ECLIPSES IN 1887.

In the Year 1887 there will be four Eclipses—two of the Sun and two of the Moon.

First—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, February 2. Time at Washington, D. C.: Begins 1 h. 14 m. morn.; middle 5 h. 22 m. morn.; ends 6 h. 30 m. morn. Magnitude of Eclipse 5 digits.
Second—An annular Eclipse of the Sun February 22; invisible in the United States; visible in Central America and the western part of South America.
Third—A partial Eclipse of the Moon, August 3; invisible in the United States.
Fourth—A total Eclipse of the Sun on the morning of August 19; invisible in any part of America, except Alaska; visible in Europe and Asia. The path of totality passes through the northern part of the German Empire, including Berlin and Konigsberg, through the central part of Russia just north of Moscow, and through the northern part of China and Japan, north of Yedo.

MORNING STARS.—MERCURY until February 7, and from March 21 to May 27, from July 29 to September 10, and from November 17 to the end of the year. VENUS from September 21 to the end of the year.
 EVENING STARS.—MERCURY from February 7 to March 21, from May 27 to July 29, and from September 10 to November 17. VENUS until September 21.
