TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

The Council in again presenting an annual report have, first of all, to note the interesting fact that the Association is now completing the twenty-first year of its existence. The inaugural competitions were held in 1867, and in each succeeding year the annual matches have taken place and have played an important part in the encouragement of rifle shooting among our Volunteers. It is not saying too much to state that the Association is now more than ever an important, if not a necessary, organization in connection with the Militia system of the Province.

The Council are hopeful that the following report will be received with satisfaction, as in all respects it chronicles a successful year.

The Prize List, as well as the conditions and regulations for the shooting, underwent no change from those of last year as the Council believed them to meet the approval of the members. The matches were held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, the 23rd, 24th and 25th of August, and were carried through easily and pleasantly in those three days. A slight increase in the attendance was noticeable. At the general meeting of competitors held on the afternoon of the second day several suggestions were passed which will be submitted to the consideration of the annual meeting.

The receipts for the year, including the balance on hand from 1886 and the usual Government grants, amounted to \$2,552.74, and the expenditure to \$2,321.11, leaving a clear balance of \$231.63. The expenditure includes an item of \$102.20 for twenty P. R. A. medals, which number has enabled the Association to discharge all present indebtedness to the County Associations. The Treasurer's statement, with the Audit Committee's report thereon, is herewith submitted.

In accordance with the suggestion, mutually accepted by the three Associations, the Maritime Match was shot at Charlottetown, and, happily, a team from each Association participated. The first place

was somewhat easily secured by Nova Scotia with a total of 654 points; P. E. Island being second with 597 points, and our own team third with 571 points. The visiting riflemen received very much kindness and attention from the members of the P. E. Island Association, which the Council gratefully acknowledges on behalf of the N. B. eight. The competition now satisfactorily established, will be shot in regular rotation at Halifax, St. John and Charlottetown, and the Council trust that the match will prove an effective means of encouraging Martini practice among all prominent riflemen in the Province. The following plan has been adopted by the Council for the selection of the team, viz: Three men to be chosen from the Sussex grand aggregate of the year previous, three from the Wimbledon aggregate at Ottawa, of the year previous, and the remaining two to be named by the Executive Committee.

The Council have also to record the fact that a contingent of 30 from this Province took part in the Dominion Rifle Association Matches and had a very fair share of success. The excellent positions which Lt. E. A. Smith secured in the Grand and Wimbledon Aggregates may well be a source of gratification to the Association, and in a scarcely less degree the steady success of Sergt. W. H. Adams, so unusual in the case of a competitor engaging in the Dominion Rifle Association Matches for the first time.

The Council further desire to mention that a New Brunswicker on this year's Wimbledon Team, Sergt. Walter Langstroth, shot admirably in the three stages of the Queens and finished seventh in the whole shooting, this being the highest position yet reached by a Canadian.

OTTAWA TEAM REPORT.

ST. JOHN, N. B., Sept. 15th, 1887.

SIR,—I have to report for the information of the Council, that as Captain of the Ottawa Team, I made all necessary team and individual entries in the Dominion Rifle Association competitions and paid the amount of the fees out of the Provincial allowance of \$300, dividing the balance among the twenty men entitled thereto. Besides the twenty, ten other New Brunswickers were in attendance, and our total representation was thus greater than in any former year, owing probably to the fact that we proceeded to Ottawa immediately on the conclusion of the Sussex Matches.

I have also to report a fair success on the part of nearly all the members and some few of the best individual positions as well. The first place in the Dominion Match was taken by Staff Sergt. Winter, and the second in the Manufacturers' by Pte. C. T. Burns. Eight got places in the Grand Aggregate and were consequently members of the Governor-General's Sixty. Four of these are sure to be members of the Wimbledon Twenty. Our chief cause for congratulation was the fact of Lieut. E. A. Smith and Sergeant Adams securing first and second prizes in the Grand Aggregate; the two most honorable positions open to individual competitors, and New Brunswick riflemen will notice, I am sure, with great satisfaction, that Lieut. Smith is the first for selection as a member of next year's Wimbledon Team.

I beg to state that I complied with the instructions given me by the Executive Committee of the Council as to the selection of the New Brunswick eight for the London Merchants' Cup Match. Having consulted with Lieut. Smith, we chose Sergt. G. Langstroth, Sergt. W. Langstroth, Capt. McRobbie, Lieut. W. Langstroth, Sergt. Loggie and Corp. Beatty, to complete the team. The competition was a very close one until the 600 yard range was reached, but an exceedingly dark light made the sighting there very uncertain. The teams finished in the following order: Ontario, 638; Nova Scotia, 628; Quebec, 619; New Brunswick, 619.

Such an important competition should no longer be shot as it has been in past years. It has been neither a team match nor yet properly

an individual one. Either the members of the several teams should be paired against one another or else each team should be squadded to but two targets, and the members enabled to coach one another.

The team are indebted to Lieut.-Col. Bacon, the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, for promptly submitting our names to the Railway Department and for applying on our behalf for return passes, which were punctually issued.

The return of all prizes won is submitted.

THE MARITIME MATCH.

CONDITIONS.

1. The match will be an annual one between teams of eight (8) representatives of the Rifle Associations of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island. Teams shall be composed solely of *bona fide* members of the Active Militia.
2. Ranges—200, 500 and 600 yards; 7 shots at each range, and two (2) sighting shots, at the option of each competitor.
3. Rifle—Martini Henry.
4. The position at the different ranges shall be respectively that required in the first stage of the Queen's.
5. Targets and scoring—those of Wimbledon for the year.
6. The members of the teams shall shoot in the full or undress uniform of their corps.
7. Coaching and spotting shall be allowed.
8. Blow off shots shall be allowed.
9. Teams will provide their own ammunition.
10. The competition shall be shot on the second Thursday in June in each year.
11. The match shall be shot in annual rotation at Charlottetown, Halifax and St. John.
12. Each team shall be under the control of a Captain appointed by its Association, and the competition shall be under the joint conduct of the three Captains. Each team may also have the services of an adjutant to assist in coaching. The Captain may or may not be a member of his team.
13. Each association shall contribute an annual entrance fee of — dollars, out of which the necessary range expenses of the competition shall be defrayed and arm badges provided for the members of the winning team.
14. A handsome challenge prize shall be obtained through the joint efforts of the three Associations, and shall be held for the year by the President of the winning Association.
