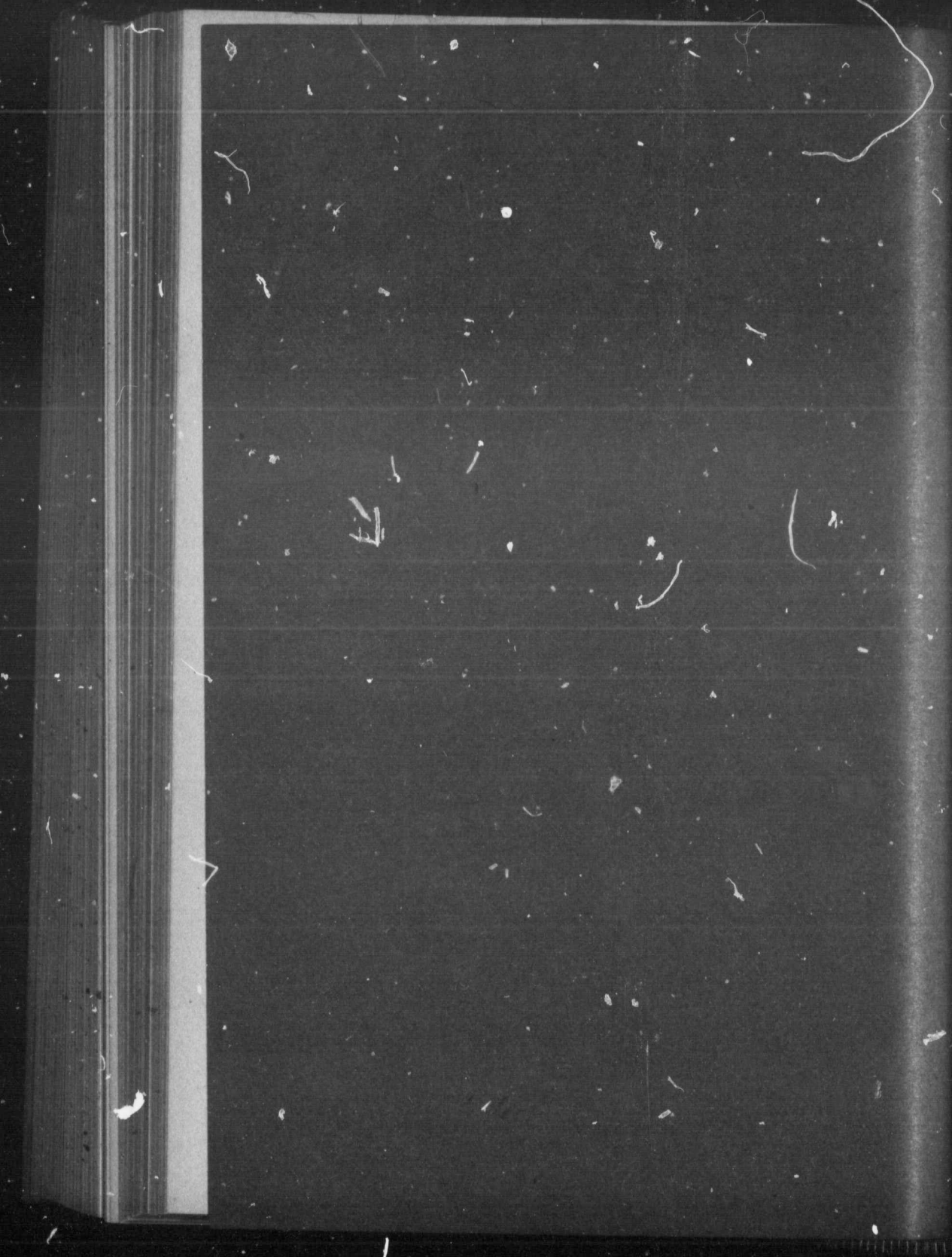

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL  
OF THE

The Council have the honour to submit the Nineteenth Annual Report of the Proceedings of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, and venture to hope that the continued success of the representative team sent to compete at Wimbledon, and the very largely increased interest shown in the Annual Matches held on the Rideau Ranges in Ottawa will induce the supporters of the Association to continue and increase their assistance.

The thanks of the Association are hereby tendered to His Excellency the Governor-General for his continued interest in the Association and his liberal subscription to its funds, and also for his gift of Silver and Bronze Medals to the Provincial Rifle Associations ;

To the Government and Members of the House of Commons for the liberal grant voted to the Association at the last session ;

To the Hon. Sir A. P. Caron, K.C.M.G., Minister of Militia and Defence, for his continued active interest in the affairs of the Association.

To Lt.-Colonel Quimet, M.P., Chairman of Council for his donation of one hundred dollars to the General Prize Fund ;

The Canada Club, of London, again presented to the Wimbledon Team a handsome silver cup, to become the property of the member of the team making the highest aggregate score in the Wimbledon competition, Trooper Beatty, of the 8th Cavalry Regiment, was the fortunate winner, and the Council, on behalf of the Association, beg leave to tender their thanks to the Club for their continued encouraging liberality.

The aggregate winnings of the Wimbledon (1886) Team were £384.10.0 sterling, besides four N. R. A. badges (for places in the Queen's hundred), a bronze cross in the grand aggregate, a silver cup in the Colonial Prizes (value £25 sterling), and some prizes in kind.

It should be stated in this connection that in the aggregate winnings of £384.10. sterling, is included £121 sterling, its share of the winnings of the handsome donation of £250 by the city of London, for competition by all colonials, and marksmen from India, which prize appeared for the first time on the Wimbledon list this year.

The Kolapore Cups were won by the English Team with a score of 666 points—Canada being second with a score of 646, or only 20 points behind. The other competing teams were : Guernsey 636, Jersey 626, Australia 616, and India 595. By the perusal of the report of Lt.-Col. Tyrwhitt, Commandant of the Team, it will be seen that the Association are under obligations to Lt.-Col. Humphrey, commanding 2nd Cambridge University Volunteers, for his kindness and attention to the Team whilst practising on the range at Cambridge, the week before the commencement of the matches at Wimbledon—and also to Mr. Dyke for invaluable assistance rendered by him to the team whilst at Liverpool.

At the annual general meeting, held 1st September 1885, on the Rideau Ranges, whilst the discussion as to the advisability of abolishing sighting shots was proceeding, it was urged in favour of the proposition that by so doing the matches might be shot through in one day's less time, and thus enable a majority of the competitors to return home within the week. The Executive Committee of Council prepared a programme with this end in view, but they are bound to admit it was only a partial success ; it made the work too hard

for the competitors and hurried them too much, and the Council are of opinion that another day or at least half a day should be added to the time, that the competitors would be better pleased, and the staff would have more time to do their work.

As regards entries, the last annual matches proved a great success, as the comparative statement below will shew; and the Association sustained no loss financially by abolishing sighting shots.

In the Military Matches there were the same number of Teams (9) competing as in 1885; the firing therein was an improvement on that of the previous year, as the British Challenge Shield was won in 1886 with 64 hits and a score of 282, as compared with 61 hits and a score of 241 in 1885, and out of the 900 rounds fired 471 hits were made in 1886 as compared with 439 in 1885.

In the Gzowski Match, the same nine corps competing and firing

a total of 734 hits and 3118 score in 1886, against 674 hits and 2716 score in 1885.

A pleasing feature of the meeting was the presence of Lt-Colonel Wolfenden and a team of eight marksmen from the province of British Columbia, the members of which competed in all the individual and team matches, except that for the London Merchants' Cup. This is the first occasion on which every province in the Dominion has been represented by a Team on the Rideau Range, and enabled the competition for the remaining \$100 for the Marquis of Lorne's handsome prize of \$500 to be completed.

The increase of Annual Membership from 101 to 141 shows a movement in the right direction—slow though it is—but the friends of the Association should not rest contented until the membership is increased to a thousand.

Every year the Association has secured the gratuitous services of Medical Officer of one or other of the local corps, so that they might be on the ground in case of accident. At the late meeting this voluntary service was most satisfactorily performed by Dr. Powell, Surgeon, and Dr. Scott, Assistant Surgeon, of the 43rd Ottawa and Carleton Rifles, and although, happily no accident occurred, and their professional services were consequently not called into requisition, the thanks of the Association are due to those gentlemen for the time they so generously devoted to a sufficiently exacting duty.

The Council before closing this portion of the report have to thank the Range Officers and the Staff generally for close attention to their duties, which was more arduous than usual, owing to the matches being shot through in four days instead of five.

#### FINANCE.

For a full account of the finances of the Association, the Council refers to the Treasurer's Statement, duly audited, and submitted herewith.

The balance sheet shows the total receipts from all sources for the

year to have been \$17,108.28, which with the balance of \$1,319.71 from last year makes a total on the credit side of \$18,427.99. The expenditure amounted to \$16,357.63, leaving a balance of \$2,070.36 in favor of the Association.

This is exclusive of the balance of \$123.21 at credit of Special Account, carried over from last year, being part of the Marquis of Lorne's donation for Provincial Prizes. The Province of British Columbia, having competed this year, received the sum of \$100.00 as prizes; the balance of \$23.21, with \$2.51 accrued interest, leaves a total of \$25.72 for interest at credit of that account, to be distributed proportionately to the Provinces entitled to the same.

In the ordinary sources of revenue slight increases will be observed. The affiliation fees from Rifle Associations amounted to \$680.00, as against \$655.00 in 1885, increase of \$25.00, the number of Affiliating Rifle Associations being as follows, viz. :—

Provincial Rifle Associations eight, being an increase of one over last year; the Saskatchewan Rifle Association, Prince Albert, North-West Territories, having affiliated for the first time: the number of County and other Rifle Associations being the same as last year.

Members' subscriptions for the year amounted to \$280.00, an increase of \$78.00 over last year.

Associate members' fees amounted to \$280.00, as against \$278.00 last year, an increase of \$2.00.

The receipts from "Special Donations," "Banks" and "Manufacturers" amounted to \$1,800.00, an increase of \$100.00 as compared with 1885.

The entry fees this year, including post entries and fines for challenge shots, amounted to \$3,169.50, as against \$3,125.64 in 1885, an increase of \$43.86, notwithstanding the abandoned revenue from sighting shots, blow-off tickets and pools, hitherto received. This was more than recouped by the increased charge for entry in the "Dominion of Canada Match" and "Grand Aggregate," the greater number of entries in the Extra Series and "Martini" Matches, and the saving of one day's expenses in the time of the meeting—as will be seen by the annexed comparative statement of receipts from that source.

The expenditure connected with the Wimbledon Team this year amounted to \$5,977.51, as against \$6,235.25 in 1885, being \$257.74 less than last year's.

Prizes in cash and badges amounted to \$6,059.18, a small increase of \$36.15 as compared with last year.

REPORT OF  
LIEUT.-COLONEL TYRWHITT,  
Commanding Wimbledon Team 1886.

To *Lieut.-Colonel Kirkpatrick, President Dominion of Canada Rifle Association :*

SIR,—Having been appointed to command the Canadian Wimbledon Team of 1886, I have the honor to report that in accordance with the instructions received, dated 2nd June, 1886, I proceeded to Quebec and on the 23rd June all the members of the team (with the exception of Capt. Adam, 13th Battalion, who had received special permission to go to England in advance) reported themselves to me and subscribed to the Regulations in triplicate.

I inspected the team and found it necessary to procure four bayonets, a cavalry sword, and a tunic, to complete their equipment, which, through the kindness of Lt.-Col. Duchesnay, D.A.G., I was enabled to get from the stores at Quebec.

On Thursday, the 24th June, we embarked on the "Polynesian," where every preparation was made for our reception through the foresight of the Treasurer of the Association, and we took possession of the state-rooms assigned to us.

We landed in Liverpool at 11 a.m. on Saturday the 3rd July, and after lunch proceeded by the first train to Cambridge *via* Bletchley. I received invaluable assistance while in Liverpool from Mr. Dyke, who had arranged with the railway authorities that we should travel at a reduced rate while engaged in our official capacity in England.

Prior to arriving in Cambridge I had been advised by telegraph, that arrangements had been made for our reception at the Hoop Hotel. There we proceeded in confiding innocence to find that we were not expected until the following Monday, that the house was already full to overflowing, that the men had to be billeted in various houses outside the hotel, and this may be accounted for from the fact that it happened to be Newmarket week, the assizes were in session, and there was an influx of Colonial visitors to the town.

Our stay at Cambridge was rendered very pleasant owing to the kindness and attention we received from Lt.-Col. Humphry and other gentlemen, residents of the town.

The Vice Chancellor of the University kindly invited the several members of the team to be present in the Senate House to witness the ceremony of conferring the degree of "Doctor of Laws" upon the High Commissioner of Canada (Sir Charles Tupper) and other distinguished colonial representatives. The Vice Chancellor also invited the Adjutant (Capt. Prevost) and myself to dine with the distinguished visitors.

Where kindness was so universally bestowed, as it was in Cambridge, it is almost invidious to mention names, so that I have confined myself to mentioning those whose names it was impossible to omit.

The practice at Cambridge was of a character to inspire me, and others who were witnesses of it, with confidence and extraordinary expectations for the success of the team at Wimbledon.

On the 9th we had a match with a team from the University Rifles, our team being divided into two teams of nine each, one from the Province of Ontario, the other from the Province of Quebec and the Maritime Provinces. Both of our teams succeeded in making larger scores than the University team, the eight highest—from the Ontario team, making the unusually large score of 720 points, or 70 points more than won the Kolapore in 1885.

The team received every attention and some good advice from Sergt. Aplin in charge of the range, and gave him a slight token of their appreciation of his services before leaving the range.

To encourage the men during the match on the 9th inst., Capt. Prevost and I offered prizes to the value of £3.2.6, which prizes were won by Trooper Beatty and Private Kimmerly, making 93 and 91 points respectively in the 21 rounds fired that day.

The team left Cambridge for Wimbledon by the earliest train on Saturday the 10th, going *via* Bletchley in order to utilize the return ticket with which we had been provided.

I had previously sent Capt. Prevost to London to make our entries and arrange about the pitching of tents, so that on our arrival we only had to take possession and to make arrangements for improving the appearance of our camp by the addition of some flowers which have made the Canadian camp so attractive in the past and have done more to bring Canada prominently before the ordinary pedestrian—of whom tens of thousands visit the camp during the meeting—than the shooting qualities of the men composing the team.

Having been instructed to economize in the matter of flowers, I attempted to cut down the estimate from former years, but found, for a very slight reduction in the price, it was proposed to largely reduce the quantity of flowers. I therefore arranged with the florist to give me an unusual number of flowers for the same money, hoping that in this way the Association might be to a certain extent recouped for the outlay.

I need scarcely add that our flowers were the admiration of all, and will, I think, have the effect of inducing other camps to make attempts in the same direction in succeeding years.

I would advise the Association either to give up floral decoration altogether or to do it as well as former years.

On the following sheets is a list of entries I made for the team.

In an early stage of the meeting I was advised by Mr. G. Mortimer, that it was the intention of the Canada Club to present a Cup to the member of the team who should make the highest aggregate score during the meeting, in the matches for which *all* the members of the team were regularly entered by my authority.

On the 24th July Mr. Gillespie, who had been deputed by the Club to make the presentation in their behalf, appeared in camp, our men were assembled and paraded for his inspection.

Captain Prevost, who had kept a careful record of the scores of the men in all the matches, announced that Trooper Beatty, 8th Cavalry, N.B., had made the highest aggregate score in all the matches in which all the members of the team had competed.

Whereupon Mr. Gillespie, in the name of the Canada Club, formally made the presentation in words expressing high commendation of the appearance and performances of the team as a body, of the high character they bore in camp, and of the manner in which they had maintained the honor of the Dominion in the many contests in which they had been her champions.

He concluded by alluding in warm terms to his early association with the Dominion, and hoping that she might prosper in the future as she had done in the past.

He congratulated Trooper Beatty upon being the fortunate recipient (where all had done so well) of this mark of the approval of his fellow colonists.

I thanked Mr. Gillespie and the Canada Club in Trooper Beatty's

behalf, and proceedings were brought to a close by the team giving three cheers for The Queen, The Canada Club, and Mr. Gillespie.

In order to give the men practice I entered them in every available match.

The list of the different matches appears in Return "A". Return "B" shows the prizes won and the names of the different winners.

The amount awarded to each member of the team from the gross winnings appears in Return "C".

Return "D" represents the scores made by the different teams in the competition for the Kolapore Cup. The result of this match was the Home team first, Canada second, Guernsey third, Jersey fourth, Australia fifth, and India sixth.

The most extraordinary feature in this match was that the Canadian team beat the winning team by twenty points at the six hundred yards range.

The weather during the whole of the meeting at Wimbledon was wet and unfavorable to the colonists unaccustomed to firing in the rain, some of our best men failing in several of the matches on that account.

It is my pleasing duty to acknowledge the very great courtesy and attention shown to the Canadians by the officers of the National Rifle Association, and by all the volunteers assembled at Wimbledon.

To the officers of the London Scottish we are indebted for many acts of kindness; we were welcomed as their guests on our arrival in camp.

Our success in any match was a subject for congratulation from all sides, and so great a spirit of fair play pervaded all ranks that they almost preferred our winning to winning themselves.

The acquittance roll signed by the different members of the team appears among the miscellaneous receipts already handed in.

As on former occasions the Canadian Camp was visited by many distinguished persons, including His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, who expressed his pleasure at seeing a Canadian team again in England.

Sir Henry Wilmot, Col. Eaton, Col. Humphry, Sir Charles Tupper, and many distinguished Canadians visited our camp.

I enclose herewith a statement of receipts and expenditure con-

xxx.

nected with the duties entrusted to me, and an Acquittance Roll signed by each of the men.

In conclusion, I desire to thank the members of the team for their steadiness, good conduct, and obedience. I am deeply indebted to Capt. Prevost, my second in command, for his strict attention to the details of the firing and for his hearty support in all my endeavors to promote the interest and success of the team.

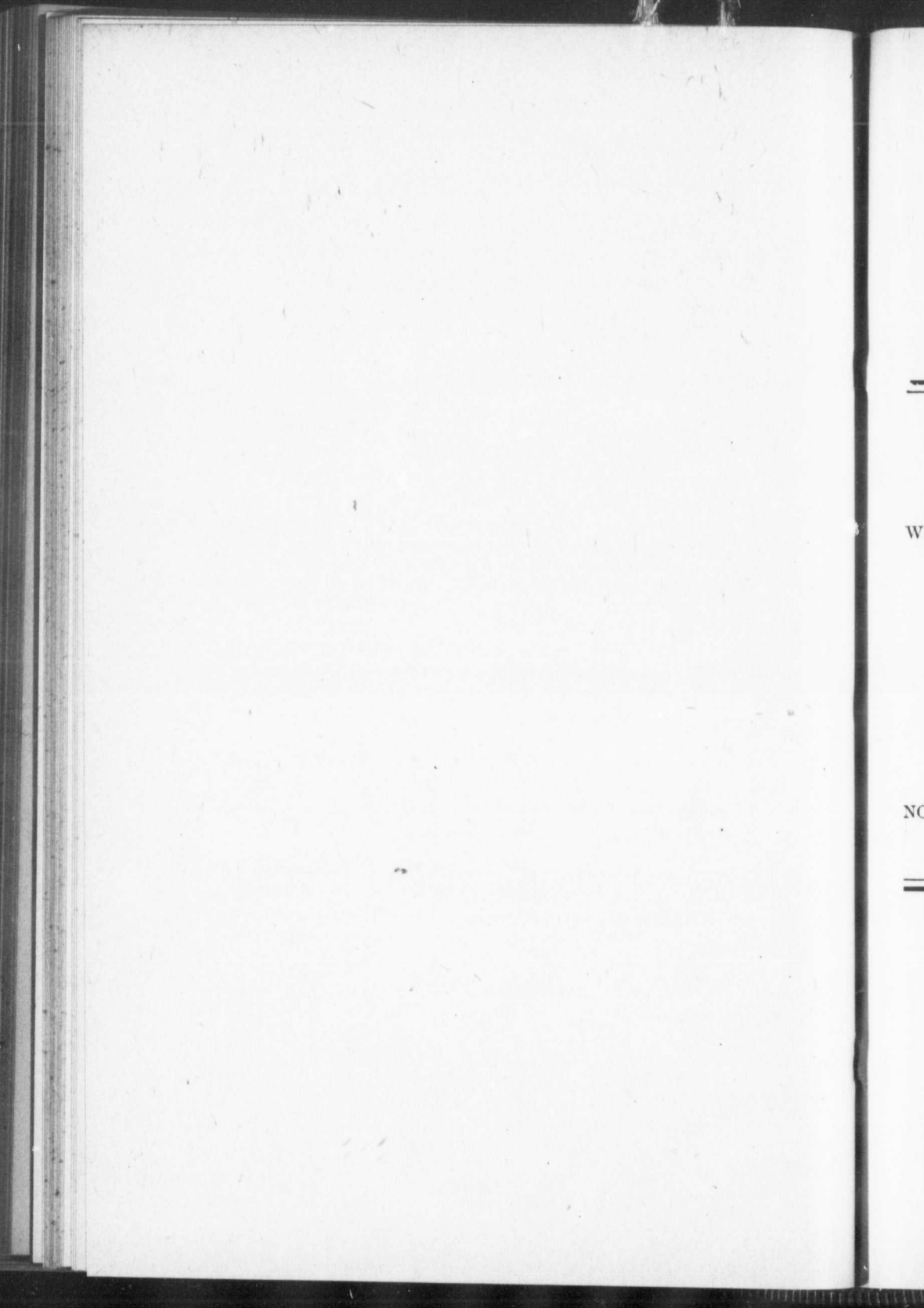

*Distance.*—Skirmishing between 300 and 400 yards.

*Position.*—Kneeling.

*Target.*—6 ft. x 2 ft. 6 in. Each target to be exposed for 15 seconds at a time, with an interval of about 10 seconds between each exposure.

*Number of Rounds.*—Such number as each competitor can fire in the 3 minutes allotted to the competition, but in no case to exceed 15 rounds.

*Rifles, Dress, Equipment, Etc.*—As in the Gzowski and British Challenge Shield Matches.

*Entrance.*—Free.

“That Surgeon-General Bergin, M.P., and Capt. Gourdeau be elected members of Council for the Province of Prince Edward Island for the ensuing year.”—Carried.

*Memo.*—Dr. J. T. Jenkins, M.P., and L. H. Davies, Esq., M.P., were elected members of Council at the Annual Provincial Rifle Association Meeting, held at Charlottetown, 21st April, 1886.

Moved by Capt. H. F. Perley, seconded by Lt.-Col. White—

“That the following be added to Clause 10 of the Constitution, immediately after the word “members” in the second line of said

clause : "and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during the term of office, the same may be filled by the Executive Committee from the members of Council."—Carried.

The President read a telegram, received by the Secretary, from the Secretary of the Manitoba Rifle Association, to the following effect, and dated the 17th March :—"Annual Meeting of Manitoba Rifle Association held to-night. Following resolution passed : That it is the opinion of the M. R. A. that, in view of the fact of the Martini-Henry being the only rifle now used by the volunteers of Great Britain, it is advisable to encourage the use of that weapon more largely in Canada ; and that this motion be sent to the Dominion Rifle Association, as an expression of our opinion."

Whereupon, it was moved by Geo. Casey, Esq., M. P., seconded by Capt. Harston—

"That this Association, having considered the resolution adopted by the Manitoba Rifle Association in reference to the use of an improved rifle, agrees with that Association in expressing the opinion that our Militia should be as well armed as those of Great Britain."

Mr. Baker, M.P., brought up a letter he had received from the British Columbia Association, stating that at their last meeting they had resolved to send a team to Ottawa next fall, if possible, and as a considerable item in the attendant expense would be the railway fares, it was decided that the D. R. A. would find out from the Canadian Pacific Railway their lowest possible figures from Port Moody to Ottawa and return.

## D. R. A. COMPETITORS' ANNUAL MEETING.

The annual meeting of competitors was held in the Ottawa Drill Hall on the evening of Tuesday, the 31st August. Lt.-Col. Kirkpatrick occupied the chair.

There was a very large attendance of competitors and others interested, prominent amongst whom were :—Col. Panet, Deputy Minister of Militia ; Lt.-Cols. Macpherson, Gibson, White, Mackintosh, Macdonald, Wolfenden, and Jones ; Majors Macpherson, Prior, Walsh, Todd, Buchan, and Jackson ; Asst.-Surgeon McLaughlin ; Captains Perley, Barnhill, Weston, Garrison, Adam, Sims, Jones, Thomas, Macdonald, (Q.O.R.), Macdonald (R.L.), Newton, Brown, Ibbotson, Hartt, Manley, Kinnear, Corbin, and Sparham ; Lieuts. Machnachtan, Gray, Thompson, and Busted. All ranks were well represented.

The Chairman, after expressing the pleasure it afforded him to see such a large gathering on this occasion, briefly explained the objects of this—the “grievance meeting,” as it had been styled. He invited those who had grievances to fully air them, and asked for any suggestions which any one present might desire to make concerning the annual prize meetings. The President having concluded—

Capt. Weston (66th) started a lively discussion by making the following motion, seconded by Capt. Kinnear, on behalf of which he made an able address :—“*Resolved*, that this meeting do recommend to the Council of the Association that at further prize meetings all the matches be shot with Martini-Henry rifles.” In his remarks, Capt. Weston dwelt strongly upon the undesirability of the Snider at the longer ranges.

Staff-Sergeant Sutherland, G.G.F.G., suggested, in view of the difficulty which must be met with in an attempt to entirely abolish the Snider from the meeting, that it be used up to 500 yards only, and that the Martini be substituted at longer ranges.

Asst.-Surgeon McLaughlin (45th) said it would be well to hasten slowly in this matter. The old shots were one by one passing away, and their places were being filled with recruits from a force armed wholly with the Snider, and accustomed to its use alone, and this fact should be considered.

Lt.-Col. Gibson (13th) favored Staff-Sergeant Sutherland's sugges-

tion, if it were impossible to have the Martini served out to the force. He was convinced that with the Snider the best shots did not come to the front, the element of chance entering so largely. He thought it might be possible for the Council to do something with the resolution.

Major Blaiklock (Royal Scots) was of opinion that it would be some time yet before the Snider rifle would be done away with in Canada. Recent fighting in this country had been at less distance than 500 yards, and any that the force might be called upon to do in future would likely be within this distance also. This being the case, he did not think the Government had any intention at present to arm the force with anything but the Snider. The suggestion that the annual matches should be divided into two aggregates—one for 200, 400 and 500 yards with the Snider, and one at 200, 500 and 600 with the Martini, so that men would not be called upon to shoot in the Governor-General's match with a weapon they were not accustomed to at a less distance than 600 yards.

Private Russell (45th) believed that the competitors present had this year done very little practice with the Snider, all who could get them having been using Martinis. Then because they made poor scores with a weapon with which they had no practice, they condemned the poor old rifle and ammunition. He did not believe in combining Snider and Martini shooting. He suggested to use the Snider for two days of the meeting in matches making up all comers' aggregate, and then with the Martini to shoot for places on the Wimbledon Team.

The Chairman said that so long as the Association remained as at present associated with the Militia force, and in receipt of grants from the Government and from the Militia Department, for so long would it be impossible to do away with the arm of the force. It must be remembered, too, that the Martini was on its trial as well as the Snider, and that a great many rifle shots in England were of the opinion that the Martini was not the coming weapon. Perhaps, as Staff-Sergeant Sutherland proposed, they might get the Martini introduced at distances over 500 yards, and he suggested that the motion be so amended, as it would be in a more practical form.

Captain Manley, Royal Grenadiers, favoured such an amendmant. Major Todd, G. G. F. G., said the duty devolved upon the Association of encouraging and promoting, as much as possible, good shooting with the Snider Rifle, the arm of the force. He would be sorry to see anything done which would tend to lessen the practice with that weapon. He was in favour, however, of the suggestion that there be two aggregates, one for Snider and one for Martini, from the latter the Wimbledon Team to be chosen, but he would advocate that the Governor-General's prize be awarded in the Snider match, to encourage shooting with it, as the arm of most use in the country.

Captain Hartt, St. John Rifles, said that to make Martini shooting decide the places on the Wimbledon Team was to put the Snider altogether in the background. The chief object of the D. R. A. was to put a cap upon rifle shooting in Canada and to fit men for the other side, and therefore his views accorded with those of Captain Weston. But if they could not shoot Martini at all ranges, then he would be glad to accept it at 600 yards.

Assistant Surgeon McLaughlin dissented from the statement that Wimbledon was the chief object of the D. R. A. meeting. He thought it was to improve shooting in Canada, and for this a few went over to England each year and came back to improve the force.

Lt.-Col. White, 43rd, took it that the chief object of the Association was to encourage shooting in the Dominion, and to ask that the Snider be abolished was, he considered, an absurdity. The Association could not afford to ignore the arm of the country.

Lt.-Col. Gibson, 13th, then moved in amendment, seconded by Lt.-Col. Jones, 38th, and it was resolved—

“That the Council be requested to give greater prominence to the Martini-Henry Rifle in the annual matches, and that regular matches shot with that Rifle be taken into the aggregate.”

Captain Sims, Victoria Rifles, suggested that in future the Adjutant of the Wimbledon Team should be chosen from Officers who have been to England on the Team, or who at least have earned places in the sixty here. He held that a man who knew nothing about shooting was of very little assistance to the Team, and he did not think that the Adjutant's work should, as it had sometimes in the past, devolve necessarily upon some member of the Team who, having been over once before, knew more about the duties.

Major Todd, G. G. F. G., moved a recommendation that in future ricochet shots be awarded the value of the hits they make. After discussion the motion was lost.

Captain Hartt, St. John Rifles, moved, seconded by Major Blaiklock, Royal Scots, that the Council be requested to have the London Merchant's Cup match in future shot with the Martini, and that the 200 yards range be added to it, so that the conditions be assimilated to those of the Kalapore Cup match. The motion was carried.

Captain Sims, Victoria Rifles, suggested that in future the competitors should be allowed to make their own arrangements with the railways. He thought riflemen were as good as baseball, football or lacrosse players, and did not see why they should not get similar great reduction when travelling to attend matches.

Captain Sims also suggested that at the prize meetings competitors should be compelled to pay more attention to their dress.

Captain Perley, H. Q. S., moved a recommendation that a medal should be presented to each member of team winning the British Challenge Shield, so that when the trophy was handed over to the next victors the former holders should have something to shew for it. The 13th Battalion had, he said, presented a very handsome badge to their team which won it last year, and he suggested that this design should be adopted for the proposed D. R. A. badge.—Carried.

Assistant Surgeon McLoughlin, 45th, moved, seconded by Captain Adam, 13th, and it was resolved—

“That in the opinion of this meeting fouling shots should be allowed.” It was suggested that if this recommendation were carried into effect a proper pit or pits for “fouling” should be provided as a matter of safety.—Carried.

Captain Macdonald moved, seconded by Captain Hartt—

That the Council be requested to endeavor to secure a modification of the conditions of the British Challenge Shield match, respecting equipment.—Carried.

Major Todd moved that the Council be requested to have constructed two or more targets after the pattern of the model as patented and exhibited by Private J. A. Morrison, “‘C’ Co. I. S. C.,” to be placed on Rideau Ranges during the summer of 1887, in order that the same may be practically tested before next meeting of the D. R. A.

The motion was lost and the meeting then adjourned.

COUNCIL MEETING HELD UNDER BY-LAW No. 2.

DECEMBER 8TH, 1886.

1. The report adopted by the Executive Committee of Council, in pursuance of resolution passed at a meeting of Council, 7th March, 1884, was submitted to the meeting by Lt.-Col. White, Chairman of Executive Committee of Council, with draft of an address and copy of an inscription—

2. It was moved by Lt.-Col. White, seconded by Lt.-Col. Jackson, "That the report, address and inscription, as submitted, be adopted."  
—Carried.

3. Moved by Lt.-Col. Hon. Geo. A. Kirkpatrick, seconded by Lt.-Col. D. A. Macdonald, "That the report *in extenso* be not published, but only the address and inscription, which are as follows :

*To Colonel Gzowski, A.D.C. to Her Majesty the Queen, late President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association :—*

SIR,—While with unfeigned regret we address you as late President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, it is a pleasure we gladly avail ourselves of in accordance with the foregoing resolution of Council of the Association to present this brief address, with the accompanying Sporting Rifle, the acceptance of which we beg at your hands, as a memento of our appreciation of your long services as President.

The regret we feel at the severance of our official connection is only exceeded by the pleasant recollections we have of our past relations under your guiding and successful administrations.

Your untiring and self-denying services in the cause of rifle shooting have helped in no slight degree to stimulate the Militia of Canada to maintain Rifle Associations, and to perfect themselves in the use of the rifle, and thereby have added to the general efficiency of the Militia force of the Dominion.

Trusting that you may long be spared to aid us with your council and advice in all matters affecting the Association in which you have evinced so deep an interest, we subscribe ourselves, on behalf of the riflemen of Canada.

## THE INSCRIPTION.

“ Presented through the Council of the Dominion Rifle Association to Colonel Gzowski, A.D.C. to the Queen, on his retirement in 1884 from the Presidency of the Association, in recognition of the valuable services rendered by him to the rifle-men and Rifle Associations of the Dominion.”

## 4. Moved by Major Tilton, seconded by Major Blaiklock—

“ That the President of the Association, the Chairman of Council, and the Chairman of the Executive Committee be a Committee to carry out the terms of the report adopted by Council as to the ‘ Gzowski Testimonial,’ and to incur the necessary expense in connection therewith ; that they be a Committee, with power to add to their number, to make the presentation of the Testimonial and Address referred to.”—  
Carried.

## 5. Moved by Capt. Perley, seconded by Lieut. Gray—

“ That in conformity with the suggestion made at the Competitors’ Meeting on September 1st, 1886, the Executive Committee be authorized to inquire into the cost of procuring and providing badges for the members of the team winning the British Challenge Shield, and report to the Council next meeting.”

It was moved in amendment by Major Anderson, seconded by Captain Toller—

“ That in the opinion of the meeting it was not expedient at present to increase the number of badges given by the Association.”

The amendment was carried.

The meeting then adjourned.

# REGULATIONS.



The Prize Meeting of the Association will be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

## NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

1. *Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the Conditions of any Match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.*
2. *Competitors must refer to the Notice Board morning and afternoon to ascertain whether orders have been issued altering the original detail of the shooting, or affecting them personally.*
3. *Competitors must comply with all orders given by the Executive Officer or the Range Officers on duty.*

## GENERAL REGULATIONS.

I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.

II.—No Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer, or Private employed by the D. R. A. for duty at the firing points or in the butts shall shoot either for a prize or for practice.

III.—In competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corp shall be worn, viz :—

*a.* Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket. Elbow caps of leather or other material will not be allowed.

*b.* Trousers.

*c.* Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it. Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and greatcoats or waterproofs over uniforms.

Officers of a corps must all appear dressed in the same order as must also Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates. Where a duly authorized undress for Officers exist, they (the Officers) may appear in it, although the Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates may be in full dress. Waist or cross belts need not be worn.

*d.* In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia, competitors must appear either in uniform as above, or wholly in plain clothes. (See Reg. XX. *d.*)

NOTE.—In "Military Match" competitions the above rules shall not apply, as special details for dress will be issued.

IV.—All protests or objections should be made to the Executive or Range Officers on duty on the spot, and, when practicable in writing. When a protest is in the first place made verbally, it must subsequently be put in writing, and handed to the Secretary not later than one hour after the occurrence on which the protest is founded, and the Executive Committee reserve the right to refuse to accept any protest received or presented after the expiry of that time.

V.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

VI.—Hair triggers will not be allowed.

VII. Fixed or artificial rests will not be allowed, except in Skirmishing Match.

VIII.—Competitors shall only use the mats and sheets provided by the Association. Cork beds and elbow rests will not be allowed.

IX.—No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

X.—No competitor shall load until he takes his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word "All Clear."

XI.—Competitors may "blow off" in the pits at the firing points

only before firing, and after presentation of a "blow off" ticket to the Register Keeper.

XII.—Slings may be used in all matches, but when the competition is restricted to military breech-loaders, the slings must be of the Government length and pattern, white, brown or black, and attached to the rifles as in Government rifles.

XIII.—In individual competitions—competitors may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided their doing so causes no delay in the shooting.

XIV.—After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person, except the Register Keeper or an officer on duty, will be permitted to speak to him.

XV.—In *Matches* where *both team and individual prizes* are being offered for competition, coaching of any kind is strictly prohibited.

XVI.—In *Matches* where the prizes are offered to *teams only*, the members of each team shooting together will be permitted to "coach" or "spot" for each other, and to use binoculars or telescopes for that purpose, provided their doing so does not delay or impede the shooting. The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint a spotter to assist him. With the above exceptions, no other person will be allowed within the ropes.

XVII.—Any violation of these rules or any part of them must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the Officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Officer, that the case may be dealt with by the Special Committee as laid down under the head of "penalties," and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

#### PENALTIES—DISQUALIFICATIONS.

XVIII.—Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own ; or,
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the ompetition to do so ; or,
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target ; or,

(*d*) Who shall offer money or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever ; or,

(*e*) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council, Executive or Special Committee ; or,

(*f*) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Council, Executive or Special Committee may consider discreditable ; or,

(*g*) Who shall be reported to the Council, Executive or Special Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct of the aforesaid offences ; or,

(*h*) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangements with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize, shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council, Executive or Special Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any Affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association, until reinstated.

#### EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

##### XIX.—Any Competitor—

(*a*) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or,

(*b*) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or,

(*c*) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing ; or,

(*d*) Who from a proper want of care discharges his rifle accidentally. [If such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle, an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given] ; or,

(*e*) Who shall fire a pool shot before delivering his ticket to the Register Keeper ; or,

(*f*) Who shall alter or make any erasures on his firing ticket ; or,

(*g*) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous, shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.



## DISALLOWANCE OF SCORES.

## XX.—Any Competitor—

(a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize ; or, with the orders of the Executive or Range Officers ; or,

(b) Who shall infringe on any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize ; or,

(c) Who, when competing for the Grand Aggregate, shall fail to fill up the aggregate score ticket, or shall enter his scores incorrectly, or shall fail to deliver the same to the Statistical Officer within one hour after the conclusion of the firing in the last match ; or,

(d) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes. (See Règ. III, d), shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, have his scores for that particular prize disallowed, and if such disallowance refers to the Grand Aggregate, he shall also forfeit all claim to shoot in the Governor-General's Match.

## XXI.—FINES.

## Any Competitor—

Who in "blowing off" shall fail to go close up to and point his rifle into the pit provided for that purpose ; or, who shall "blow off" when the danger signal is up ; or, who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target, shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is "excluded from further competition," or where his "score is disallowed" for any particular prize, the *circumstances only* under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the NAME of the individual implicated.

In cases of "disqualification," the NAME of the offender as well as the particulars of the case shall be posted on the notice board.

## XXII.—MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

The Special Committee shall have power to mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

## XXIII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than *one* prize in any competition.

XXIV.—Winners of prizes will, on signing the official prize lists, receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the Association.

XXV.—If a formal presentation takes place, winners, being Active Militiamen, must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps.

## XXVI.—DISTANCES AND TARGETS.

## XXVII.—SIGNALLING.

The signalling will be as follows :—

f. *Misses* will *not* be signalled ; but if a target is lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the marker will wave a *black* disc to signify that the target has not been struck.

2. When *two* shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be signalled with the *signal disc*, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with that shot, provided he has fired. *Both hits will*, however, be shown by spotting discs.

3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, will be shown by the spotting disc when the target is again raised.

4. The signalling shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the Officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may not have struck the target, he may call on the Officer in charge at the butt to examine the target, *and the result of such examination shall be final*. Any Competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of *fifty* cents with the Officer in charge at the firing point, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

5. If on a target being raised the *spotting disc* appears manifestly to disagree with the *signal disc*, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstance to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.

6. All claims for shots signalled *must be made before* another shot is fired at the target in question.

7. If at the moment at which a competitor fires, his target should be lowered in such a manner as to falsify the result of his shot, the Range Officer is empowered to cancel the result of such shot, and to permit the competitor to fire another shot in its place.

8. All alterations of the registers must be initialled by the Officer making them, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first signalled to the butt.

9. No person will be permitted to go to examine a target during the meeting except the Executive Officer or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

*In Skirmishing.*

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of such shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the targets in excess of the number of shots allowed could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

XXVIII.—RIFLES.

The rifles shall be classed as follows :—

CLASS I.

MILITARY BREECH LOADERS.

Snider (Long and Short) rifles and Martini Henry rifles, either of Government issue, or of *bona fide* Government patterns, and bearing the Government viewer's mark.

1. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9lbs. 12oz.  
Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9lbs.
2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate will be allowed.
3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6lbs.
4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Filed sights will not be allowed.
  - (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but black and white must not be mixed so as to produce a grey.  
No application of a permanent nature will be allowed.  
No shading of sights will be permitted.
  - (b) The backsight may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at any angle by any extemporized means.

- (c) The sliding bar may be inverted, and used on either side of the uprights. *One* permanent centre line for the Snider, and *three* for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or line of any kind, removable at pleasure, may be used.

## CLASS II.

## ANY RIFLES.

1. *Weight*—Maximum, 10lbs.
2. *Pull of trigger*—Minimum, 3lbs.
3. A pad or shoe for the heel plate may be used.
4. Any description of sights, except telescopic and magnifying, may be used.

## XXIX.—AMMUNITION.

1.—*In Competitions Restricted to "Military Breech-loaders."*

- (a) None but the ammunition issued by the D. R. A. on the ground shall be used or allowed. Price for Snider, 17cts. per package of 10 rounds, or 3 packages for 50cts. Price for Martini, 25cts. per package of 10 rounds.

2.—*In Competitions open to "Any Rifles."*

Any ammunition may be used. Competitors will be required to bring their own supply.

No restrictions will be made as to the arrangement or composition of the charges or cartridges, provided that *in the case of Breech-loading Rifles being used*—

- (a) That no part of the charge is inserted at the muzzle.
- (b) That the rifle is not loaded until the word "all clear" is given.
- (c) That no time is lost, and
- (d) That no dangerous practice is resorted to.

## XXX.—POSITION.

Unless otherwise specified, the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position, with the head to the target.

In the Standing position the whole of the left hand must be in front of the trigger guard.

## XXXI.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

1. Competitors must be present at the firing points, punctually at the time detailed on their tickets, otherwise they will not be allowed to shoot ; the time to be regulated by the clock in the Secretary's office.

2. In all ordinary competitions competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately*.

3. Where but *one* competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay ; but the Officer in charge of the firing point, *or some person named by him*, must witness the shooting, and countersign the register. Failing such verification the score will be invalidated. Any person present whom the competitor may name will watch the score recorded, and if need be raise objection *before* the next shot is fired.

4. *In competitions restricted to "Any Rifles,"* the competitors shall be formed in a squad, and fire shot for shot in the order in which their names are called.

5. No one shall be allowed to join the squad after the commencement of the second competitive round.

6. When once a competitor has joined a squad, he shall not leave it before he has either retired from the competition or has completed his firing, but leave may be given by the Officer in charge to any competitor who, when firing with a muzzle loader, may find it necessary through a mistake in loading to fall out for the purpose of "blowing off."

7. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition with the same rifle ; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range during a competition, unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Officer in charge.

8. The competitor must, after delivering *each shot*, pay attention to the score called out by the Register Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the Register, so that any objection to the *score recorded* may be investigated before the next shot is fired.

9. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or of such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the shot forfeited and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.



## XXXII.—TIES.

Ties shall be decided as follows :—

A. *In Individual Competitions for a Series of Prizes.*

1. If at more than one distance by the range totals in inverse order, commencing at the longest range.
2. By the fewest *outers*.
3. By the fewest *magpies*.
4. By the fewest *inners*.
5. By the value of each shot in inverse order.
6. In the case of *absolute ties*.
  - (a) If for MONEY PRIZES, by division.
  - (b) If for PRIZES IN KIND, by shooting off as in Clause B.
7. In the case of a prize PART IN KIND AND PART IN MONEY, by shooting off for the Prize in Kind, and dividing the Money.

N. B.—In all competitions the order of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possible, but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketted.

B. *In Individual Competitions for a Single Prize.*

1. By the aggregate score in five rounds at the longest distance.
2. By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C. *In Team Competitions.*

1. If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.
2. By the fewest *outers*.
3. By the fewest *magpies*.
4. By the fewest *inners*.
5. By the highest scores in each team shooting off, as in Clause B.

D. *Grand Aggregate.*

Equal numerical scores for the first 5 places, and for the last place

or places, shall be decided by the result of firing 5 shots at 600 yards, after that if the score be still equal, by single shots until decided.

For other places :—

1. By the total score in each match in inverse order.
2. By the total scores at 600 yards.
3. By the total scores at 500 yards.
4. By the total scores at 400 yards.
5. By the total scores at 200 yards.
6. By shooting off as in Clause B.

In the Governor-General's Match, scores of equal numerical value shall be treated and placed by the before-stated Rule B.

E. *In cases not met by the foregoing :*

1. By any special rules attached to the conditions.
2. By the fiat of the Committee.

### XXXIII.—ENTRIES.

*The Executive and Special Committees reserve to themselves the power of refusing any entry for any match, or of cancelling at any moment any entry that may have been previously accepted.*

*The privilege of Entry is restricted to members, who have paid their subscription (\$2.00), and to associate members, who pay the fee of \$1.00 at the time of entry.*

1. Entries for the several competitions shall close on days to be named by the Committee.
2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of the competition.
3. No entry shall be accepted after the hour fixed for the commencement of the competition to which admission is sought.
4. Entries shall be classified :—
  - (a) Ordinary (at the published rates of entrance fees). To include those made and received by the Secretary of the D. R. A. on or before 4 p.m., Wednesday, 26th August.

(b) Post (at an increased charge of 20 per cent. on the published rate of entrance fees). To include those made or received after 4 p.m., Wednesday, 26th August.

N.B.—The acceptance of Post Entries will be entirely governed by circumstances. As a rule the privilege will be withdrawn as soon as the target accommodation allotted for each competition is absorbed, and whenever the Special Committee may determine.

5. To meet the case where difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required entries by the 26th August, Officers commanding corps and Secretaries Provincial or Local Associations will be permitted to send in their application for (state No.)

competitors accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees; and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries, until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such cases the Register Tickets will not be issued before the nominal return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for in the following regulations:—

#### XXXIV.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Entrance Fees in full will be returned to those—
  - (a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting; or,
  - (b) Who attend the meeting, but are incapacitated from illness or accident; or,
  - (c) Whose entries the Executive or Special Committee may have cancelled.
2. Claims based on other considerations than the above will, if allowed, be subject to a penalty of half forfeit

#### XXXV.—SQUADDING.

1. In the case of competitors classified as Ordinary Entries, arrangements will be made and detail published of the day, hour, and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.

In case of Post Entries, the hour of shooting cannot be pre-determined or announced, and competitors so classified must await the orders that the progress of the meeting may render practicable.

## XXXVI.—ALTERATION OF SQUADDING.

1. Any alterations which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration, unless verified by the initials of the Executive Officer, will cancel the ticket.

2. The place for publication for all notices affecting the detail of shooting, shall be the board fixed without the tent of the Executive Officer, and the posting of a notice on such board must be taken and accepted as a good service on all affected thereby.

## XXXVII.—REGISTER TICKETS.

1. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association in regard to such competition, *and no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.*

2. Any *erasure or substitution* of one name for another unless made by the Executive Officer, shall invalidate the ticket.

## XXXVIII.—FOULING TICKETS.

Tickets for fouling shots, 2 cents, can be obtained at the Secretary's office. They must be delivered to the Register Keeper before a shot is fired. Such tickets will hold good in any match during the meeting.

*The Council reserves the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing regulations as circumstances may require.*

# CONSTITUTION.

---

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

---

1. That this Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year; and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association, for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting at the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the

name of the winner and details of the match at which it is won shall be communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such Prize Meeting.

5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7.—There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council composed of Fifty members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:—

one-half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Association of the respective Provinces at their annual meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Association to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form the quorum.

9.—The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10.—The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.



11.—The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with this Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12.—There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13.—The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14.—The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15.—The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16.—The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17.—An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the Assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or an adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all Members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

# GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

Meetings of  
Council.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary  
Meetings.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each Member of the Council, at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council to  
keep minutes of  
all proceedings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to inspection of any Member of the Council.

Finance Com-  
mittee.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three Members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

Treasurer to de-  
posit sums re-  
ceived in Savings  
Banks.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered Bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of  
sums for current  
expenses.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or

in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditures of a general nature. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual Accounts. A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November.
