Canadian Seed Growers Association Offer Special Inducements to Children Exhibiting

at Winter Fair.

Ottawa, Aug. 8.—Official notice is given by the Canadian Seed Growers' Association that substantial prizes in the form of cash and special trophies, are offered for seed growin in the digerent provinces and exhibited at the next annual Winter Fair or Provincial Seed Exhibition. In addition to the regular prizes offered to members of the association, special cash prizes are offered to boys and girls between 12 and 18 years of age, for exhibits of Spring Wheat and White Oats. A sweepstakes prize in the form of a gold medal donated by Dr. Jas. W. Robertson, is also offered to the boy or girl having the best exhibit of oats in the Maritime Provinces, Quebec and Ontario, and wheat in each of the Provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta. Each of these exhibits is to consist of a sheat which must be at least six inches in diameter at the band, and a gallon of threshed grain. 




