his name, and earnestly call upon those members and friends, their brethren of the local committees, and others, for diligent co-operation in effecting the objects of

this Society"—which Resolution being seconded by Mr. DAVID HARE, was unanimously passed."

His Honor Mr. Justice BLISS, seconded by the Revd.

T. C. LEAVER, moved the following Resolution :-

"That this Society has heard with the liveliest satisfaction of the kind patronage extended and the munificent donations made to them by the Societies for Propagating the Gospel in Foreign Parts, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and would respectfully tender to them their warmest thanks for their patronage and support, and that the Right Revd. President be requested to communicate this resolution to those Societies"—which was unanimously passed.

The Honble. T. N. Jeffery, seconded by the Hon. W. B. Almon, moved the fourth Resolution, which was

also unanimously passed, viz:-

"That this Society heartily adopt the recommendation of the General Committee, dated 8th of August, 1838, and pledge themselves so far as their means admit, to pay all such travelling expenses incurred by Clergymen, in carrying out the 2nd and 3rd object of this Society, as the Right Revd. President shall recommend them to defray."

It was then on motion Resolved and unanimously agreed

to,--

"That the thanks of this Society be given to our worthy President, for his active exertions made on our behalf in the Parent Kingdom, and that the Vice-President of this Meeting be directed to forward this Resolution to His Lordship. A Resolution was likewise unanimously passed,—That the thanks of this Society be given to the Revd. Wm. Cogswell, for the able manner in which he has conducted the business of the Society as Secretary thereof. And that the Assistant Secretary be directed to enclose him a copy of this Resolution."

A vote of thanks was then given to the Ven'ble. Archdeacon Willis, for the able manner in which he had conducted the business of the Meeting,—and also to the Assist. Secretary, HENRY PRYOR, for his services.

The Officers of the Society were re-elected, with the exception of C. W. H. HARRIS, Esq. and Capte Kelly, both these Gentlemen having left Halifax. A. M. UNIACKE and H. INCE, Esquires, were chosen in their stead.

The Meeting after singing the Doxology; and the concluding prayer, and blessing being pronounced by the Venble. Archdeacon Willis,—adjourned.

The Secretary was directed to call upon the different Clergymen to send to him the names of the Subscribers in their respective Parishes to the Diocesan Church Society, and where it could be done,—also the amount subscribed by each person, so that the Lists might be published at the same time with the report. The Secretary was also directed to have the Treasurer's accounts printed with the Report.

It was on motion resolved, that it be represented to the Right Reverend President, that it is the opinion of the different Members of this Committee, that the General Meeting of this Society should be held on some day in the Month of February, as the most suitable period of the year.

It was on motion resolved, That the General Committee should hold their quarterly meetings, on the third Wednesday in the Months of August, November, February, and May.

It was on motion resolved, that the Clergy be requested to renew their exertions in forming Local Committees in their respective Parishes. These two Resolutions to be

printed, together with the Report.

It was on motion resolved, that a Committee consisting of the Clergymen of the Town and Dartmouth, together with H. Ince and A. M. Uniacke, Esquires, be appointed to examine the Catalogue of the Books in the Depository, and report to the next meeting, as to the propriety of reducing the prices of the same, and of rendering the Books as saleable as possible.

It was on motion resolved, that the undermentioned

sums should be paid as follows, viz.

£25 to Revd. Dr. Shreve, in aid of the erection of a new Church at Chester, so soon as the Frame is boarded in and shingled, and that he certifies the same to the Committee.

£25 to Revd. Mr. Cochran, in aid of the new Church

at La Have, on the like terms.

£5 to Revd. Dr. Shreve, to be paid to Mr. George Turner, a lay reader, appointed by him for the Western Shore of Chester Bay.

£2 10 to Revd. Mr. Owen, to enable him to purchase

Books for the Day and Sunday Schools at Dalhousie.

£2 10 to Revd. Mr. Gray, ditto for colored School at Hammond Plains. The Meeting then adjourned.
