LONDON, Eng.—The passing of Mr. Borah's amendment to the naval appropriation bill in the United States House of Representatives has given rise to expressions of great satisfaction in both official and unofficial circles in London. A higher authority on foreign affairs vouchsafes the opinion that the adoption of this amendment, authorising and requesting the President to invite British and Japanese representatives to a conference on the limitation of armaments, may prove to be a step of utmost importance. The proceedings of the Imperial conference have recently been veiled in secrecy, and considerable comment has arisen from the announcement in the Times that the Lord Chancellor expressed the opinion that the Angle-Japanese Treaty automatically continues for one year, even if denounced this menth.






