BISHOP'S ADDRESS.

The Most Rev. the Metropolitan delivered the following address at the opening of the Synod of the Diocese of Montreal, on the 17th June, 1873.

My Reverend Brethren and Brethren of the Laity:—In opening this, our Fourteenth Synod, I cannot forbear to express my thankfulness at the position of our Diocese now, as compared with its condition at the time when my venerable Predecessor presided at its first Synodical Meeting. Since then the real work of the church has wonderfully advanced; and having passed through many trials and difficulties, she has come forth braced and invigorated as to her outward symmetry, and purified as to her inner life; "stablished, strengthened, settled." As regards the Synod itself, I must congratulate you on the improved tone which has marked our last two sessions. The violence of party spirit has, I trust, passed away; and difficult and exciting questions are now discussed with that manly and Christian forbearance, which is quite compatible with an occasional divergence of opinions. May we not feel that we meet here as beloved brethren, bound together by a holy fellowship, bearing with one another, and in honour preferring one another, rather than as skillful disputants, or fierce polemics;—holding our own as firmly as ever, but doing so with forbearance and in the exercise of Christian love. Of this I am sure, that if our coming together is to be a blessing and refreshment to ourselves, and a strengthening of the Church, we must lay aside all bitterness of feeling, and fairly meet each question which shall come before us with honesty of purpose, with coolness of judgment, and with gentleness and courtesy of spirit. Such will, I hope, be the prevailing desire of the several members of the present Synod, and especially of each speaker who shall take part in our debates.

We have experienced some serious losses since we last met. One who had grown up with the Church from her earliest days, had struggled with her in her infancy, and lived to see her in her prosperity, filling for many

years an important and honoured post in this Cathedral city,—who not only took part in the deliberations of our Synod, but was more than once called to preside at its sittings, has been removed from us, leaving his strong mark behind him. Another valuable member of the Synod is no longer with us; the seat which was occupied by our friend Major Campbell is now vacant; and we shall all miss his kind and genial manner, and his wisdom as one of our Counsellors. And still more recently another is gone from us, T. B. Anderson, Esq., whose self-denying labours as Treasurer of the Diocese for many years, and as the generous friend of the clergy, make his memory very dear to us.

ORDINATIONS AND CONFIRMATIONS.

In the past year I have admitted nine men to Holy Orders; namely, six Priests, and three Deacons. I have held forty-two Confirmations, and confirmed six hundred and sixteen persons. And I have been permitted to visit two-thirds of our Missions.

PROSPERITY OF THE CHURCH.

I think I may say, with much thankfulness, that the Diocese has never since I have been appointed to the oversight of it, been in so healthy and prosperous a condition as at present. There exists harmony among our Clergy and devotedness to their important work; and there is a cordial and happy understanding between them and the Laity. There is life too in our Missions. And altho' there are several spots on our Diocesan Map which we are forced at present to leave blank for want of men to fill them up, still I hail even this as a sign that God is with His Church, and is preparing the way for its enlargement; for I am persuaded that growth is the sure evidence of spiritual, as well as physical, life.

I am happy to say that there appears to be a very general conviction, that the salaries of our clergy should at once be raised, in proportion to the increased expense of living, and that henceforth a minimum of \$800 per annum should not only be acknowledged in theory, but also carried into practice. In those cases where a lesser sum is at present provided, there is, I believe, an anxious wish among the Laity not to be behind the stated requirement. In order to facilitate this increase of salary a supplemental grant is offered from the Mission Fund, provided any parish is willing to contribute a like additional sum to meet this grant. This could scarcely have been done, had not a Sustentation Fund been raised which has now I rejoice to say, reached \$65,000, and already bears interest to the annual amount of \$1,250.

Whilst upon this subject I would state that a Bill has been carried through the Legislature by Mr. Colby, M. P., legalizing investments by religious corporations up to eight per cent. instead of six. To him our thanks are justly due, as well as to our Chancellor for the pains he has taken, and the energy he has shown in a matter so important to the financial interests of this and other dioceses.

THEOLOGICAL INSTITUTION.

I have spoken of the lack of men for ministerial work. This has caused me, and still causes me, serious anxiety. It is the pressure of this deficiency and the apprehension of the fatal consequences which must ensue from its continuance, that have led me, after much consideration, to make an effort to provide a remedy. I have, therefore, determined without loss of time to afford in this place such facilities for theological training as will, I trust, attract a certain number of young men as candidates for Holy Orders, who would otherwise be lost to the ministry. Such a Training Institution is not intended to take the place of Bishop's College, but to be supplemental to it. The College at Lennoxville will, I trust, still supply its quota; and I wish it to be understood that I am still ready to send there any one who is desirous of taking the course either in arts, or in theology or in both. And no one will rejoice more sincerely than myself, if the College keeps up, or multiplies, its number of students. I earnestly look to God for His blessing on my present effort, and pray that the proposed Institution may prove to be a valuable handmaid in the organization of the Church in our Diocese.

DEACONS IN SOLE CHARGE.

Should my hope be realized, and the ranks of the clergy be increased, I greatly desire to place our Deacons, during at least the first year of their novitiate, under the control and guidance of some elder brother in the ministry, instead of yielding to the necessity which has hitherto existed of placing them at once in the sole charge of missions.

PROFESSORSHIP AT LENNOXVILLE.

I have upon the table a letter from the Bishop of Quebec, which I will read to you at the proper time, announcing a liberal offer made by the Church Society of that Diocese, but emanating I believe from a private donor, of \$400, towards increasing the salary of the Theological Professor at Lennoxville, provided a like sum be granted by the Diocese of Montreal. I hope that this Synod will at least give its sanction to the raising of this sum within the Diocese.

PATENT RECTORIES.

It will be in the recollection of the Synod that at its last Session it passed a Canon, based upon an enabling Act of the Legislature, with a view to the subdivision of our Patent Rectories, where it might be desirable. The Synod by this Canon authorizes the Bishop to act as its Executive, reserving to itself the right to give, or to withhold, its formal sanction to his decree. Two cases have been submitted to me. One is that of the Patent Rectory of Dunham. And here there is no difficulty whatever, since the Rector is a consenting party. I shall, therefore, simply ask you to confirm the Decree which I have issued, constituting the Mission of Cowansville and Sweetsburg, which was included within the limits of the Rectory of Dunham, as a distinct and separate Parish. In the other case, that of the impor-

tant Rectory of Montreal, a difficulty has arisen owing to the non-consent of the present Rector. I have therefore thought it well to proceed no further with the issuing of my Decree, preferring to leave the matter in the hands of the Synod. It will be necessary, I think, that you should either revise the present canon or frame a new one with express reference to the Rectory of Montreal. In any case, I feel sure that the matter will be arranged in an amicable spirit, and with a single desire to do justice to the various parties concerned.

SEE OF ALGOMA.

There is one more object, to which I desire to call your attention. Since we last met, there has been a special meeting of the Provincial Synod, when the election was duly made of a Missionary Bishop for the projected Diocese of Algoma. The choice of the Synod fell upon one, of whose ability and devotedness we in this Diocese have had abundant proof. After accepting, however, this high and holy office, he was led, from conscientious motives, to resign the post. Since, then, a new election must be made, there are two points on which I desire to elicit the opinions of the Five Dioceses. First, whether, in order to carry out the provision made by the Church for the definite income of the Bishop, you will guarantee, on behalf of *this* Diocese, the apportionment allotted to it, viz., \$300 per annum, for four years. Secondly, whether, in the opinion of this Synod, it is desirable that a special meeting of the Provincial Synod be convened for the purpose of such election; or whether you would recommend its postponement to the ordinary meeting in 1874. The mind of the several Dioceses, as expressed in their respective Synods, will be a guide to me as to the course which, as Metropolitan of the Province, I shall take. I may add that I have already received the opinions of the Synods of Ontario and Huron; *both* being willing to carry out the pledge given by their bishops as to the apportionment of income; and both being of opinion that the election may be left to the ordinary assembling of the Synod in next year.

GENERAL THANKSGIVING DAY.

I have to announce that I have been requested by the Bishops of this Province, to confer with the heads of the other religious bodies, on the subject of a day of general Thanksgiving for Harvest and other national blessings. The result is that a most cordial agreement has been arrived at, as to the united observance of one and the same day, viz: Thursday, October 16th. I therefore beg to appoint that day to be observed for the present year.

CLERICAL CONFERENCE.

One word to my Reverend Brethren before me. It has been suggested that it would be acceptable to the clergy that we should meet in conference for two days at some time during the present year, to take counsel together on such questions as shall bear more especially on our ministerial

In this suggestion I heartily concur; and if a general wish on the subject is expressed either privately or publicly, I will summon the clergy of the diocese to come together here in Montreal, either late in the coming autumn, or at any other more convenient time.

And now my brethern, both of the clergy and laity, I earnestly commend your deliberations to the gracious guidance and direction of God's Holy Spirit. We have solemnly invoked His influence; may it be felt among us! I heartily trust that our coming together in Synod at this time may prove to be productive of much good to the Church, and much profit to ourselves. Let us, during these days of our session, endeavour to strike the keynote of unity. The more nearly we attain to it the greater will be our strength, and the more we shall be acting in accordance with the mind of our Lord. It has been my earnest desire in the past four years to promote a feeling of brotherly union and concord in the Diocese; and if I have succeeded, I am thankful to Him who is the Author of peace and Lover of concord. And now I trust that not one word will be spoken which shall break the harmony which exists, but that the prevailing spirit of the present Synod shall rather tend to cement and strengthen it for the future.

REPORTS OF THE RURAL DEANS, EXTRACTS
FROM MISSIONARY REPORTS AND STATIS-
TICS OF THE DIOCESE.

DEANERY OF HOCHELAGA, ANNUAL REPORT, 1872.

MY LORD,—The annual meeting of the Deanery was held in the Synod Hall on Monday, 16th June, at 7.30 p.m.

There were present fifteen clergymen and eight laymen; and thirteen Incumbencies were represented.

The plan for securing the regular payment of missionaries' salaries adopted by the Executive Committee was laid before the Deanery, and the Deanery while concurring in the general principle of "the plan" thought that there should be larger discretionary power given the Committee before requesting the Bishop to remove the clergyman.

The following were appointed a "Board of enquiry" in accordance with the first clause of the plan: The Rural Dean, Rev. J. Carmichael, Rev. W. C. Merrick, Mr. Empey, Mr. Pangman.

The grants for the year were carefully scrutinized, and the grants as they stood, p. 252. sess. XIII, were recommended with the exception of the grant to Côteau du Lac, which by the act of the S.P.G. is removed from the control of the Synod, and that to Rawdon which it will be seen, p. 255, sess. XIII, should have been \$400. The subscription to the Mission Fund was also confirmed as it stands, p. 252 sess. XIII, with the exception of Côteau du Lac, which it was thought should be increased to at least \$100. Mascouche and New Glasgow with Kilkenny have failed to subscribe anything to the Mission during the past year in consequence, it was stated, of the Mission being vacant during a portion of the year. Hochelaga also has failed to subscribe to the Mission Fund.

The Deanery ask the earnest attention of the Lay Committee to the fact that some of the poorest Missions needing most the increased stipend for their clergymen are precluded by their poverty from availing themselves of the plan for raising the salaries of the clergy, as they have not the power of increasing their subscriptions. Enquiry was made of the clergy, "Have you received the full amount of your stipend for the past year?"

The reply was "No" in two instances.

DIVISION OF PARISHES.

The Deanery is strongly of opinion that the division of the Parish of Montreal into separate Rectories should be carried into effect during the present session of Synod.

EXISTING BUILDINGS.

The three churches, viz., Ste. Thérèse, St. Martin and New Glasgow, remain in the same condition as last year, and ought to receive immediate attention at the hands of the Synod. The Glebe and Parsonage at New Glasgow have been sold, and the proceeds invested (realized \$400.) The Deanery recommends that a Committee be appointed to carry into effect the advice on p. 291, sess. XIII.

ENDOWMENTS.

New Glasgow, \$400, proceeds of sale of Parsonage and Glebe. Berthier added in 1872 \$254.00. Total \$3254.00.

More laborers are needed. Kilkenny, which will favorably compare with any portion of the Diocese in its attachment to the Church, has been without a clergyman for several years, it affords a fine field for an earnest man. The Mission of Rawdon needs an additional missionary. In the last report it was stated that the Rev. T. A. Young has resigned the incumbency of Coteau du Lac, since then the S. P. G. had placed Mr. Young on its list of those who are to receive a certain grant, consequently Mr. Young remains at Coteau du Lac.

The confirmations in the Deanery have witnessed for the continued increase of the Church, and indications are not wanting of spiritual blessing.

DEANERY OF ST. ANDREWS, REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING
JUNE, 1873.

CLARENDON CENTRE, June 16th, 1873.

MY LORD,—The annual Ruri-decanal meeting of the Deanery of St. Andrews was held at Hull, on the 11th inst.

Holy Communion was celebrated in St. James Church, previous to the commencement of business.

The Clergy present were, the Ven. Archdeacon Lonsdell, the Rural Dean, the Revs. C. Boyd, W. R. Brown, J. H. Dixon, T. Johnson, J. Johnston, C. J. Kaapcke, W. B. Longhurst, T. Motherwell, J. Rollit, J. Seaman, P. W. Smith, and B. B. Smith.

The first subject presented for consideration was the plan proposed by the Executive Committee "for securing the regular payment of missionaries' salaries." While there was a general feeling that the Constitution already provided for investigation in cases of non-payment, yet, in view of the possibility of the proposition being entertained by the Synod, the plan was discussed and the first and second clauses amended as follows: viz:

"Clause I. "At the annual Ruri-decanal meeting of each Deanery there shall be appointed a "Board of Enquiry," consisting of the Archdeacon or Rural Dean, two Clergymen and two Laymen, three to form a quorum.

Clause II. This Board shall ascertain from each Parish (or Mission) within the Deanery, receiving aid from the Mission Fund, the amount the congregation ought to contribute in support of their Clergyman, and the Board shall report the same to the Bishop, which report the Board shall annually revise. It is also desirable that in cases where new missions are formed, or where a vacancy occurs, the said Board shall visit the parish (or mission) in order to obtain the required information."

A Board was appointed provisionally, consisting of the Rural Dean, the Revs. J. Rollit, J. Seaman, and Messrs. Thomas Owens and Hector McLean.

The question of Missions coming under consideration, it was unanimously resolved to recommend that "the westerly portion of the unwieldy mission

It was also resolved that it is expedient that the Mission of Bristol, as recommended by the Ruri-decanal Board at its meeting in Oct., 1869, should be formally established as an independent charge.

Attention was directed to the spiritual destitution of Templeton, Portland and parts adjacent. A large and populous section of the country is entirely destitute of the ministrations of the Church, and it is quite impossible for the neighbouring Clergy to add to the work of their large Missions, the care of these Townships.

Other portions of the Deanery are also imperfectly served, the number of the Clergy being quite inadequate to the wants of the Deanery.

Missionary meetings were held in the lower part of the Deanery by the Ven. Archdeacon Lonsdell, assisted by the Clergy. No meetings were held in the upper part of the Deanery during the past winter as a large portion of the men are usually from home at that season, engaged in lumbering operations.

The Revs. J. Rollet and W. R. Brown, visited shanties in the Gatineau District, travelling nearly 400 miles. Services were held, copies of the New Testament, both in English and French, tracts and other suitable reading, were distributed.

To supply the spiritual wants of those engaged in lumbering is a task of peculiar difficulty, and should not be left entirely upon the Clergy of the immediate vicinity, whose Missions are already larger than the most of those in other parts of the Diocese.

The spiritual destitution of many parts of the country naturally led to the question of the supply and training of Missionaries. On this subject the Ruri-decanal Board was unanimously of the opinion that one cause of the lack of Missionaries is the very small stipends of the Clergy as compared with the cost of living and the remuneration men in other callings receive for their work. Clerks in shanties, and even uneducated boys of 18 and 20 years of age, engaged in running timber, are in receipt of much higher wages than the greater part of the Clergy in the country parts of the Diocese of Montreal.

The meeting closed with the adoption of the following resolution: "Resolved. That in the opinion of this meeting, Bishop's College, Lennoxville, has shown itself efficient in training men for Missionary work, and can easily be made fully adequate to meet the wants of the Dioceses of Quebec and Montreal, and that the establishment of a separate institution will be detrimental to the interests of the Church in the two Dioceses."

AYLWIN.

The Missionary, in presenting this report has the privilege to thank God in behalf of the people that, considering the many hindrances and disadvantages we have to encounter, we have made some sensible progress. Here in this Mission where seven years ago there was no Church building, we have now two Churches in which we can assemble to worship God in decency and order, and a third proposed and liberally subscribed for, in the township of Wright. This latter township is about to be formed into a separate Mission; Mrs. B. Hall, of Montmorenci, Quebec, having made a liberal proposal to furnish house, &c., for a clergyman; while Mr. B. Hall has offered the land for Church and School and Burying ground.

The congregation in Alleyn continues to merit its character of being a thoroughly hearty and liberal body of true Church men and women. The attendance on public worship, and the fair proportion of regular communicants on Sundays and Holy Days, combined with their exemplary lives, are indications, one may hope, that they are on the whole, striving through God's grace to "continue Christ's faithful soldiers and servants unto their lives end."

To the men, young and old, of this congregation the minister is deeply grateful for many personal acts of kindness, and for what he esteems more highly, their manifestation on many occasions of their strong and intelligent attachment to the Catholic Church planted in their midst.

At Aylwin we have now a decent and commodious House of Worship to gather in, which we hope will be consecrated to the service of God this coming autumn. To those who have aided us by their gifts and contributions to the new Church, the minister tenders hearty thanks. Amongst these during the past year, we number the Churchmen of Waterloo, Dunham, Frelighsburgh, West Farnham.

BERTHIER.

Rev. W. C. Merrick sends :—

The following particulars respecting the history of the Mission of Berthier, forming a record of interest for future reference, and respectfully offered for insertion in the Journal of Synod :—

Mission founded A.D., 1849; Church School opened 1851; Foundation Stone of Church laid 1852; Parsonage and Glebe purchased 1855; Endowment Fund started 1862; New Cemetery consecrated 1864; Land for Church and School purposes purchased 1866; Foundation Stone of School House laid 1867; Grammar School opened 1868; Parsonage Outbuildings finished 1873.

It is the prayer of many hearts here that these parochial foundations may long be permitted to promote the advancement of the Redeemer's Kingdom in the district.

Total amount raised for the various Church objects during the past year \$1005.05.

BOSCOBEL.

The Mission covers an area of 172 square miles—there are five places, where I have been endeavoring to keep up services—in two of them, monthly services, and in the other three, services every two weeks. During the winter I had to give up my two monthly services on account of the badness of the roads.

The congregation of All Saints Church, North Ely, has shown real life and zeal during the past year—the Church has been cleared of debt and consecrated. A sum of \$166.36 has been collected and paid since the last report was given of the work. The Church has been provided with a set of new lamps, and through the exertions of Mr. Joseph Davidson, people's Church warden, the subscriptions for the clergyman's salary have been made much better than in the past years, as the list will show.

The Parsonage has been finished down stairs except painting, and the hall upstairs. A stable has been built, and also some work has been done on the ground round the parsonage, &c., the money expended in all amounted to about \$400. There is a Church in progress at Boscobel which I expect to have completed during the present year. The people of Boscobel subscribed \$146 towards its erection, the rest of the money has to come from friends outside of the Mission who have given every encouragement to the enterprise.

The ladies of the congregation at Boscobel have gathered in about \$80 towards the purchase of a cottage organ for the new Church.

Miss Anna Mitchell gave \$6 towards painting two rooms in the parsonage. \$87 of the debt on the parsonage has been paid to Rev. A. L. Fortin, leaving a balance of \$26.86 yet due to him.

BOLTON.

Report of Rev. F. H. Clayton.—I feel thankful to Almighty God to be able to state, that the cause of the Church progresses cheerfully, and that the attendance and the support contributed towards the maintenance of her services, spring from a growing piety and conscientiousness.

The sums of money raised may appear small, but our people are poor, comparatively. There is a considerable debt upon the mission which has been lessened through the past year and if more substantial responses have not been given to the various demands of the Church, it is from lack not of will but of means.

At Bolton Centre a noble effort is being made to erect a Church at a cost of about fourteen hundred dollars, towards which many kind friends in Montreal and the adjoining parish of Knowlton, have liberally contributed, for which we feel sincerely grateful.

CHAMBLY.

I am thankful to be able to report many signs of a growing interest in holy things: larger congregations: more communicants: a larger Sunday School and Choir: and an increase in the Offertory of \$45.24, and although we have lost one who was always a liberal contributor, we have been able this year to collect a larger sum for missions than we have ever sent in since the parish became entirely self-supporting.

EDWARDSTOWN.

The Missionary writes :—

Some explanation appears necessary to account for the little done for the Mission Fund. The Missionary when in receipt of the usual £100 Stg. found difficulties enough in supplying wants, meeting expenses, and providing his own house. A reduction of salary made by the Synod would, of course, greatly increase those difficulties; the more so after a ministerial service of thirty years when health and strength must naturally begin to fail. Hitherto the advocacy of his own wants has been left to others placed last, or omitted altogether, but now necessity has obliged him to plead for himself, unbecoming though it be, and any thing but creditable to the Anglican Communion, and therefore to try to make up the deficiency by the people has been about as much as their efforts could accomplish. It should also be remembered, especially by those who legislate for the Church, that the Mission though old is nevertheless weak, and unable to effect much toward self-support. Of late years, members have been greatly reduced not through any ministerial neglect, but by the unsettled habits of our population and the desire to explore westward,—a state of things which begins to cast discouragement upon all Church work, and is utterly beyond any control from the clergy.

GRANBY.

The minister and churchwardens tender the following Report to the Synod of their labours for the past year.

Although we have not been able to remit to the Synod for the carrying on of its important work in this and other less favoured missions, we are deeply thankful to Almighty God and to those liberal members of our respective congregations who have enabled us to surmount all our local difficulties and to remit to the Mission Board an amount considerably in advance of any previous year and more than the sum we are assessed at : being \$105-25—St. George's, \$75.00; St. Peters, \$30.25; besides several special collections forwarded to the Treasurer for the same object.

The parsonage, after long years of debt and difficulty, has been fully completed as originally designed, at an additional expenditure of \$240.00, and

placed thereby in a condition of great durability. In the accomplishment of this object we have received large help from the ladies of St. George's sewing circle.

As this drain upon the energies and pecuniary resources of our people is now closed, we expect in future to be able to remit annually to the Mission Board even a much larger contribution than now reported.

This increase in our contributions has happily been effected, although we have to regret the loss of many valuable families and individuals who have left the Mission, and whose absence is painfully visible in our beautiful house of prayer.

HULL.

As soon as the people of this parish have recovered a little from the great disappointment they feel in losing the opportunity of securing a permanent endowment of six hundred dollars a year for *each* of the parishes of Hull and Aylmer by the act of placing the £600 Glebe money so that they could not purchase six acres of land joining Hull, generously offered for four hundred dollars an acre—the undersigned will gladly undertake to raise what money he can in the place for the Mission Fund.

We are now trying to meet church debt and interest, and are not in a position to do much at present.

I hope this fall to do much better.

IRON HILL.

The Rev. H. W. Nye reports that the past year has been one of material, and it is hoped also of spiritual progress in this mission. The Parsonage at Iron Hill has been completed (with the exception of painting) at a cost of about \$300.00. The Ladies Sewing Society has continued its labors without intermission to the great advantage of all concerned. The services at the Holy Trinity Church have been well attended both on the Lord's Day and on the other festivals. At West Brome, divine service is held in the school house, but measures have been initiated for the building of a church, which we hope to commence at an early day.

On the whole, we have every reason to "thank God and take courage."

KNOWLTON.

I am very thankful that Brome Mission has again been supplied with a missionary. There are a large number of stations included in this mission which reach in most cases those who have recently settled in the country and have gone on to new lands.

offertory collections; this system has been in operation for the last five years with success. In addition to the \$100 given to the Mission fund, there have been collections for the new diocese of Algoma, for the African diocese of the Niger, for the Jews, and for the Deaf and Dumb Institution.

In all there has been \$1168.10 collected during the past year.

LACOLLE.

The Rev. A. D. Lockhart reports that the work of the church has gone on as usual during the past year. The services have been well attended; also the evening service which is held in Lacolle on every alternate Sunday. The Missionary meeting held in February, at which his Lordship the Metropolitan was present, was one of the best we have ever had. The church was crowded in every part, some not being able to obtain seats, and the collection taken up on the occasion was a large increase over any previous year. Our church and parsonage are insured for \$2000, and during the present year we have been putting up new stables and carriage house, which will cost \$200.

MASCOUCHE.

During the past year, my predecessor, Rev. W. B. Longhurst, succeeded in providing a well finished paling fence for the frontage of the Parsonage and Glebe.

The frontage is between 400 and 500 ft. Grace church forms the boundary on the east side, and on the other is a commodious shed, 70 ft. long, so that the new fence gives quite a finish and completeness to the place.

At the Easter Vestry-meeting, a resolution was passed, that the full year's subscriptions should be paid up, and that the proportion for the two months when the cure was vacant should be allowed to remain in the hands of the Church Wardens, to be disposed of to best advantage.

In connection with the Endowment Fund of New Glasgow and Kilkenny, I propose that the interest on proceeds of Glebe and Parsonage be allowed to accumulate and be added to the fund, until a resident clergyman can be sent.

The Kilkenny people, feeling that the Mascouche clergyman cannot serve them punctually, intend to bestir themselves towards raising a respectable sum for the support of the church amongst them; and no doubt, if they make a resolute effort, they will succeed in raising the amount required.

MONTREAL.

Trinity Church.

The Rev. Canon Bancroft reports:

A special effort has been made during the past year to remove the floating debt of ten thousand dollars, which has been very successful. There

has been great unanimity, and a determination on the part of the Church Wardens and Finance Committee, with God's blessing, to put everything about the church into the highest state of efficiency.

We have to mark a quiet steady growth in the attendance of the congregation, the pew holders and the Sunday collections, and we trust also in the spiritual work of the church.

The Young Men's Association has proved so successful that we are organizing a Ladies Christian Association, from which the happiest results are anticipated.

The poor of the Parish have been well cared for, and all departments of the Church are in good working order.

For amounts raised we refer to the Synod Report. The total for the past year has been twenty thousand four hundred and forty-eight dollars, which includes twelve hundred dollars for the Theological College and sums contributed to various objects, including the Sabrevois Mission and Church Home, &c.

St. Thomas Church—Owing to very extensive repairs which were found necessary to render the Endowment property available as a source of revenue, was obliged to contract a large debt. This we are thankful to say has now been paid off by the efforts of the congregation and the contributions of several members of city churches, a list of whose names and subscriptions will be found on page 433 of this journal. The position and prospects of St. Thomas are considered to be very favourable—when it is remembered that the church was re-opened but seven years ago without either a congregation or Sunday School, and that now we have a very good attendance at the Sunday services and a Sunday School of 130 scholars. We believe that our progress has been very satisfactory, and that we have reason to "thank God."

NELSONVILLE.

The past year has been for us one of considerable progress; and to the Giver of all Good, who has disposed the hearts of His people to His service we owe a debt of gratitude. I trust our consciousness of this will be manifested in our zeal and devotion in the future.

Amongst the important undertakings we have had in hand has been the gathering in of our Parochial Endowment Fund. All of this which lay without the parish has been secured, and within the parish \$616.13 has been paid. We have given his Lordship the Metropolitan a mortgage on the Rectory building and land for the full amount we hope to realize, viz., \$1600.

The Rectory building is completed; and the work seems to be well done. I look upon the erection of this house as a very important provision for the comfort of the Incumbent. The land on which it stands, valued at \$200, was a donation from G. B. Baker, Esq., M.P.

Much has been done to rescue the Missisquoi High School from the discredit into which it had fallen. The average attendance of pupils during the past year was 54. I was enabled to expend \$120 in repairs, and \$30 in books and maps besides paying the ordinary expenses of the establishment. To Miss A. O'Halloran and Miss M. Vance much credit is due for valuable and gratuitous assistance. Mr. C. Benham, the late assistant master, has gone to the college at Sabrevois to study the French language. Mr. Cedric Cotton is second master at present, and is doing his work well.

At Adamsville measures have been taken for the erection of a church. George Adams, Esq., gives the site and \$500 towards the cost of the building; and George Abel Adams gives \$300 more.

The ladies of the congregation of Christ Church have been very successful in raising money for the purchase of a bell for that church. It is expected that they will soon have sufficient for their purpose, and that a want long felt will be supplied.

A new organ has been obtained for Trinity church through the exertions of the younger members of the congregation, and the ladies of Cowansville have paid for the erection of a good and substantial fence around the Rectory ground.

G. B. Baker, Esq., M.P., J. O'Halloran, Esq., Q.C., and A. E. Mitchell, Esq., have, on several occasions, generously given me important legal advice concerning parochial and school matters; and Drs. Browne and Cotton have, with like kindness, attended my family professionally free of charge.

SOREL.

The Rev. Canon Anderson reports:—

The past year in its financial aspect, has been one of very encouraging character in the face of greatly reduced numbers and of impoverished circumstances, the total amount raised in the parish from every source is very largely in excess of the very highest amount ever before reported from Sorel, even in its palmy days, reaching the high total for such a parish, of \$4,211. Some of the items, it is true, in this amount, are special, and exceptional, such as *ten Memorial Windows*, placed in the church, by as many different parties, at a cost of \$760, and also the large item for repairs. But apart from these, and from all its own heavy local expenditure, Sorel has given this year nearly \$450 to Home and Foreign Missions, and nearly \$700 to the Sustentation fund of the Diocese. It is however, but an act of simple justice to state that, under God, for these results, the parish, is this year as often before, specially indebted to some among the *female* members of the congregation. In the *Choir*, in the *Sunday School*, in the contributions to the *Sustentation*, *Mission*, and *repair* funds, *women*, specially two of them, occupy the very foremost ranks in self-sacrificing effort, in every work of faith and labour of love for Christ's name's sake. And among other such efforts the Parish is indebted to Mrs. Finlay, Mrs. Lunan and Mrs. Kittson, for originating, and to Mrs. R. Nelson and Miss Turner, for successfully conducting a movement to furnish, as they have handsomely done, both the chancel, and the vestry rooms of the church.

The retrospect of the year, in this parish, as a whole, again furnishes proof that the surest way of drawing down a blessing upon Parochial and Diocesan effort is to care for the souls of others, and, it is respectfully submitted, in the way and order of the Lord's own appointment. "To the *Jew first*,"—"*Beginning at Jerusalem*," then "preaching the Gospel to every creature." All experience makes it abundantly evident, that even for a poor and Missionary Diocese, the support of *Foreign Missions*, is not only a *duty* but a *privilege*, resulting in greater glory to God, and in greater blessedness to local and home effort.

STANBRIDGE EAST.

The Rev. I. Constantine writes thus ;—

Our annual Report is satisfactory this year, lacking, however, the final return of the Sidesmen appointed to collect the assessment to the Mission Fund. I trust their delay will be short. In other respects the work of the Church has gone on well, especially in spiritual matters.

Adults have been received in Holy Baptism, and a Confirmation has been held by the Bishop, at which ten persons were confirmed, a small number as to figures, but eminently satisfactory as to the character and standing of the recipients. Classes of preparation for Holy Communion have been held, and the number of communicants is increasing so much that more frequent than monthly celebrations will have to be instituted ere long.

Services, Sundays: Holy Communion, monthly; Morning Prayer and Ante-Communion on other Sundays in the morning; Litany and Sunday school in the afternoon. Evening service at 7 p.m. Full service on the greater Festivals. Special services in Advent and Lent. Daily Evening Prayer during the summer season.

Amount raised in Mission, exclusive of Mission Fund Assessment, \$462.70.

SUTTON.

The Rev. J. Smith writes:—It is gratifying to report that All Saints Church, Abercorn, so seriously injured by the weather, has been repaired. Upwards of \$500 have been expended on repairs and improvements. The senior warden, B. Seaton, Esq., and Mr. A. Nield, have superintended the whole; and have made such improvements, it is hoped, as will prevent the building sustaining further injury. The members of the congregation have met this unexpected outlay promptly and generously. Our thanks are due to Mrs. R. J. Fowler of Montreal for the kind interest she has manifested in our work by collecting for us the sum of \$100, a very timely aid. We have also thankfully to acknowledge a gift of 50 volumes from the Cathedral Sunday school through Mrs. Fowler. A few young ladies of Grace Church have formed themselves into an Association for Church work. They have already purchased a neat stone font.

ST. ANDREW'S.

Archdeacon Lonsdell writes:—

The sum of \$750 has been raised in the parish for the repairs of the Church. This, with the one hundred and fifty collected for the Sustentation Fund, will account for the falling off in the subscriptions for Missionary purposes. The \$750 collected for repairs is included in the "amount raised for local and general purposes." A few kind friends in Montreal have given us \$50. We hope others may be induced to follow their good example as it will require our best exertions to carry out the very necessary repairs of our Church.

ST. JOHN'S, P.Q.

The Rector, (Rev. H. F. Darnell), reports increased efforts during the past two years for the improvement of the Church premises, and a satisfactory growth in the attendance upon the means of grace. In addition to extensive repairs both to the church and rectory, a new organ (cost \$1100 including setting up), manufactured by Mr. Warren of Montreal, has been procured, giving general satisfaction to the congregation and adding much to the warmth and solemnity of the services. These works are the more creditable, as, with the exception of a few donations from persons formerly connected with the parish, they have been effected solely by the zeal and liberality of the members of the congregation. Several further improvements are meditated, and there appears to be a general desire on the part of the people to render both their church and its services in every respect suitable to the growing importance and prosperity of the town. It is satisfactory to find that, notwithstanding the heavy demands upon the parish in connection with the above mentioned efforts, the contributions for the external work of the church have not fallen short.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL.

The change of the Reformatory Prison into a Penitentiary for the Province of Quebec has offered a temporary change for the worse in regard to subscriptions and collections during the present year. It is to be hoped that a larger amount will in future be raised than formerly, there being now a few more Protestant families, who will doubtless avail themselves of the privilege of contributing to funds for Missionary and other religious and benevolent purposes.

In addition to the two services for the prisoners, there is now an additional service for the officers and families of the Penitentiary, who assemble in the Penitentiary chapel at 3.15 p.m.

An attempt will be made on some week day to instruct the children, that there may be in this place as full a church organization and church teaching as is possible under the peculiar circumstances.

St. Michael's Church, Terrebonne.

The yearly accounts and reports being now required by the end of May, this report is for the eleven months commencing last July.

The average attendance for that period has been 21½, the number of services being 45, and the average number of communicants 7.

On four occasions the weather would not admit of my travelling to hold service, two of which were Communion days.

The collections, considering the small number composing the congregation, may be regarded as very fair. The sum of \$10 has been raised for the Mission Fund, Widows' and Orphans' Fund \$1.55, Superannuation Fund \$1.62, Foreign Missions \$2.90, Sustentation Fund \$11, and Bishop's College, Lennoxville, \$1.58, to which may be added \$2.46 for clergyman at Christmas, and \$1.30 for Expenses to Synod. With a more systematic collection for the Mission Fund, I feel that the subscription would be materially increased.

An attempt was made to give Sunday school instruction, but signally failed, owing to the very small number of children.

UPTON.

In a small country mission such as this is, very little can be expected that would be interesting in the general acceptance of the word.

As heretofore this Mission remains connected with that of Acton, Diocese of Quebec. The advantage of this connection arises from the proximity of the two missions to each other, the distance between being only 6 miles, and at present the road is much superior to what it was a few years ago, when one had to steer through stumps and stones and holes of various dimensions, or travel by another road which was five miles longer.

During the year morning and evening service was held alternately on Sundays at the two churches.

Before the connection of these two missions, the clergyman came only every second Sunday. He then held two services, but it is evident to all that one service held each Sunday is preferable to two services held every second Sunday.

As the French population predominates in these parts the congregation could not be expected to be a large one, and in fact it consists of but four teen families; however, for a country mission, it can be called a compact one, as with the exception of one family, all live taking the church as the centre, within the radius of three quarters of a mile. They contribute also \$150 towards yearly stipend of clergyman. On the whole, our progress has been satisfactory, and though our prospects are not brilliant they are not discouraging. The people appear to value instruction and the ministrations of religion.

husbandman, and we only need faith and a loving liberality to go in and occupy the land. Financially we have carried out the plan of taking only \$100 of the \$365 from the C. T. F., leaving the remainder for the use of the Mission Fund. I hope in a year or so, to leave it all. The Parish has also made up its amount of \$120 for the same fund. In other matters of experience I trust and think we are learning as we have freely received to freely give.
