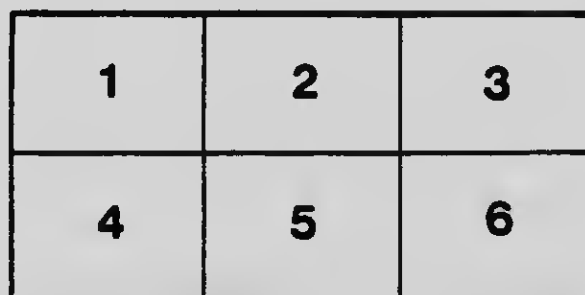

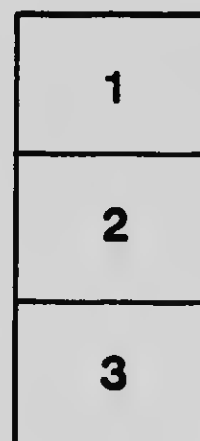

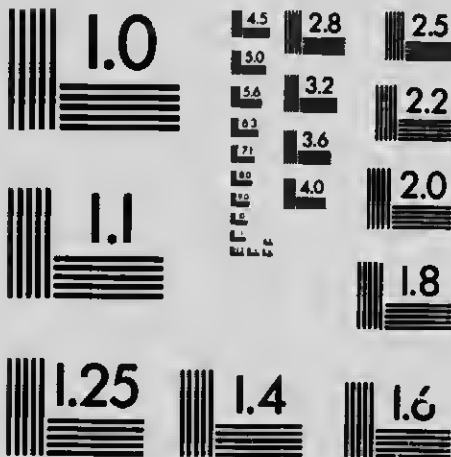

ADVICE
