The impression prevails that the cliques will make some concerted movement within a few days to lift the entire market out of the rut, and by advancing prices briskly, particularly in the case of a few specialties, will thus make a bid for increased outside business, Mr. S. V. White from Washington, says: "Each day proves more conclusively that there are no long stocks pressing, and the market shows clearly enough that it wants to go up." The professional traders, scalpers and bears alike have discovered that there is very little money for them on the short side. Now, if they were sensible they would buy stocks and would then have the satisfaction of making money. I cannot help thinking that we are going to have quite a bull speculation, and when it does come along is will be all the more pronounced on account of the many obstacles recently thrown in its way.




