LONDON, July 13.—It is now settled that
the Liberal and Irish supporters of Mr.
Gladstone will have a small majority in the
coming Parliament.

The result of the contests for 534 seats is
known to-night. The Conservatives and
Liberal-Unionists have elected 268; the
Gladstonians, including the Irish, 266.

Liberalism has gained 25 seats to day and
the Conservatives 11. The result in
Midlothian overhauled everything.

Of the 138 seats still to be filled, the
Conservatives held 52, the Liberal-Unionists
15, the Gladstonians 48 and the Irish
Nationalists 31.

The Morning Post thinks Mr. Gladstone
is now certain of 40 majority and perhaps
more.

The Chronicle expects a Liberal majority
of 50.

THE RESULT IN MIDLOTHIAN.

LONDON, July 13.—Considerable depres-
sion has been caused in the Liberal camp
by the announcement of the result of yester-
day's election in Midlothian, Mr. Gladstone's
majority being reduced to 11.

Midlothian number 13,236, and 11,000 of
them cast ballots. Mr. Gladstone's actual
majority is 674, reduced to 11.

Conservative and Liberal-Unionist are
in high glee over the result. They say if any-
where in Great Britain a campaign of elec-
tion has been carried on as has been in
Midlothian, there Gladstone in his num-
erous addresses has explained as fully as he
can explain why the result is what it is.
