# RUSSIA'S DARKNESS TURNED TO LIGHT MESSIAH AWAY HIS POWER

## Announcement of Manifesto Greeted With Marvelous Enthusiasm by Russian Masses Who Through the Streets Chiering and Singing—Strike Committee Meets To-Day to Decide on Calling it Off.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 30.—"I am sure the Russian people, who understand that freedom is, and the American press, which voices the wishes of the people, will rejoice with the friendly Russian nation at this moment, when the Russian people have received from the imperial majesty the promise and the guarantee of freedom, and will join in the hope that the Russian people will wisely aid in the realization of those liberties by co-operating with the government for their peaceful introduction. Only in this way will it be possible to secure the full benefits of the freedom conferred upon the people."

Count Witte, Russia's first premier, to-night, sent the above message to the American people. His message arrived at his residence on Kammenovoy street from Petrohof, where in the Alexander Palace the emperor two hours before had given his final approval to a manifesto, and to a program which will forever end the rule of the absolutism exercised by him and his Romanoff ancestors for 130 years.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 30.—The following is the text of the imperial manifesto, which will forever end the rule of absolutism exercised by him and his Romanoff ancestors for 130 years: "We, Nicholas the Second, by the grace of God, emperor and autocrat of all the Russias, Grand Duke of Finland, etc., declare to all our faithful subjects that the troubles and sorrows in our capitals and in numerous other places fill our heart with excessive pain and sorrow.

"The happiness of the Russian sovereign is indissolubly bound up with the happiness of our people and the sorrow of our people is the sorrow of the sovereign.

"From the present disorders may arise a great national disruption, they menace the integrity and unity of our empire.

"The supreme duty imposed upon us by our sovereign office requires us to efface ourselves and to use all the force which is at our command to hasten in securing the unity and co-ordination of the power of the central government, to secure the realization of the measures for pacification in all circles of public life, which are essential to the well-being of our people."

## Editor World: Presuming that public ownership is all right, and that it cannot be said that you will say otherwise, would it not be in order to agitate for public ownership of life insurance? This surely is a question that concerns the welfare of the people.

Opponents of public ownership may now stand agnost at the sight of the recent exposures of the lords of insurance who have sunk into the cesspool of dishonesty and no doubt every means will be employed to close the lid from public gaze.

We have always been told of the great commercial value of a life insurance policy in some genuine life insurance company as against the uncertain benefits to be derived in joining any fraternal association. These associations have done and are doing a great and necessary work in relieving many from distress and pecuniary want. Their failures, if any, are largely due to the competition of the fraternal associations, which are more clearly the great need for universal co-operation.

Now compare the commercial value of a government bond or life insurance policy to a like policy issued by the government or post office savings bank. It is not necessary here to outline any plan other than to suggest that a department of government life insurance might be instituted in connection with the postoffice department whereby any one residing in any part of the Dominion and eligible could procure a government life policy in any of the branch postoffices, thereby being able to pay for their insurance at first cost without having to pay for the expensive paraphernalia which at present keep those that need it most from participating in its benefits.

Of course, any innovation of this sort will be panned and cribbed down by the representatives of the great corporations which own and control the life insurance business in this country, and they will do their utmost to prevent their own members of the public who vote for them from seeing the light.

The marvelous thing these days is the growth of the idea of public ownership, not only in Canada, but in the United States. In the latter country the people are more than conservative and for some reason or other any idea that can be dubbed "socialistic" seems to them in some way born of satan and the devil.
