Coal steamer Astoria, Captain Young, arrived yesterday from Parrsboro, N. S., with a cargo of 1,450 tons of coal for the C. P. B.

Manifests for seven cars of United States hops, etc., were received at the Custom House yesterday. Up to date 226 cars of U. S. products have been manifested in St. John for shipment to the U. K.

Furline steamer Kanawha, now at Halifax, is taking on board 300 barrels of apples for the London market.

The Donaldson line Athena, which arrived at Halifax from St. John, on Sunday night, sailed from that port yesterday for Glasgow. The Athena took away a large quantity of general cargo from Halifax, including 17,500 barrels of apples, 100 standards of deal and 100 tons of hay.

The steamship Manchester Trader, which arrived from Manchester last Monday night, is landing a very heavy general cargo at No. 4 berth, West Side. Among the freight is 237 packages of earthenware, also 90 packages of dry goods for M. R. A. Hugh S. Gregory & Sons, are the stevedores.
