**PASTORAL ADDRESS.**

**DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN.**—Before bringing our Annual Conference to a termination, we desire to address a few words to you in our pastoral communication. The intimate, spiritual, relation that exists between the ministers of Christ and his Church, is designed to create a feeling of christian fellowship that time itself cannot dissolve; and which we believe will be greatly heightened in the spirit world. There we hope to see the King in his glory, and unite with the redeemed in ascribing "salvation to God and the Lamb."

In this probationary state we are all subject to temptations

and trials, but in heaven there will be none of these; neither sorrow nor crying, for the former things will have passed away. Death will be swallowed up in victory. For this blessed state of felicity we should strive together in our prayers, and while the ministers of the Gospel labor day and night with all diligence for the conversion of sinners, and the spiritual elevation of the membership, the societies should hold up their hands by their prayers, their sympathies and hearty co-operation.

The past year has been a period of great rejoicing on many of our charges. Souls have been converted to God, believers have been enabled to shout for joy, while many have professed to enjoy the sanctifying grace of God in their hearts.

The sphere of our operations is enlarging—new fields are opening up north and west of us, and we think that we should, as a Christian Church, send missionaries into every open door, so far as the people will supply us with the means.

The various institutions of our connection demand the prayerful attention of our people, especially our missionary work. The emigrants are calling for our ministrations. They approve of our system of Church Government and usages.—They esteem our missionaries very highly for their work's sake, and although many of these people are now poor and living in their log cabins, the day is not far distant when they will be able to assist in sending the gospel to the regions beyond them. Industry, sobriety, and economy are the legitimate fruits of Gospel truth, as well as love to God and all mankind. The past year our missionaries have been eminently useful, and this gives us hope for future success. We have taken up new and import fields, where we trust it may yet be said in the language of the prophet: "The wilderness and the solitary place shall be glad, for them and the desert shall rejoice and blossom as the rose. It shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice even with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given unto it, the excellency of Carmel and Sharon, they shall see the glory of the Lord, and the excellency of our God."

Many of the old circuits during the past conference year have shared largely in religious revivals, and, as is generally the case under a sound religious influence, large sums have been contributed for the regular work. The institution of Sabbath schools we commend to your prayerful attention. These constitute the nursery of the Church. The susceptible minds of the young are here furnished with instruction calculated to train them in the way they should go. Let our efforts and our prayers be energetic and continuous.

The blessing of Almighty God has attended the efforts put forth by our people during the past year, so that in the Sabbath-school returns a number of scholars have been reported as savingly converted to God. To his name be all the glory.

The cause of temperance still calls for our cordial co-operation in our endeavors to extend its beneficial influences. Let us manfully grapple with this gigantic enemy, resolving never to give up the conflict until victory crowns our efforts.

It rejoices our hearts to be able to report a large addition to our church property during the conference year now closing. This is the more pleasing as it tends to give us a permanent standing in our country. It is very pleasing to us to be able to report a respectable increase in our membership; 834 are returned as the net increase of the year. This demands a tribute of praise and thanksgiving to our Divine Master for the blessings attending our efforts to promote the interests of his kingdom.

Permit us to exhort you to diligence in all the duties devolving upon you; but more particularly to your closet and family worship, also to all the public means of grace; by so doing you will not only insure peace and prosperity to your own souls, but will also aid in spreading scriptural holiness throughout the land.

Our present annual gathering has been one of unusual harmony and brotherly affection, in all our deliberations, and our devotional exercises, both public and domestic, have been seasons of refreshing; and we are encouraged to continue "our work of faith and labor of love" to the end.



And now, dear brethren, in conclusion receive our annual greetings. We are about to separate and go to our respective fields of labor, we trust we are coming to you in the name and spirit of our Master. Pray for us that the word spoken by us may be productive of fruit in abundance to the honor and glory of the God we serve. And may the grace and love of God be our portion now and ever. Amen.

1. *Resolved*, That the Sabbath School is the nursery of the Church; and that Christian labor devoted in that direction yields a greater percentage than the same labor bestowed in any other department of the Church.

2. *Resolved*, That whereas we believe ministerial labor in connection with Sabbath Schools to be of the utmost importance. In the opinion of this Conference greater efforts should be put forth in that direction.

3. *Resolved*, That in the opinion of this Conference, denominational Sabbath Schools are productive of more good than Union Sabbath Schools; and that this Conference recommends the organisation of denominational Sabbath Schools, in connection with our Church, wherever it is any way practicable.

Your Committee would recommend that the Chatechism now used in the Sabbath Schools of the M. E. Church, in the U. S., be introduced into our Sabbath Schools, as far as practicable.

And whereas, we as a Church feel the need of a permanent organisation, by which our interest and efforts may be united in every part of our work. Your Committee would recommend the following resolution.

**BARNEY MARKLE** was converted to God, through the instrumentality of the Rev. G. Ferguson, and united with the M. E. Church, several years before the Union of 1833. He was appointed leader of the class at Beverly; and also received license to "call sinners to repentance," yet refused to go with the Union of 1833, and was among the *few* in the vicinity, at this time, who were born to God in the M. E. Church, and wished to continue in it—hence they "caught the falling banner and bore it along. Br. Markle immediately opened his house for preaching; where, for several years, the servants of Christ "preached the Word" with success. In 1839, the year of ("Centenary of Methodism,) Br. Markle was received on trial in the "Annual Conference of the M. E. Church in Canada," and received Ordination as Deacon, and Elder, in due time. While at much personal sacrifice, he traveled the following Circuits, viz: Niagara, Barton, Duffries, Thames, Malahide, Blenheim, Norwich, &c. #### PASTORAL ADDRESS

To the Members of the METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH in Canada, within the bounds of the Bay of Quinte Conference.

Grace be unto you, and peace from God, our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

After the labors of another Conference year, we are permitted to assemble in our Annual Conference. We shall soon separate to go to our respective fields of labor, strengthened, we trust, by the councils of our brethren to labor among you with increased ardor in the cause of our Saviour, and with increased devotion to it.

We met, united by the bonds of our holy religion—we part reluctantly, and with unabated affection for each other.—Again has the angel of death been restrained; not one of our number has been smitten by him, for which we acknowledge the greatness of the Divine mercy, and humbly adore the Hand that has preserved us. Blessed with health and strength, sustained by Divine grace, and prospered in our work—let us unite in the Hosannahs ascribed to God and the Lamb, and acknowledge Him in all our ways.

The past year, like those preceding, has been characterised by conflicts and toils, yet great prosperity has attended our labors on many parts of our work. Hundreds of souls have been converted to God, and scriptural holiness has spread among us. These manifestations of the approbation of God fill us with gratitude, and inspire us with a hope that yet greater things are in store for us, for if God works, who shall hinder? We, therefore, re-consecrate ourselves to the work of the Gospel, with a resolve to more assiduously apply ourselves, and to rest upon the promises of God with increased assurance of ultimate success. And not only has God been pleased to refresh the Circuits, in general, with the most gracious effusions of the Holy Spirit, resulting in an increase of 544 members within the bounds of this Conference; but we have been enabled to carry the glad tidings of salvation into the more remote parts of our country, so that those destitute of the Gospel have been made glad, and praise has ascended from many hearts for the gift of the water of life through our instrumentality.



We have seen the borders of Zion extended—altars to Christ erected, and communities hitherto beyond, now enclosed within the boundaries of the Church. Nor is the work yet fully accomplished. Much yet remains to be done, and it gladdens our hearts to see the Providence of God opening up new fields of labor, and inviting our occupation.

Permit us now, Brethren, to call your attention to the various interests of the Church which demand your unwavering support. These are,

1st.—*The Cause of Missions.*

Brethren, the men for this work are not wanting—they are ready to buckle on the armour of our Prince, and go forth to do his bidding. It remains for you to say whether you will sustain them. You have done nobly during the past year, cease not to respond to the call made upon you to sustain this department of the Church. “Ye are my witnesses saith the Lord.” Are you prepared to do the work of Christ’s Church in the spreading of His glory in the dissemination of gospel light? “Arise, let your light shine,” sustain the cause of missions that the “wilderness may be turned into standing water, and the dry ground into water springs.” Let this great proof of the aggressive character of the Church and of its primitive spirit be warmly supported. You cannot remain spiritual and cease to be aggressive. In all ages of the history of the Church its missionary spirit has been a fair measure of union with Christ. From the rivers to the ends of the earth the sound must go forth. Let the spirit of your Divine Master, who would have all nations hear His gospel, prompt you to increased liberality; and while you give of the means with which God blesses you, let your prayers be unceasing that every missionary effort may be properly directed.

2nd.—*An adequate support for your Ministers*

The success of the past year is an assurance that our “labor” has not been “in vain in the Lord;” therefore, Brethren, we call upon you to sustain your Ministers, who are your servants for the gospel’s sake. If the “laborer is worthy of his hire,” and if “they who preach the gospel,” are to “live of the gospel,” is it not emphatically your duty to see that their temporal wants are not embarrassing, nor their lives embittered by cares that should never oppress them. Would you have your Ministers “abounding in the work of the Lord,” see that their necessities do not call them into secular pursuits. Glorify God by preventing obstructions to the usefulness of the Ministers of His Gospel.
