Hamilton, March 3--The members of the Health Board, who held their regular monthly meeting this evening, were given information that usually characterizes the considerations of that useful body. They indulged in a discussion on the subject of a spring cleaning, and during the course of it Dr. Langrill informed them that, strange as it might appear, there had been no systematic cleaning up of the city in the gentle springtime since 1893. CORPORATION COUNSEL THINKS TELEPHONE BILL HURTS CITY Claims That the Proposed Legislation Would Knock Out Toronto's Pending Suit Against the Bell Telephone Co.-- He Suggests Some Changes.

Corporation Counsel Fullerton has found some objections, which he considers serious, in regard to the proposed telephone legislation now before the Dominion parliament. When Ald. Urquhart urged last week that the City Council endorse the bill introduced by Mr. Maclean the Mayor was particularly active in securing a delay, although the City Legislation Committee had unanimously endorsed the measure and nearly all the aldermen seemed favorable to the terms of the legislation proposed. His Worship consulted with Mr. Fullerton, who has looked over the bill, and has also read the terms of the government bill to be introduced to-morrow by Hon. Mr. Fitzpatrick.

FIRE CAUSED \$15,000 DAMAGE.

Union Loan Building Will Be Re-modelled.

The Toronto Mortgage Corporation, owners of the Union Loan building, 28-30 Toronto-street, which was damaged by the fire yesterday morning, place their loss at \$10,000. The insurance carried by the company was \$25,000, and is made up of \$10,000 in the Actina and \$10,000 in the Scottish Union Company.

An examination of the basement yesterday showed that the fire probably started in a barrel of waste, which stood at the foot of the elevator shaft. Nine months ago the steam-pipes caused a small fire in the same building. It is the intention of the Corporation to remodel the interior of the structure at a cost of \$20,000 to \$25,000.

Of the tenants, Burke & Harwood, architects, suffered most. Their loss is placed at \$200,000, against which there is some insurance. The office of Burke & Co., brokers, on the ground floor, were very slightly damaged, and the loss being covered by insurance. Water soaked into the office of Jahn Stark & Co., brokers, also on the ground floor, and the damage caused thereby is put at \$100, with no insurance. The shirt manufacturing firm of Wilton & Leyden suffered to the extent of \$300, covered by insurance.

The law firm of MacLaren, Macdonald, Merritt & Shipley carried insurance of \$100, in the Union Company, which amount more than covers their loss. The damage in the office of C. G. Baines, broker, and G. Bruenich, artist, was slight.

Inland Revenue and Customs.
The receipts of the Inland Revenue Office for February were \$34,978.32, against \$32,211.22 for the corresponding month of the previous year, showing a decrease of \$2,767.10.

For February the receipts of the Toronto Custom House amounted to \$241,023.41, compared with \$480,243.35 for the same month of last year, an increase of \$239,219.94. The increase is attributed to the large importations of dry goods and millinery, which have been exceptionally heavy during the past month.

Several important changes have been made in the agreements between the government and the Blanche River Pulp and Paper Company, the Nepona Pulp and Paper and Manufacturing Company, and the Sturgeon Falls Pulp Company.

A fight in which Toronto is interested is imminent, and it will be over a bill by Dr. McKay (South Oxford) to amend the Electric Railway Act.

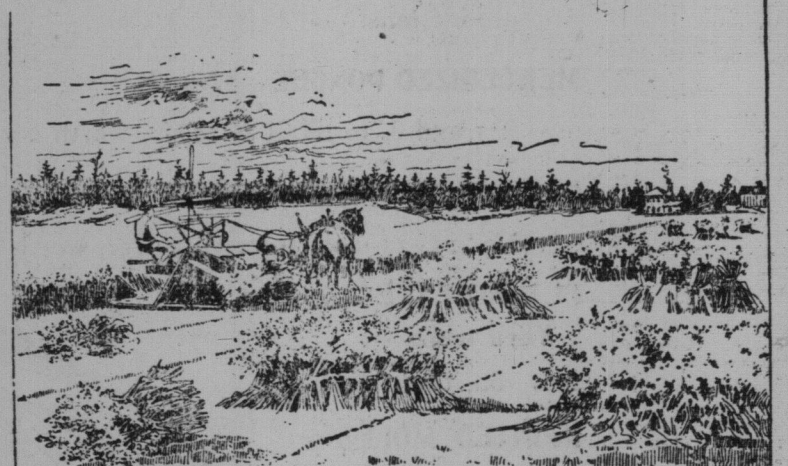

Homes For Thousands—Interesting Exhibit at Rossin House This Week of Fine Grains and Grasses—Distribution of Literature—Everybody Welcome—Concert at Pavilion.

The New Ontario Exhibition at the Rossin House is now open. In addition to the educational equipment of maps, showing the situation of this greater portion of the province, known as New Ontario, hung about the walls of the Rossin House, are two agricultural exhibits. On entering from King-street, and approaching the office, tastefully arranged along the west wall of the corridor is a collection of photographs of farm scenes. Two large maps show graphically the information as to soil, forests, rivers and lakes of the region, and the altitude of the country for a thousand miles from the Ottawa River westward thru the great "empire,"

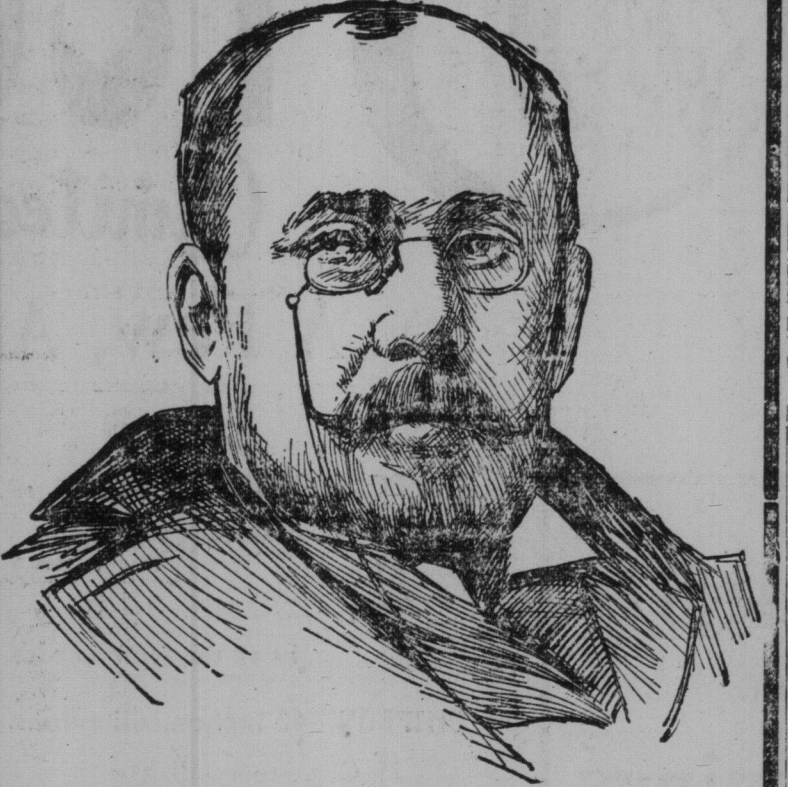
Off for England.

AMERICANS DEFEATED.

Insurgents Drive Back the Constabulary at Morong.

Manila, March 3.—Twenty-five members of the constabulary of Morong, 10 miles from Manila, encountered 50 well armed insurgents to-day. The former, after expending all their ammunition, fled. Eleven of the constabulary are unaccounted for, and it is believed they were killed or captured. The same band of insurgents turned back a commissary wagon, but did not molest the escort, consisting of three men.

REWARD NEVER CLAIMED.

New York, March 3.—Charles Broadway Ross died here to-day. Mr. Ross had suffered from heart disease and dropsy, and on Saturday night his condition became so much worse that his recovery was not expected. He was born at Woodboro, Md., in 1836, served in the Confederate army, and then came to New York in 1865. He had been in business here continuously from that time. He erected at his own expense a monument to dead Confederate soldiers in Mount Hope Cemetery, this city, founded a physical laboratory at the University of Virginia, and gave \$100,000 for a Confederate monument, to be located at Richmond, Va. Some years ago Mr. Ross became blind. He offered \$1,000,000 to anyone who could restore his sight, but the reward was never successfully claimed.

LETTER REACHED DISTANTION.

One of the many justices of the peace in York County, in making a return of a conviction by him recently made sure that the letter would reach its destination by addressing it in this novel way: "The Clerk of the Peace, County of York, New Court House, 100 Queen-street, formerly Lot-street, Toronto." The letter arrived at the office of the Clerk of the Peace yesterday.
