















LASCELLES' AUTOBIOGRAPHY.

CAN PLANTS SEE!

Else Why Do They Turn Their Tendrils in the Right Direction.

A correspondent asks whether plants can see or not, and suggests that as plants will turn their tendrils in the direction of something to cling to, that direction of something to cling to, that may indicate that plants can possibly see. It is certainly a fact that the proximity of something to eling to will make parts of plants turn in that direc-tion. There is evidently some attrac-tion, but as for seeing as we generally understand by sight, this is, of course, entirely out of the question. A very pretty experiment may be made by placing stakes in among a mass of garlic. The leaves will in many cases be found twisting around the stakes, occasionally clinging tightly to them, but, as gener-ally seen, the garlic would be the last thing we would think of as having a twining habit; and yet we see by this that when there is a chance to twine that when there is a chance to twine they evidently know that the chance is there. It is not sight, but it is some re-markably attractive power. What the nature of that power is has not been determined.—Meehan's Monthly.


