POOR RELIEF.

The Charitable Committee met every Wednesday afternoon during the winter months, at the St. George's Home, 139 St. Antoine Street and distributed wood and provisions to those in need. The following figures will show the extent of their operations during the year:—

The number of poor relieved on Wednesday of each week was nearly as large as last year, the average being 57 8-11 persons on each of eleven days, as compared with 62 4-9 persons on the nine

days on which assistance was rendered up to the time of the annual meeting, on the 6th March, 1882. We commenced a fortnight earlier this year on account of the inclemency of the weather: there were only 38 applicants for relief on the opening day, 20th December, which tends to reduce the average for the year just elapsed. It will not be an easy matter to reduce the number much below the present figure, as quite a number of those looking to your Society for help have fair claims on your sympathy, owing to old age, sickness, or other infirmity; and, to these, "prosperous times" only means higher cost of living, while they have a severe struggle at the best; and a discouraging feature is that those who have been frequently assisted come to look upon it as a matter of course, and make little or no effort to forego it. On the 28th February relief was given in wood or provisions, or both, to—

In addition to those assisted by the Committee the Chairman has, as in former years, issued wood to a number of persons who needed no other assistance. A considerable amount in money was also expended in assisting special cases, in cash, purchase of railway or steamboat tickets, rent, board, &c. Quite a number of persons were sent to their friends at a greater or less distance, and thus placed in a position to earn their own living.

The late Council left in yard a quantity of fuel estimated at $70\frac{1}{4}$ cords, which, on delivery, was found to be only $60\frac{3}{4}$ cords. This discrepancy has arisen on the operations of many years, the yard never having been emptied before.

We purchased this year 150 cords wood from the Grand Trunk Railway Company, who generously delivered it at Point St. Charles at cost price. Of this lot there have been delivered to date $74\frac{3}{4}$ cords, leaving $75\frac{1}{4}$ cords in the yard. The total quantity issued during the past year was $135\frac{1}{2}$ cords.

IMMIGRATION.

Your Council have to report a larger number of Irish Protestant Immigrants arrived during the past year than for some years previous, but the outlay of the Society on this account has not been large, and the Immigration Committee has been able to assist some of them to obtain employment in Montreal.

Reports having found their way into a few newspapers that female immigrants were sometimes led astray on their arrival in Montreal, the Presidents of the different National Societies met at the request of the St. Patrick's Society to investigate the matter; and your Council are happy to be able to assure you, that, after a very searching investigation, it was found that the statement was utterly unwarranted. The Chief of Police, detectives, immigration agents and railway officials were unanimous in testifying to the untruthfulness of the report.

BURIAL LOT.

Three persons have been interred in the lot acquired last year in Mount Royal Cemetery.

Your Council have been urged by several of our members to have the lot enclosed in a substantial and decent manner. Plans have been procured from Messrs. Reed and Forsyth. Your Council desire an expression of the wishes of the Society on the subject. The estimated cost of carrying out the several plans received varies considerably.

OUR THANKS

Are due to Doctors Reddy, Major, Dugdale and Gurd, for gratuitous services during the past year; to Miss Armstrong and Mrs. C. E. Dawson, for their continued and valuable co-operation with the Charitable Committee; to Messrs. H. & A. Allan, the G. T. Railway Co., the North Shore Railway, and the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Co., for forwarding several persons at reduced fares.

DONATIONS.

The President expresses his grateful thanks to the members of the Society and other Irish Protestants (and to two other gentlemen, who

were called on by mistake) for the very generous response made to his appeal for money to carry on the work of the Society during the winter, resulting in the addition of \$1031.50 to the funds of the Society. The amount will amply suffice to carry on the work till the end of the month, when the relief ceases for the winter, and will also leave a fair sum on hand available in case of a flood on the opening of the river.
