

CAPITOL NEWS FROM ST. PETERSBURG... WITTE'S FAITH WEAKENING

Premier is Losing Ground in His Attempts to Carry Out Emperor's Promises; Dictatorship Looms Large Again—Strike Breaking...

Shadow of a Dictator... London, Dec. 6.—The Telegraph's St. Petersburg correspondent writes: "The spectre of a military dictatorship, which has been looming on the horizon, is slowly gaining consistency and sharpness of outline."

Station Growing Worse... Berlin, Dec. 6.—The Tagesspiegel's St. Petersburg correspondent writes: "The situation is visibly growing worse. The critical moment is approaching."

Zemstvo Delegates Warning... London, Dec. 6.—The delegation sent by the Zemstvo Congress to consult with Count Witte to-day presented a communication to the premier, in which they pointed out that they were not asking for themselves, but for the great mass of the country when they demanded universal suffrage.

Reactionary Influence on the Country... The reactionary influence on the country, which the members of the zemstvo said they found to be strongly entrenched in St. Petersburg and Tver, is a fact that universal suffrage would be contrary to their interests, but that only thereby could the country be saved from anarchy and ruin.

A Bitter Attack... The so-called landowners' congress at Moscow, which was composed of representatives of a number of reactionary organizations like the Banner, the Holy Alliance and the Russian Patriots, seemed to have the cue to attack Premier Witte. Detailed mail reports from the Holy Alliance congress bitterly assailed the premier, who the speakers said was leading Russia to perdition, and pronounced for the emperor and the antiquated Zemstvo Sobor (old Russian land parliament).

Official Note... An official note was issued to-day explaining that, while the government was determined to carry out the reforms promised by the imperial manifesto of October 30, until the reforms are effected the old law must be enforced, except where they are already replaced by temporary provisions.

HOME RULE OR NOTHING... MODERATES HOWLED DOWN

Irish Nationalists in Convention Con- gratulated by Redmond on the Downfall of the Balfour Government.

O'Brien and Healy, by Resolution, Are Outvoted Until They Abandon Liberal Leaguings and Line Up With Redmond.

Dublin, Dec. 6.—The Irish National convention was opened at the Mansion House to-day under the presidency of John Redmond. There was a good gathering of members of parliament and delegates from all parts of the country.

The lord mayor of Dublin moved a home rule resolution, commending the present system of governing Ireland and continuing: "We solemnly assert, that no new system of government in Ireland will be accepted as satisfactory except a legislative assembly, freely elected and representative of the people, with power to make laws for Ireland, and an executive government responsible to that assembly, and this convention declares that the Irish National party can enter into an alliance with or without the assistance of any other party or government which does not make the question of granting such an assembly and executive to Ireland the cardinal point of its program."

The resolution was carried by a large majority. The resolutions were passed denouncing the government of Ireland, outlawing the O'Brien and Healy party, and they signed the party pledge, expressing their absolute support to John Redmond, as leader of the Irish parliamentary party.
