Birmingham, Ala., Sept. 19.—In a stampede of humanity, caused by a false alarm of fire, 65 colored Baptists were killed and 2000 others were injured in the Shiloh Colored Baptist Church at the corner of Avenue G, and 15th-street at night.

ASSESSMENT OF WARD FIVE

Total is Over Eleven and a Half Millions Showing a Gratifying Increase

THE CAUSE OF SOME DECREASES

Many New Houses Assessed—Population Has Increased Over 1000 During the Year.

The assessment returns for Ward 5 as returned by the assessors for the year 1902 were announced Friday by the Assistant Assessment Commissioner, Forman. The total assessment for the ward is \$11,475,985, an increase of \$131,103 over last year. The value of land, \$4,629,215; buildings, \$6,496,467; personal property, \$300,500; taxable income, \$122,803. The total of exemptions is \$2,520,345, an increase of \$200,706, and the population is 35,096, an increase of 1067 over the previous year.

PEARY'S RETURN.

New York Herald: The failure of Civil Engineer Peary to reach the North Pole is not, as is generally supposed, a disgraceful record. He has made more important contributions to the hydrographic and geographic knowledge of the Arctic seas—particularly of the waters and ice caps in and about Greenland and Grinnell Land. His highest latitude, 84 degrees 17 minutes, was reached during the spring of this year by a sledge party, and the difficulties that forced a retreat must have been more trying to Peary than any other expedition. This special expedition was unmarked by any exposure, suffering or danger that is normally incident to serious Arctic work.

BOTTLE AFLOAT 28 YEARS.

Thrown Overboard in Indian Ocean Comes Ashore on Cape Cod.

Brookton, Mass., Sept. 19.—George T. Maddox of this city was a member of the crew of the vessel Hattie Tapley twenty-eight years ago, and on April 13, 1874, was one of the men who placed a note in a bottle bearing this inscription:

"This bottle was thrown overboard from the ship Hattie Tapley of Bangor, Cape Cod, on the 13th of April, 1874, in latitude 42° 30' N., longitude 70° 30' W. This was in the Indian Ocean. The bottle was picked up recently off Monmouth Point, Cape Cod. It was intact, and the message could be read easily. The bottle was found by a Harwich fisherman."

Mr. Maddox recalls the voyage on which he was when the bottle was thrown overboard. He thinks the wind helped the bottle around Cape Horn to the Atlantic Ocean, the southeast trade wind again helping it northward. The Gulf Stream presumably assisted it into the British Isles, and it was carried by the currents, which brought it to the rest of the way.
