ATTACKED WHILE SADDLING UP COLONIAL RIFLES FOUGHT HARD

Were Pursuing Commandant Malan, ... Kritzing
Surprised Them at Waterloo Camp—Chamberlain in Health
Again Repeats His Dictum—"Boers Hopelessly Beaten."

Craddock, Cape Colony, June 24.—The detachment of the Colonial Mounted Rifles which was attacked by the Boers at Waterloo, June 23 (when the British lost 14 men killed and wounded and 60 men were captured), was pursuing Commandant Malan, when General Kritzing surprised the Boers' camp at Waterloo, while the colonial troops were saddling up. The fight lasted two and a half hours.

REPEATS HIS SAYING.

London, June 24.—Mr. Chamberlain, the Colonial Secretary, has signalled his recovery from an attack of gout and his resumption of his duties by telegraphing to the Unionist candidate for Stratford: "I hope the electors will remember that a seat lost to the government is still a seat gained by the Boers," thus repeating the dictum which earned him unlimited abuse at the time of the last election.

MR. TARTE TO MAKE A CANOE TRIP AND INVESTIGATE FRENCH RIVER

Two Engineers of the Department Will Go With Him—The Minister Will Be in Toronto To-Day, and Afterward Inspect Collingwood and North Bay.

Montreal, June 24.—(Special)—Hon. J. Tarte will personally make an examination of the French River, using a canoe most of the time. He will do this in company with two of the engineers in his department, in order that when the matter comes up in Parliament he will be able to discuss the proposed improvements from the standpoint of his personal knowledge.

The minister arrived in town on Saturday to attend the St. Jean Baptiste celebration to-day. In the course of an interview Mr. Tarte said: "I shall visit Toronto on Tuesday, where I wish to examine something in connection with the harbor works. From Toronto I go to Collingwood and thence to North Bay. After that I shall make an examination of the French River. Two of the engineers of the Department of Public Works will join the party, and Mr. McCall, M.P. for Nipissing, will also accompany me. Our examination will have to be conducted by means of canoes, and there are about 90 miles which we wish to carefully investigate. I understand that there are a good many rapids, so we shall have to portage over some parts of the route. The outing should prove a pleasant one if the flies do not molest us too much. They are said to be very bad in that part of the country. After the examination we shall be much better acquainted with the route and its requirements. When it comes up in Parliament, we are not idle. The work will be pushed steadily forward to completion. We are doing all we can for the St. Lawrence route."

BELIEVE HE WAS DROWNED.

Elip Being Dragged for Little Tom Sutherland's Body—His Hat Recovered From Water.

Explains Constable George Williams spent the whole of yesterday in dragging the boy in the vicinity of the wharf at the foot of Spadina-avenue and the old Northern Railway elevator dock, in the hope of finding the body of little Tom, the 7-year-old son of Donald Sutherland, who has been missing from his home, 144 John-street, since Friday last. The search was unsuccessful, and will be resumed early this morning.

BRASS MOULDERS STRIKE.

Between 80 and 100 Hands of Several Toronto Foundries Lay Down Their Tools.

Between 80 and 100 brass moulders employed in the James Morrison Company and several other works are on strike, because their demands for higher wages were not acceded to.

About two weeks ago the men made a request for an increase in wages from \$1.15 and \$2 per day to \$2.50 and \$3. This was not granted and the men laid down their tools. The James Morrison company offered the men \$2.25 per day, and the men returned to work on condition that their wages would be further advanced. The additional increase was not forthcoming and again the men went out. The James Morrison company consented to pay \$2.50 per day, providing that the other firms would do the same.

ONE MAN HURLED TO DEATH Bridge Painter Named Clarke Fell 190 Feet From Steel Arch Bridge at Niagara Falls.

Yet the Situation in West Virginia Mining Regions Is Bad Enough—Number of Lives Lost a Matter of Speculation—Some Say 60 and One Feels 1000.

ANOTHER SAVED BY THE ROPES

The Third, With Presence of Mind, Grabbed the Scaffold Rope and Climbed to the Bridge.

Niagara Falls, Ont., June 24.—At 2.45 this afternoon a man named Clarke of Niagara Falls N.Y., a bridge painter, with two companions, one named Finnigan, the other name unknown, were on a swing platform, suspended under the centre of the upper steel arch bridge. The three men had been engaged painting the top of the bridge. It seems Clarke was adjusting the rope and tackle that was suspending the platform, and in some manner the rope slipped the man's fingers and hurled him to death below, some 190 feet. When his body struck in mid-air it could be plainly seen by the horror-stricken onlookers that the water beneath the bridge was tinged with red. The body disappeared and was not again seen.

Finnigan miraculously escaped death, being hurled from the platform with Clarke, but, fortunately for him, in going down he got entangled in the rope and tackle, and his body was suspended in mid-air, hanging head downwards, and swinging to and fro. The severe drop the man got almost wrenched his foot off. His leg, however, and his body dislocated. While his hands soon had the dangling body of the injured man drawn up onto the bridge. He was immediately taken to the Memorial Hospital, and is doing as well as could be expected.

The third and unknown man was more lucky than his two companions. As soon as the steel where Clarke and Finnigan stood dropped, he grabbed the rope suspending the side he stood and climbed up the bridge.

ANOTHER ACCOUNT.

Niagara Falls, N.Y., June 24.—A ladder on which three men were engaged in painting the iron work of the steel arch bridge over the falls, collapsed this afternoon. One of the men was dashed to death on the bridge abutments, his body falling into the rushing waters of the rapids. Another man was injured, and the third escaped unhurt, but he was badly injured. It is not yet known to the spectators to be hours, but which in reality was only a few minutes. The dead man is Edwin Clarke, 28 years old. His head struck against the top of the bridge abutment, his body falling into the river and disappearing. It has not been recovered.

The man whose leg was broken is Patrick Finnigan. He dropped about 30 feet before his legs caught in the lattice work. His leg is broken, and he is clinging to a rope and was not injured.

MANITOBA CROP CONDITIONS

Favorable Reports Continue and the Outlook is for a Most Abundant Harvest.

Winnipeg, June 24.—(Special)—The crop reports from the Canadian Northern stations are received to-day, and indicate that the favorable conditions of last week are being continued. All the reports describe the prospects in glowing terms, and many prophesy a yield of from 20 to 25 bushels per acre. No damage what- ever is reported from any cause, and the growth is described as wonderful. The wheat is said to be from 15 to 18 inches in height, and standing out beautifully. Belmont reports a hailstorm Monday, but no damage. Oats and barley are reported as looking unusually well, and they say that hay is the best crop in many years.

The C. P. R. crop reports could scarcely be improved upon. The conditions at nearly every point in the Province are perfect. At Timon Centre, Manitoba and Burnside, the wheat has headed out on a number of farms, and the growth is being celebrated. At Boisclair, the condition of crops for this date is almost perfect. There is a violent windstorm about eight miles north of Boisclair, accompanied by hail, which did some damage, but not of a very serious character, as the territory covered is small. Nothing to Arbitrate.

THE FLOOD NOT SO DESTRUCTIVE AS FIRST REPORTS INDICATED

Yet the Situation in West Virginia Mining Regions Is Bad Enough—Number of Lives Lost a Matter of Speculation—Some Say 60 and One Feels 1000.

Roanoke, Va., June 24.—The following short statement to-night by one of the general officers of the Norfolk and Western Railroad, summarizing the flood situation in the light of the latest despatches, was given to the Associated Press: "Restoration of telegraph line develops that damage by flood through coal fields was exaggerated. Loss of life will not exceed 50 or 75, and damage to property, including reports to railroads and coal operations, will not exceed \$500,000. It is expected the railroad will get the line open to-morrow or next day."

THE LOSS IS FEARFUL.
New York, June 24.—Mayor Land of Buffalo, N. Y., wires as follows: "It is estimated that 200 lives were lost in the miners' flood. The damage to the Norfolk and Western Railroad Company is estimated at half a million dollars, and to the coal companies and individuals at two million dollars. The number of bodies recovered is about 200. I am unable to tell whether or not the bodies will be recovered. Information comes in."

THE LATEST REPORTS.
Cincinnati, June 24.—A special to the Times Star from Bluefield, W. Va., says: "Reports from the devastated flood district in the Pocahontas flat top region say bodies are being rapidly recovered and identified. A relief corps has patrolled a few miles of the territory, but no reliable estimate can yet be made of the number of lives lost."

"It will be several weeks before railroad traffic can be resumed, and probably longer before the mines will be in operation. About 200 collieries and coke plants were damaged from \$400 to \$25,000 each. "Thousands of homeless persons are being cared for in the mountains.
