**The Ordinance of the Lord's Supper** is dispensed on the first Sabbaths in February, June and October.

**The Sabbath School** meets every Sabbath in the Lecture Room, at 2½ p. m. Bible Class meets in the Bible Class Room, at the same hour.

**The Sabbath School Teachers** meet on the first Monday in each month, at 7 o'clock, in the Library.

**The Committee of the Missionary Society** and Collectors meet on the first Wednesday of each month, and a meeting of the congregation for prayer and the receiving of Missionary intelligence, is held on the same evening, at 7½ o'clock, in the Lecture Room.

1. The Managing Committee, in presenting the Twenty-Fourth Annual Report of the Congregation, would desire to acknowledge the goodness of God vouchsafed to us during the past year, and to render Him our thanks in permitting us once more to meet in regard to matters pertaining to His cause.

2. Your Committee rejoice to know that our

3. The Treasurer's books have been audited and found correct, and an abstract of the Receipts and Disbursements for the year is annexed to this Report.

4. Your Committee regret to observe that there is a decrease in the amount of Pew Rents, as appears in Appendix A, and they would again earnestly request greater attention on the part of Pew Holders to the duty of prompt payment. Attention to this matter would enable your Committee to meet current expenses and interest as they respectively become due.

5. Your Committee, however, are pleased to congratulate the Congregation on a slight increase in the "ordinary" Collections, arising from the plan adopted during the past year of taking up a Monthly Collection; these with some other Special Collections (which have been appropriated to the objects for which they were made), have increased the amount to the sum of \$164,75 in excess of those of last year.

6. Your Committee regret to report that part of the interest due in July last is still unpaid, and the whole of the interest due on 1st of October last is not paid, which appears in the statement of Liabilities and Assets annexed to this report.

The Auditors found 108 Pew-holders in arrear for Pew Rents, in sums ranging from \$1 to \$46.25, amounting in the aggregate to \$568.59, of which they consider one-half as a good asset. \$200 of the remaining half are due by parties in sums varying from \$12 to \$46.25.

The annual meeting of the Office Bearers and Teachers of the above schools was held in the Library, on the evening of Monday, January 11th, 1875, when reports from the several schools for the past year were submitted, and the Office Bearers for the ensuing year appointed.

The report from the Central School showed a slight decrease in numbers as compared with the previous year—the attendance being, of girls, 70; of boys, 60; total, 130; the average for the preceding year having been 136. This decrease is to be attributed to the want of permanent and efficient teachers for some of the Boys' Classes, more particularly, and it is very much to be regretted that this complaint has to be made year after year to such a large congregation, which is professedly saying, "Lord what wilt Thou have me to do?" and yet suffer the Sabbath School to languish for want of sympathy and aid.

The amount received from the Scholars for the support of their Pointe aux Tremble pupil also shows a decrease, as compared with 1873, of \$15.
