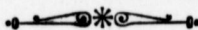

THIRTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT,

1st. In laying before the Congregation the Annual Report for 1884, the Board of Managers desire to express their gratitude to God for the encouraging measure of prosperity that has attended their efforts in carrying on the work entrusted to their care.

2nd. We deeply sympathise with our esteemed pastor and Mrs. Murray in their recent affliction, and trust they will be soon fully restored to health and strength.

3rd. We regret to have to report that owing to illness our late Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. Alexander Davidson, tendered his resignation in February last, which the Board reluctantly had to accept, being unable to prevail upon him to continue longer in the position. Mr. Alexander McIntosh was unanimously appointed his successor

4th. A list of subscribers to the Fund for the liquidation of the Church debt is submitted herewith, showing the amounts subscribed and the amounts paid to the 16th inst. In consequence of some of the subscribers having left the City and others having become unable to pay the amount which we had expected to receive for this purpose, will fall considerably short of paying the debt, we therefore trust that many of the congregation who have not yet done so, will now subscribe towards the fund, so that the Board may be able to wipe off the

whole debt before the next Annual Meeting, towards which so good a beginning has been made.

5th. The Board wish to make special reference to the liberal legacy of \$2,000.00 left to the Trustees of the Church by the late John Stewart Esq. who has been upwards of twenty five years connected with the congregation, of this sum \$500- has been applied towards the church debt, \$500 for two new chandeliers to be called the "Stewart Memorial," and the balance deposited in the bank.

6th. The church mortgage was reduced in July last to \$4,000, since then a sum of \$1,500 has been paid on account of subscriptions, which together with the above \$500, will reduce the mortgage to \$2,000.

7th. The Board have found it necessary to put two new furnaces in the Church and to refit the other (partly from the old furnaces) at a total cost of \$223.98 and desire to express the deep obligations they feel themselves under to the 'Ladies' Aid Society who came to their assistance in the hearty manner which has always characterized them, providing \$200 of the amount.

8th. The Board of Managers on behalf of the congregation, desire to thank the members of the Choir for their regular attendance, and valuable services.

9th. The Treasurer's books have been examined with vouchers, by Messrs. Thomas Muir and T. H. Purdom, the duly appointed Auditors, and found correct, a full account of the receipts and payments will be found in the annexed statement.

The members of the Board whose term of office now expire are, Messrs D. McDonald, D. A. Denham, D. Fraser A. D. Cameron, Alex. Tytler and James Gillean all of whom are eligible for re-election.

# REPORT OF THE BOARD <sup>OF</sup> TRUSTEES

—OF—

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, LONDON, ONTARIO.

---

The Board of Trustees for St. Andrew's Church Property beg leave to report :—

1st. That the late Mr. John Stewart of this City, who died on the 23rd September, 1884, and who had been connected with St. Andrew's Church for over twenty-five years, bequeathed to the Trustees a Legacy of Two Thousand Dollars for the use of the congregation.

2nd. That on the recommendation of the Board of Managers, the Trustees agreed to pay Five Hundred Dollars into the Fund for the liquidation of St. Andrew's Church debt, and Five Hundred Dollars for the purpose of purchasing two chandeliers for the Church, to be called the "Stewart Memorial."

3rd. In the meantime they have deposited the balance, One Thousand Dollars in the Huron & Erie Savings Bank, until the Trustees decide for what object or purpose, for the use of the congregation the money shall be applied.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Since the beginning of July there seemingly has been a permanent reduction in the attendance; this is partly accounted for by the opening of the London South Church, but there is undoubtedly a lack of interest on the part of parents both in respect to the regular attendance of their children at the school, and the preparation of their lessons at home. It is with regret that we learn of several families, regular in attendance upon

church services, who send their children or permit them to go to other schools.

Our Teachers are faithful and earnest, there is good discipline, the school room is attractive, our library is well maintained and largely used the general exercises are conducted with a view to afford pleasant worship and sound instruction. and through the Band of Hope meetings and Anniversaries the members are afforded as much entertainment as is usually given by other schools. What is the reason of the apparent falling off? Will not parents kindly talk over this matter at home, and confer with the Teachers, Superintendent, or Pastor, should anything have gone wrong?

#### QUARTERLY REVIEWS.

At the quarterly reviews the Pastor's Bible Class has united with the school as was done last year. The Pastor was present at the March, September and December reviews, adding much to the pleasure and profit of the meetings.

#### RE-UNIONS.

The Annual Re-union, held on Friday 25th January, was largely attended. The school room was beautifully decorated with wreaths and evergreens, and each scholar presented with a gift,—chiefly suitable books, aggregating in value, \$107.55. The Summer Picnic was held at Port Stanley, on 30th July,—the members of the school being given tickets at half price.

#### THE LIBRARY.

The Library is very much used and appreciated. Although now containing 572 excellent books, it should be freshened up this coming year, and I trust there will be funds available for that purpose. Mr. John McLintoch and Master Willie Muir, have given great satisfaction in this department.

Miss Maddocks, as organist, and Mr. Wm. Murray as secretary have also rendered faithful services.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL PAPERS.

The "Canadian Band of Hope,"—a most excellent paper, published by Mr. Maddocks, has been furnished to the infant

class and the younger scholars; and the "Sunday School Times," has been provided for the teachers—same as last year. Their continuance is recommended.

**BAND OF HOPE.**

The Band of Hope has been re-organized for the season, under the immediate direction of Mr. C. R. Somerville, with an efficient staff, and will afford pleasant entertainment for the young people.

**CONTRIBUTIONS.**

Five Dollars, (\$5.00), were voted and paid the Women's Christian Temperance Union for the Boys' Home. Besides this the sum of \$140.96, has been contributed by the School for Missions, etc., and the following apportionment is recommended :—Foreign Missions, \$30. Home Missions, \$45. French Evangelization, \$25. Point Aux Tremble, \$35. Well- and Canal Mission, \$5.

I take this opportunity to thank the Teachers and other office bearers for their faithful attendance and services during the year.—"ONE MORE YEAR'S WORK FOR JESUS"—Let there be with the New Year, a new engagedness in Sunday School work, a new diligence in study, new patience with our scholars, new sacrifices of time and money, and a new laying of ourselves at Christ's feet.

REPORT OF  
THE LADIES' AID SOCIETY

OF ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH,

At the request of the Board of Managers, the Ladies' Aid Society was reorganized on the 22nd July, after an adjournment of over a year. Twenty-two members were enrolled. The officers were elected for six months, and now at the expiration of their term of office are called upon to give an account of their stewardship.

The immediate object of the Society for the past term has been to assist the Managers in raising funds for putting new furnaces in the Church, and although this aim has been prominently kept in view, the poor of the congregation have not been neglected, and their wants have been relieved as far as possible.

The plan of collecting ten cents monthly from the young people of the congregation who are willing to contribute has been adopted, and although some difficulties have to be overcome, yet we trust when once established it will prove a permanent source of revenue to the Society. \$44.00 has been collected in this way.

Two most enjoyable garden parties were given on the grounds of the church and manse, by which about \$175.00 was realized. The total amount raised was \$327 99. \$200.00 of this sum was handed to the Managers, and \$33.20 was applied to the relief of the poor. In some cases money has been given, and others have been assisted by groceries and
