The Sun's Declination and Examples of Time are given for Noon; the Moon's Declination for Midnight—Moon Time at Greenwich.

PHASES OF THE MOON.—The $\frac{1}{2}$ is inserted after the Phase, at the top of the left hand page of each month, when the Moon changes BELOW the horizon.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE DAY.—Add 12 hours to the time of the Sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT.—Subtract the time of Sun's setting from 12 hours, and to the remainder add the time of rising next morning.

WEATHER GUIDE.

The following Table (the result of many years' actual observation) is ascribed to Dr. Herschel. It is constructed upon a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon in their several positions respecting the Earth, and serves to show what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of her quarters:—

in every case. Now is a good time to scheme your work for the coming season; make up your orders for artificial manures and implements and seeds, and generally forestall the opening of spring so as to be ready for it. We must still wait a few months for field work, wait patiently but not idly. Push on the fattening of cattle, feed off waste grain and roots that are likely to spoil in the cellar. Pick over all roots and vegetables, and give air to prevent moulding, which is apt to occur from the moisture and high temperature which cannot be got rid of entirely till the severe freezing weather comes on.

FEBRUARY.—February is the trying month for cattle, and most of the animals that pine and die in the spring months have really been sacrificed long before. Feed well at this season, not overmuch, but judiciously. Calves and young stock will not thrive on dry hay alone; they require the hay to be cut and mixed with

meal, crushed grain, or mill stuff of some sort. All animals at this season should have roots, especially young stock. If fed entirely on dry feed their first stomach will be so distended that they will lose all shape, and never afterwards be presentable in the exhibition ring. More serious results than this follow, for when spring time comes the animals will be sure to scour, get thin, and possibly die. Ignorant farmers wonder why so many animals die. Intelligent farmers are as apt to wonder why so many live. Let us enquire briefly into the rationale of feeding. All the food of animals consists of several bodies having distinct properties, and it is to the relative proportions of these that different food materials owe their differences in feeding value. Hay, besides woody matter which is nearly useless, contains starch, sugar, gum, oil; these are non-nitrogenous; and maintain the warmth of the body and produce fat. It also contains albuminous bodies, which are nitrogenous; these repair waste and afford material for the growth of the flesh.

Hay, grain, straw, roots, vegetables, all contain these fat-formers and flesh-formers: if we wish to produce fat on an animal we feed indian corn or some other food rich in fat-formers; if the object is to produce flesh, on the other hand, we feed oats or wheat rich in flesh-formers. For milk, the best of all food is green grass, or in winter time, hay, well made from young grass, supplemented by succulent roots such as mangels.

MARCH.—It is too early to commence field operations beyond the carting out of manure and preparing and placing stuff for fencing, but a good deal of work may now be done in the garden. This is hot-bed month, and how to make a hot-bed is a secret worth knowing. Select a sheltered spot, protected from animals, lying to

the sun, and not far from a well or water butt. Build on this space a neat pile of manure, of such a size that when the frame is put on top, there will be a clear foot of manure outside all around. Cow manure will not heat at this season. Horse dung will not heat at this season, unless the animal has been fed upon oats or some kind of grain. Keeping these facts in view you can select your manure, or make such a mixture as will give the degree of heat required. Spread over the manure, inside the frame, about four or five inches of very fine soil; this should have been prepared in the fall, and kept dry under cover all winter,—otherwise it is likely now to be a hard frozen mass. The glass sashes are then to be put on and kept close till the hot bed heats; the steam and heat will start the seeds of weeds, which may be allowed to grow. Air is then given, and when the heat modifies,

weed and rake the surface and sow your spring seeds,—cauliflowers, cabbages, celery, tomatoes, &c., for the kitchen garden; and stocks, verbenas, petunias, asters, balsams, and such like annuals, for flower-garden ornament. The seeds will bear a good deal of heat before they emerge from the soil, but as soon as the first leaves begin to appear the frame must be aired daily, taking care to avoid cold draughts.

APRIL.—This is the month when the cultivation of the soil actually begins; the operations of ploughing, harrowing, rolling, planting, cultivating, have now to be attended to as the season advances and as the weather may permit. The theory of cultivation of the soil may well claim more than a passing reflection from the intelligent farmer. All soils consist of a mixture of clay and sand, the clay holds

water, the sand allows it to filter through. When the clay is in excess we have a clayey soil, when sand is in excess we have a sandy soil, and when both are equal we have a Loam, which is best of all for general purposes. There are other substances, which form but a very small proportion of the soil, but are essential for its fertility. The principal ones are (1) phosphoric acid, (2) potash, and (3) ammonia. These are removed in greater or less quantity by every crop, and, when they are taken out, the soil, whether clayey, sandy, or loamy becomes barren. To keep up fertility they must be restored. In stable manure we restore all three to the soil. The first may be restored in the form of bone dust or superphosphate of lime; these are special manures for turnips and grains, which take up a large quantity of phosphoric acid. The second ingredient of the soil, potash, often exists in an insoluble form, and is set free by processes of cultivation,

liming, and exposure to the action of the atmosphere; It may be added in the form of plant ashes or kault, a potash-soda mineral imported from Germany. The third substance, Ammonia, is abstracted from the rain water by the soil, and may be added in form of tannery waste, guano, gas water, blood, wool, hair and feathers. By keeping these facts in view the farmer will be better able to judge what kinds of manure to employ on his fields for the various crops. Potatoes especially require large quantities of potash for the tuber, and lime for the tops, all green crops require ammonia, and all grains phosphoric acid, which exists as a phosphate of magnesia, &c., in barley and wheat.

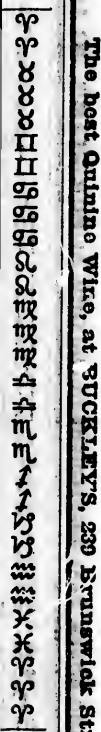

pical Plants for growing as single specimens or in groups (suitable for large gardens and ornamental grounds). Wigandia Caracasana and Imperialis, Solanum robustum and marginatum, Mellanthus major, Ricinus gigantea, R. Duchess of Edinburgh, R. to be planted or sown. Put out cabbages and cauliflowers, but only in soil that has been well worked and well enriched. The *Haltica*, or turnip flea, is the great enemy of the cabbage; all efforts at his destruction have failed, and the only effective way of waging war with him is to treat him generously by sowing, between the cabbage rows, common white mustard, the young seedling plants of which are far more palatable to the flea than cabbage. Tomatoes also may be set out later in the month. Ground cherries do best when they come up from seed in the soil, which they will do for years. Finish planting everything now in field and garden, such as indian corn, bush and pole beans, cucumbers, squashes, turnips. Tender plants may now be put out in the flower beds. Do not touch strawberry plants for weeding or hoe-

month of seed-time, yet Turnip sowing may still be done. Some even prefer to sow their Swedes this month, and the soft Turnips for immediate feeding need not necessarily be sown till the end of July. The ground should have undergone a thorough pulverization. Light sandy soil is the best for Turnips. They start best after the ground is warm, but the bulbs swell most rapidly during the cool dowy nights of Autumn. The soil cannot be worked too deep or made too fine for Turnips. Town manures are valued for this crop; and crushed bones have been applied with the best effects, either when covered in the drills in the manner of ordinary dung, or when sown by machine along with the seeds, so as to be in immediate contact with the latter. Guano has been largely used of late years. Superphosphate is very efficacious. One point of Turnip culture that is often

neglected in Nova Scotia, although well understood elsewhere, is that the seed should be put in the moment the soil is prepared. If the earth of the prepared drill gets dried up in the sun before the seed is committed to it, how can the latter be expected to germinate. Hoing and weeding of all drill crops should be carried on actively this month and completed before haying time.

August.—Our farmers, at least those in the best farmed districts of the Province, are working into a mixed husbandry, so that cattle may not be fed on hay all winter and pastured in summer, but fed in winter on straw and roots and coarse grain, and in summer partially or wholly on green fodder in-doors. field of tares or green oats or barley or Indian corn or rape, or any other green eatable thing for the cattle to grow or fatten upon when the pastures are all burnt up. After haying there will be work in the garden and especially in the orchard. Look after the ripening fruit, destroy caterpillars, if any still remain; pick the early August apples, and send them into market. When the rains come, beds of strawberries may be made up. See that the ground is well drained and enriched with old manure. Mushrooms now appear in the horse pastures. The calving of cows for the season will now be pretty well over. All thoroughbred calves should be at once registered in the official Stock Register of the Board of Agriculture. For grade stock the farmer should keep a record in a book for after referen ce.

cattle, and enable the farmers to choose "the best," which means the kind best suited in each case for the special object which the farmer has in view. If the object is to supply milk to the cheese factory or to the city, an Ayrshire grade will be preferred; if butter making is an important feature, a dash of Guernsey or Jersey will be obtained; if the production of beef is the mainstay, then the Short-Horn Durhams will come into favor. Through the importations of pure animals by the Board of Agriculture, the whole stock of the country is rapidly rising into high grades, and the farmer who continues insensible to this fact will be left behind. In former years we have pointed out the merits of several breeds; this year we may specially refer to the Devons, which, although highly valued in England, are not as well known in this Province as they appear to deserve to be, judging from the following description given in the *Annual Register of Rural*

Impress upon all who have not had long experience the necessity of attending to the points noted below:—To take up and store roots successfully is a simple art when properly understood, but the frequent destruction of roots in the cellar shows that it is not always understood or carried out. Potatoes should be dug in dry weather, and allowed to dry completely on the surface before being put together in heaps or in the cellar; the best way is to put them on a barn floor and exclude the light, otherwise they will become green and acquire a bitter taste and poisonous qualities. Mangels, turnips and carrots should be topped and the fine root fibres cut off. Before storing they should, in like manner, be exposed to dry air that the wounds may heal over; if put at once into the cellar, the wounded tissue will begin to ferment, and a large portion of the roots will be rotted by contact. facts such as these are kept clearly in view, no farmer need lose his roots. Of course the cellar must be kept well aired and dry, and frost carefully excluded.

NOVEMBER.—The previous month will have been occupied pretty well in securing the root crops. Now the whole strength of the farm should be thrown into fall plowing. This is a most important operation, whether we view it as a means of preparing the soil for the future crop, or as a convenience to enable the farmer to have spring time for proper spring work. The addition of manure to a soil is not enough, the pulverisation, mixture, freezing, thawing and rain-washing of the soil are the processes by which its fertility is to be secured. Let us illustrate this:—Bone, an insoluble tribasic phosphate, receives the rain water which contains carbonic acid gas; this changes a portion of the bone into carbonate of lime, and the rest into bi-basic phosphate which gradually dissolves and becomes available

The whole of the Societies of the Province meet on the second Monday of December, each in its respective district, when the members receive the Directors' Report, and select officers for the ensuing year. Full information as to the method of organizing Societies may be obtained on application to the Member of the Board for the District, (see Board of Agriculture in another part of the ALMANACK), or to the Secretary, Professor Lawson, Dalhousie College, Halifax.

DEPARTMENT OF LAW AND JUSTICE.

SUPREME COURT OF CANADA.

Chief Justice—(\$8,000)—Hon William Johnston Ritchie.

Judges—(\$7,000 each)—Hon Samuel Henry Strong, Hon Telesphore Fournier, Hon William A. Henry, Hon H. E. Taschereau, Hon J. W. Gwynne.

Registrar and Reporter—(\$2,600)—Robert Cassels, Jr.

This Court and the Exchequer Court were organized under the provisions of 38 Vic., cap. 11.

The Supreme Court has both original and appellate jurisdiction—*Original*, us to (1) habeas corpus in criminal and extradition cases; (2) judicial opinions to the Crown; (3) private bills and petitions therefor referred by the Senate or House of Commons; and (4) civil suits in which the validity of a Dominion or Provincial Act is questioned. *Appellate*, in appeals (1) from the Exchequer Court; (2) from the Provincial Courts; (3) in habeas corpus cases; and (4) in election cases.

THE EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court has original jurisdiction (1) in revenue cases, (2) in civil suits when the Crown for the Dominion is plaintiff, (3) controversies between the Dominion and the Province, or between two Provinces.

The Judges and officers are the same as in the Supreme Court.

Money Order Offices.

The Halifax Post Office, and the Offices in the above list marked in italics, are Money Order Offices, and are authorized to issue Orders payable at any Money Order Office in the Dominion of Canada, Newfoundland, the United Kingdom or British India.

Minor Post Offices.

In addition to the above, there are upwards of eight hundred minor Post Offices, and Way or Sub-Post Offices in the different Counties of the Province.

Rates of Postage within the Dominion.

LETTERS.

To places within the Dominion of Canada, 3 cents per half oz. each. Letters paid less than one rate will not be forwarded. Other short paid letters will be taxed with double the amount of the deficient postage.

On letters posted at an Office to be delivered from it, commonly known as Local or "drop letters," the rate will be 1 cent per 1/2 oz.; to be in all cases prepaid by Postage Stamps affixed to such letter when posted.

Re-directed Letters will be forwarded without any additional charge if not taken from the office or if handed back at the moment of their delivery, but if taken from the office and subsequently re-posted they become subject to a new rate of postage, in default of which they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, Ottawa.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers and periodicals printed and published in Canada may be sent by Post from the Office of publication or news agency at the rate of 1 cent per lb., to regular subscribers or news agents in Canada.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals addressed to places in Canada, will be sent at the rate of one cent per 4 ounces, which must be prepaid by postage stamp. Newspapers and Periodicals weighing less than one ounce may be posted singly, prepaid by postage stamp, one half ct. each.

MISCELLANEOUS MAIL MATTER.

Periodicals, Books, Pamphlets, and occasional Publications, Books and Newspaper Manuscript, Circulars, Prices Current, Hand Bills, Maps, Prints, Drawings, Engravings, Music, Packages of Seeds, Cuttings, Roots, Scions, Grafts, Botanical Specimens, etc., and patterns or samples of merchandise.

To any place in Canada, 1 cent per 4 oz. each packet, Books, Circulars, Music, etc., must be put up open at both ends.

Prepayment of Matter of the above description is in all cases compulsory.

PARCELS.

To any place within the Dominion 6 cents per 4 ozs., which must be prepaid. Parcels must not exceed 5 lbs in weight.

It will be observed that all classes of matter can be registered to the United States and all Countries named in Lists I. and II.

Letters containing coin or jewelry addressed to the United Kingdom or Foreign Countries (except the United States) will not be forwarded to their destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, Ottawa.

Newspapers and periodicals printed and published in Canada may be sent by post from the office of publication or news agency, at the rate of 1 cent per lb. to regular subscribers or news agents in Newfoundland, the United Kingdom, or the United States.

Further information in regard to the rates of postage to British Colonies and foreign countries, via England, or the United States, inland and foreign mail connections, the rules governing letters, newspapers, books, periodicals, samples and parcel post, and the transmission of post cards, ships letters, dead letters, franking and free matter, &c., may be obtained at any Post Office.

GEORGE'S ISLAND, west side of Island, Halifax Harbor, lat 44° 38' 30" N., lon 63° 33' 20" W., two fixed white catoptric lights, vertical, 20 feet apart, 50 and 30 feet high, drab square building, 21 feet high. Lights show seaward on the S., and into harbor on N. side; on W. side the upper light only can be seen. Vessels going into Halifax Harbor, passing Meagher's Beach, will keep the light on starboard bow. The light is for the purpose of guiding vessels in and out of the Harbor, through the channel west of the Island. Lighted 1876. These lights open to westward of Meagher's Beach, clear the westward of Thrum Cap Shoal.

EAST FROM HALIFAX.

MEAGHER BEACH, Sherbrook Tower, east side of entrance to Halifax harbor, lat 44° 36' N., lon 63° 31' 50" W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 12 miles, 58 feet high, building white, with red roof, granite, height 48 feet. Lighted 1815. When Sambro light bears W. S. W., this light should not be brought to the westward of north, which clears the Thrum Cap Shoal. A fog bell here, strikes 7 times in each minute.

DEAR'S ISLAND, on south point of Island, at the eastern entrance to Halifax harbor, two fixed white catoptric lights, horizontally, E. & N., and W. & S., 175 yards apart, visible 13 miles, the light E. 59 feet high, W. light 52 feet, both buildings white, octagonal, wood, height E. 53 feet, lighted 1877, W. 45 feet, lighted 1852, lat 44° 34' 50" N., lon 63° 27' 15" W. The eastern light opens to the southward of western, clears to southward of the Thrum Cap Shoal. Pilots are stationed here.

EGG ISLAND, centre of Island, lat 44° 39' 50" N., lon 62° 51' 32" W., catoptric light, alternate red and white, revolving every minute, visible 15 miles, 80 feet high, octagonal building, black and white vertical stripes on seaward side, height 45 feet. Visible around horizon. Lighted 1865.

POPE'S HARBOUR, on west point of Harbour Island, lat 44° 47' 40" N., lon 62° 38' 50" W., fixed red light, catoptric, visible 9 miles, 45 feet high, tower white, square, wood, with dwelling attached, height 37 feet. Lighted 1877.

SHRET ROCK, at the entrance to Sheet Harbor, lat 44° 49' 55" N., long 69° 29' 40" W., revolving red light every 40 seconds, visible ten miles. White, square, wood, with dwelling attached. 75 feet above high water mark.

BEAVER ISLAND, S. E. part of East Beaver, or William Island, lat 44° 48' 10" N., lon 62° 20' 30" W., white catoptric light, revolving every 2 minutes, visible 12 miles, 70 feet high, white building with two black balls to seaward, S. S. W., 35 feet high. Lighted 1845. On dwelling.

LISCOMB, on island, lat 44° 59' 20" N., lon 61° 57' 50" W., red and white catoptric light, alternating every two minutes, visible 15 miles, 64 feet high, white square wooden building, height 28 feet. Lighted 1872.

WEDGE ISLAND, mouth of St. Mary's River, lat 45° 0' 35", long 61° 52' 35". In course of erection.

HOLLY POINT, west side of entrance to Isaac's Harbour, lat 45° 10' 15" N., lon 61° 39' W., two fixed white catoptric lights, vertically, 20 feet apart, visible 9 miles, 80 feet high, square white building, 20 feet high. Lighted 1874.

COUNTRY HARBOR, on Green Island, Guysboro' County, lat 45° 0' 15" N., lon 61° 32' 30" W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 14 to 16 miles, 51 feet high, white square wooden building, height 23 feet. Lighted 1873. Coast light, and to guide vessels frequenting Country and Fisherman's Harbors.

TORRAY, on eastern point of Berry Head, W. side of entrance to Bay, Guysboro' County, lat 45° 11' 37" N., lon 61° 18' 35" W., fixed catoptric light, red to seaward, white to northward into Bay, and towards Molasses Harbor, visible 10 miles, square wooden building, white with vertical red stripes, top of lantern painted black. Lighted 1876. Height of lantern 61 feet, tower 36 feet.

THREE TOP ISLAND, on the south east point of Three Top Island, Whitehaven, Guysborough County, Nova Scotia, lat 45° 12' 40" N., long 61° 9' 40" W. The light is fixed white catoptric, elevated 48 feet above high water mark, and in clear weather should be seen 11 miles. The building is a wooden one pointed white, and consists of a square tower 32 feet high from base of building to vane on lantern, with keeper's dwelling attached. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels into Whitehaven, and in order to point out the dangers on the northern side of the Western Passage is obscured when bearing to the eastward of N. E. by E. It is visible from all other points of approach, except when intercepted by the high land of Whitehead Island.

WHITEHEAD ISLAND, S. W. extremity of island, Guysboro' County, lat 45° 12' N., lon 61° 8' 15" W., white catoptric light, revolving every 20 seconds, visible 11 miles, 55 feet high, pyramidal wooden building, 35 feet high, octagonal lantern. Lighted 1854. Light not totally obscured during the eclipses; 10 seconds duration of flash, and 10 seconds eclipse.

CANSO CAPE, north part of Cranberry Island, lat 45° 19' 50" N., lon 60° 55' 30" W., two fixed white catoptric lights in one tower, vertically, 36 feet apart, upper visible 15, lower 9 miles, 75 and 40 feet respectively, high, octagonal wooden building, horizontally striped red and white, height 60 feet. Lighted 1815. A steam fog whistle, about 100 yards south of the light-house, in thick weather sounds a blast of 8 seconds in each minute. Bell Buoy at the Grimés Rock, off Cape Canso.

CANSO HARBOR, on Hart or Cutler Island, lat 45° 21' N., lon 60° 58' 30" W., fixed red catoptric light, visible 12 miles, 42 feet high, white square wooden building, height 28 feet. Lighted 1872.

GUYSBORO' HARBOR, W. side of entrance, near Peart Point, Chedabucto Bay, lat 45° 22' 50" N., lon 61° 29' 10" W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 8 miles, 30 feet high, white square wooden building, height 20 feet. Lighted 1864.

SAND POINT, or Eddy Point, south entrance, lat 43° 31' 30" N., lon 61° 14' 40" W., two fixed white catoptric lights, horizontal, 24 feet apart, visible 8 miles, each 25 feet high, white square wooden building, with a black diamond. Lighted 1851. Lights in windows at each end of building.

POINT TUPPER, Ship Harbor or Port Hawkesbury, lat 45° 36' 40" N., lon 61° 22' W., fixed red catoptric light, visible 7 miles, 44 feet high, white square building, height 24 feet. Lighted 1870. In consequence of the in-

CRIBBINGTON'S HEAD, on the north extremity, lat $48^{\circ} 30' 40''$ N., lon $61^{\circ} 0' W.$, white catoptric light, revolving every 40 seconds, visible 10 miles, 20 feet high, square white wooden building, height 20 feet. Lighted 1874. For guiding vessels into Little or West Arichat. Three buoys placed to mark the dangers of the harbor.

JERSEYMAN ISLAND, Arichat Harbor, lat $45^{\circ} 30' 20''$ N., lon $61^{\circ} 3' W.$, fixed red catoptric light, visible 11 miles, 39 feet high, white square wooden building, height 28 feet. Lighted 1872. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels through Crid Passage, in and out of Arichat Harbour. There is also a Range Beacon on the S. E. Point of Jerseyman's Island, that marks Hautfond Shoal, off the entrance to Arichat Harbor. When the beacon and spire of the Roman Catholic Chapel in Arichat are in range, it leads over the west part of the shoal in 10 feet of water. Vessels bound into Arichat, C. B., should pass to the west of the shoal, or bring the beacon in range of the cupola on the Convent, which stands 130 yards east of the R. C. Church, which will lead in clear of the shoal. Only those well acquainted should pass to the eastward of the shoal, or bring the beacon to bear to the N. of N. E. An Iron Can Buoy painted red has been placed about one cable's length S. W. of the shoal in six fathoms of water. The buoy will be placed on or about the 1st May in each year, and taken up about the 10th December.

ARICHAT, Marache Point, south entrance to Madame Island, lat $45^{\circ} 29' N.$, lon $61^{\circ} 1' 50'' W.$, fixed white catoptric light, visible 8 miles, 34 feet high, square white wooden building, height 25 feet. Lighted 1851.

PETITDEGRAT, on Big Arrow Rock, south-east of Madame Island, lat $44^{\circ} 29' 25'' N.$, lon $60^{\circ} 57' 50'' W.$, fixed red catoptric light, visible 10 miles, 38 feet high, white square tower with dwelling attached, height 31 feet. Lighted 1877.

GREEN ISLAND, summit of Island, lat $45^{\circ} 28' 50'' N.$, lon $60^{\circ} 53' 40'' W.$, red and white catoptric light, revolving alternately every 45 seconds, visible 14 miles, 70 feet high, white square wooden building, height 31 feet. Lighted 1865. Light, centre of keeper's dwelling. Visible around horizon.

CAPE LA RONDE, west side of entrance to St. Peter's Bay, lat $45^{\circ} 34' 45'' N.$, lon $60^{\circ} 53'' W.$, fixed white catoptric light, visible 14 miles, 92 feet high, white square wooden building, with dwelling attached, height 28 feet. Lighted 1874. For guiding vessels into St. Peter's Bay.

OURTIQUE ISLAND, on south point, lat $45^{\circ} 36' 40'' N.$, lon $60^{\circ} 57' 15'' W.$, fixed red catoptric light, visible 9 miles, 78 feet high, white square wooden building, with dwelling attached, height 28 feet. Lighted 1874. For guiding vessels through Lennox Passage.

SAINT ESPRIT ISLAND, light in course of erection.

GUION ISLAND, about 230 yards from west end of Island, lat $45^{\circ} 48' 10'' N.$, lon $60^{\circ} 6' 20'' W.$, red revolving light, catoptric, attains its greatest brilliancy every 30 seconds, visible 12 miles, 74 feet high, tower white, square, with dwelling attached, height 54 feet. Lighted 1877.

LOUISBURG, north side of entrance to harbor, 120 yards inshore of point, lat $45^{\circ} 54' 30'' N.$, lon $59^{\circ} 57' 15'' W.$, fixed white catoptric light, visible 16 miles, 85 feet high, building white, with a black vertical stripe on dwelling, height 35 feet. Lighted 1842.

MAINADIKU, on south side of west point of Scatterie Island, lat $46^{\circ} 0' 30''$

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND, on rock off N E point of island, lat 47° 13' 50" N, lon 60° 8' 20" W, fixed white light, dioptric, third order, visible 20 miles, 140 feet high, white octagonal building, height 40 feet. Lighted 1830. Obscured between N by E & E and E N E.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND, S W point of island, lat 47° 11' 20" N, lon 60° 9' 40" W, white dioptric light, third order, revolving every minute, visible 20 miles, 140 feet high, white octagonal building, 40 feet high. Lighted 1831. Obscured when bearing from S S E to W & N. A fog whistle on the south side of the island, S W of Atlantic Cove, about half a mile from the Humane Establishment, sounds once for five seconds in each minute during thick weather and storms.

MARGARKE, summit or middle of Sea Wolf Island, lat 46° 21' 30" N, lon 61° 15' 30" W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 21 miles, 208 feet high, square white building. Lighted 1854. PICTOU HARBOR, south point of entrance, lat 45° 41' 30" N, lon 63° 30' 30" W, 2 fixed catoptric lights, vertical, 25 feet apart, upper white, lower red, visible 11 miles, lantern 65 feet high, building octagonal, striped red and white vertically, height 55 feet. Lighted 1834. Lighted when navigation is open. A small red light is seen below lantern. By keeping light W 8 W vessels clear the east reefs off Pictou Island. In tower of new Custom House a fixed white light, in range with lights at the entrance to harbor, leads through the channel up to the bar.

CARIBOU ISLAND, north-east part of island, lat 45° 40' N, lon 63° 43' 20" W, white catoptric light, revolving every minute, visible 10 miles, 35 feet high, white square building, height 25 feet. Lighted 1868.

MULLIN POINT, north side of entrance to Wallace Harbor, Cumberland County, lat 45° 40' 45" N, lon 63° 25' 15" W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 11 miles, 30 feet high, white square wooden building, height 25 feet. Lighted 1873. For guiding vessels in and out of harbor, Cook buoys are placed to mark the dangers on entering the harbor, black to be left on port and red on starboard when entering.

PUGWASH, in harbor, lat 45° 52' 30" N, lon 63° 40' 30" W, fixed catoptric light, red seaward, white towards harbor, visible 8 miles, 45 feet high white square building, height 44 feet. Lighted 1871. Black buoys to be left on port hand, and red on starboard when entering the harbor.

WEST FROM HALIFAX.

CHEBUCTO HEAD, west side of entrance to Halifax Harbor, lat 44° 30' 20" N, lon 63° 30' 50" W, white light, revolving every minute, visible 18 miles, 132 feet high, white square wooden building, height 22 feet. Passing to the westward of the Buoy at the distance of half a cable and steering a N. & W. course magnetic, will lead up the Harbor to the eastward of the Noverial Shoal, and at a distance of two cables to the westward of Mesurier's Beach light house. A similar buoy in lat 44° 28' 25" N, lon 63° 22' 10" W, in 33 fathoms, from this buoy Sambro Island light W 1-3, N 8 1-3 miles. Devil's Island light N 7-8, W 7 1-3 miles, and the inner signal buoy N W 1-2 N 6 miles.

SAMBRO, middle of island, lat 44° 26' 10" N, lon 63° 33' 30" W, fixed white catoptric light, visible 20 or 21 miles, 115 feet high, building white, octagonal, 60 feet high. Lighted 1758. A steam fog whistle, erected on south side of Island, and elevated 90 feet above high water, in thick weather, fogs and snow storms, sounds each minute a blast of ten seconds' duration. Guns formerly in use, discontinued. A Spar Buoy has been placed off the S. W. Breaker, Sambro, and one on the Pollock, and another on the Whippy Shoal, near Sambro.

BETTY'S ISLAND, on Brlg Point, near Prospect, lat 44° 26' 22" N, lon 63° 45' 54" W, revolving red catoptric light, greatest brilliancy every two minutes, 75 feet high, visible 14 miles, building white, with two horizontal

CROSS ISLAND, east point Lunenburg Bay, lat 44° 18' 45" N., lon 64° 10' W., 2 white catoptric lights, vertical, 45 feet apart, upper intermittent, revolving every minute, and visible 14 miles, 100 feet high, lower fixed, visible 6 miles, and 65 feet high, building red, octagonal base, height 53 feet. Lighted 1832. Pilots resort here, and vessels may take refuge in case of necessity. Upper bright 45 seconds, dark 15 seconds. A fog trumpet has been erected here.

BATTERY POINT, Lunenburg, lat 44° 21' 45" N., lon 64° 17' 30" W., fixed white catoptric light, visible 11 miles, 50 feet high, white, square tower on dwelling, height 24 feet. Lighted 1864. This harbor is easy of access, buoys are placed in the bay and entrance to the harbor on Sculpin Rock, Haddock Shoal, Battery Point Shoal, and Head Shoal. In approaching the harbor from seaward, the buoy on Sculpin Rock, painted red and black, in horizontal stripes, may be left on either hand, giving it a berth of two cables' length. Between this Rock and the Island there are some dangers, the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels ought not to attempt passing between them. A fog whistle near light house, during fogs and snow storms, sounds in each minute a blast of 5 seconds' duration, and after an interval of 5 seconds gives another blast of five seconds, with an interval of 45 seconds.

A Spar Buoy, painted black, has been placed in 12½ fathoms water, south about half a mile from the Blonde Rock, off Seal Island.

YARMOUTH OR CAPE FOURCHU, east cape, south point, lat 43° 47' 28" N., lon 66° 9' 21" W., white catoptric light, revolving every minute and 45 seconds—light ¼ minute, dark ¼ minute, visible 18 miles, 117 feet high, octagonal tower, vertical stripes, red and white, height 59 feet. Lighted 1875. Beacon for guiding vessels into river. Must be left on starboard hand and passed close aboard. Tide leaves breakwater one hour before low water.

CUSTOMS TARIFF.

Corrected to September, 1879.

14.—Resolved, That it is expedient to provide that the value of all Bottles, Flasks, Jars, Demijohns, Carboys, Casks, Hogsheads, Pipes, Barrels and all other Vessels or Packages manufactured of Tin, Iron, Lead, Zinc, Glass or any other material, and capable of holding Liquid; Crates, Barrels and other Packages containing Glass, China, Crockery or Earthenware, and all Packages in which goods are commonly placed for home consumption, including Cases in which Bottled Spirits, Wines or Malt Liquors are contained, and every Package, being the first receptacle or covering, enclosing goods for purpose of sale, shall in all cases, not otherwise provided for, in which they contain goods subject to an *ad valorem* duty, be taken and held to be a part of the fair market value of such goods for duty, and when they contain goods subject to specific duty only, such Packages shall be charged with a duty of Customs of twenty per cent. *ad valorem*, to be computed upon their original cost or value; and all or any of the above Packages described as capable of holding Liquids when containing goods exempt from duty under this Act, shall be charged with a duty of twenty per cent. *ad valorem*; but all Packages not hereinbefore specified, and not specially charged with duty by any unrepealed enactment, and being the usual and ordinary Packages in which goods are packed for exportation only, according to the general usage and custom of trade, shall be free of duty.

The Board earnestly requests medical men throughout the Province to aid the Registrar in keeping the Register correct, by informing him of the death or removal of registered practitioners. The Registrar will be glad to receive such corrections more particularly before the end of April, so that, as far as possible, the Register which will be published in the "Royal Gazette" in May shall be quite correct.

The following clauses of the Medical Act (Chap 23, Revised Statutes, 4th Series,) are here published for the information of the profession and the public:—

8. Subject to the exceptions hereinafter made, no person shall practise physic, surgery or midwifery in Nova Scotia, unless his name shall be registered in the Book of Registry of the Provincial Medical Board, and unless he shall have received from such Board a license to practise.

16. Any person entitled to be registered under this chapter, but who shall neglect or omit to be so registered, shall not be entitled to any of the rights or privileges conferred by the provisions of this chapter, so long as such neglect or omission shall continue.

17. No person, otherwise fully qualified under this chapter, shall be refused registration or a license to practise on account of his adopting or refusing to adopt the practice of any particular theory of medicine or surgery. In case of such refusal by the Board, the party aggrieved shall have the right to appeal to the Governor in Council, who, upon due cause shown, shall issue an order to the Board to register the name of such person and to grant him a license to practise.

21. Every person who shall be registered under the provisions of this chapter, shall be entitled according to his qualification or qualifications to practise Medicine, Surgery, and Midwifery, or either or any of them, as the case may be, in Nova Scotia, and to demand and recover in any court of law reasonable charges for professional aid, advice and visits, and the cost of any medicine or other medical or surgical appliances rendered or supplied by him to his patients.

22. No person shall be entitled to recover any charge in any court of law for any medical or surgical advice, or for attendance, or for the performance of any operation, or for any medicine which he shall have both prescribed and supplied, unless he shall prove upon the trial that he is registered under this chapter.

24. No person shall be appointed as medical officer, physician or surgeon in any branch of the public service, or in any hospital or other charitable institution, unless he shall be registered under the provisions of this chapter.

25. No certificate required by any Act now in force, or that may hereafter be passed, from any physician or surgeon, or medical practitioner shall be valid, unless the person signing the same shall be registered under this chapter.

26. If any person not registered or licensed under the provisions of this chapter, or not being actually employed as a physician or surgeon in Her Majesty's naval or military service, practises Physic, Surgery or Midwifery for hire, gain, or hope of reward, he shall thereby forfeit a sum of twenty dollars for each day on which he so practises.

27. Any sum forfeited under the next preceding section shall be recoverable with costs, and may be sued for and recovered in the same manner as a private debt, by the Provincial Medical Board or any member thereof; and being recovered, shall belong to the Board for the use thereof under this chapter. Provided that, where the information leading to such recovery shall have been given by any person unconnected with the medical profession, such person shall be entitled to receive one-half of the sum so recovered.

Made at the Ship Staff at Citadel Hill, when Vessels are seen from the Citadel or reported from an Outpost.

- For 1 Square Rigged vessel, 2 balls close up, one on the outer halliard and one on the inner halliard.
 - " 2 Do, 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard and one close up on the inner halliard; outer ball dropped.
 - " 3 Do, 2 balls close up, one on the outer and one on the inner halliard.
 - " 4 Do, 2 balls separated, and one close up on the inner halliard.
 - " 5 Do, a penant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside.
 - " 6 Do, a penant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.
 - " 7 Do, a penant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.
 - " 8 Do, a penant under two balls close up on the outer halliards with a ball close up on the inner halliard.
 - " 9 Do, a penant between two balls close up on the outer halliard with a ball close up on the inner halliard.
 - " 10 Do, a flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.
- The above balls, &c., are hoisted on the east or west yard arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

When Sailing Vessels are reported from an outpost, the following signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repeats:

- For a Square Rigged Vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.
- A Ship, a large ball at the end of the yard, with a small one at inner halliard.
- A Barque, a large do at the end, with a small one dropped at inner halliard.
- A Brig, a small one at the end of the yard, and a large one at the inner halliard.
- A Brigantine, a cross close up at the outer halliard. Two or more do, a cross half hoisted.
- A Topsail Schooner, a cross close up at the inner halliard
- Two or more schooners, a cross inner, half hoisted.

The upper yard of the Ship Staff is used solely to designate Steam Vessels thus:

- Two large balls close up, one at the outer and the other at the inner halliard, E or W, a steamer reported in that quarter.
- A small ball at the outer, and a large one at the inner halliard, a second class Packet or merchant Steamer.
- A large ball at the outer, and a small one at the inner halliard, a Man-of-War Steamer or Royal Mail Steamer, or large Merchant Steamer.
- Lanterns are hoisted at night to denote a steamer reported.
- Red light on outer and white light inner on E. yard-arm denotes Steamer East reported.
- Green light outer and white light inner on W. yard-arm—Steamer West reported.

The committee of management consists of thirty-six members, fifteen of whom belong to the Church of England.—The Nova Scotia Bible Society was instituted on the 24th November, 1813. Total issues of the Society, 82,700,000 copies of the Scriptures. Income of the Nova Scotia Society, last year, \$3,632.75.

THE BLUE RIBBON CLUBS within the past two years have been organized in nearly every County of the Province. The enrolled membership increased with remarkable rapidity, especially in the Counties of Yarmouth, Digby, Annapolis, Colchester, Cumberland, Pictou, Cape Breton and Halifax. The aggregate membership in the Autumn of 1878 was estimated at 20,000. After that date some of the Clubs ceased in active work; some died; others were changed into Societies of other names; and the membership now in the Province is not nearly so large as last year.
