CANADA WILL NOT BE COERCED.

Refusal to Trade With Us on a Mutually Fair Basis Will Not Promote Annexation.

Buffalo, Dec. 20.—The morning edition of the Buffalo Courier, commenting editorially on the Washington Anglo-American Commission, says:

"The probable failure of the new efforts to improve the commercial relations between the United States and Canada by an agreement on the basis of reciprocity must be greatly regretted. The entire cordiality with America, which is one of the good results of the late war, will not be perfect until a satisfactory arrangement between this country and the greatest English dependency in America shall have been concluded."

It is difficult to understand why any disinterested advocate of tariff protection should object to reciprocity with Canada. That country has no industries which are in danger of being ruined by our own industries under protection. But there is, among other things, great and urgent need of the protection of American forests from ruinous devastation, and for this reason the importation of Canadian lumber ought during the first seven months of this year 57,132 tons, as compared with 335,867 tons and 224,880 in 1897 and 1898 respectively.

RUBIES AND SAPPHIRES.

Mr. Roy Thinks There Should be Lots in Hastings County.
The following paper relative to Ontario's corundum deposits was written for The World by Mr. Alex Roy of Toronto:
"Ruby is a perfect crystal of corundum of a pigeon-blood or red color. A sapphire is also a perfect crystal of corundum, of blue color. The great Mandalay ruby mines of India are simply nothing more or less than corundum mines, the color of whose crystals is red. The sapphire mines of Burma and Ceylon are simply corundum mines of a deep blue color. The great corundum belt of Ontario includes both the red and blue varieties, and it is simply a matter of proper working to obtain the high-grade crystal.
The method adopted by the natives of India to obtain the crystals is as follows: The deposits are the wash of the sand and gravel rocks, which are gradually being worn away by the action of time and weather and deposited in the form of sand or gravel in the intervening valleys and streams. The corundum crystals are being picked up by the accompanying sand and more difficult to break up, retain their crystalline form, while the remaining rocks are decomposed. This gravel is first washed by a stream of water, similar to gold panning, which carries away the light clay in the overflow and leaves the crystals of corundum behind. Intermittent sand and gravel of coarse grade. The crystals are then hand-picked over to free them from accompanying refuse, and they are then packed in all likely looking crystals are separated from the inferior ones.
