


It appears from the report of M. Klotz, the minister of finances, that the present copper coins were condemned some years ago as the result of an official investigation, objection being made on the grounds of their lack of cleanliness, heavy weight and facility of oxidation. At a subsequent date a special commission considered the practicability of replacing the copper coins with aluminum but these latter were reported upon unfavorably.

latter were reported upon unfavorably.

In June 1911 the then minister of finances appointed a further commission which after a prolonged investigation made a report that was not considered satisfactory, whereupon M. Rene Besnard, the under-secretary of state for finances, took the matter up. Various experts and others interested were consulted and the use of perforated nickel pieces instead of coins with a single hole in the centre was advised on the grounds of the prejudice of the French public to the latter.

It is estimated that some 80,000,000 of francs worth of new nickel coins will shortly be issued of the value of 5, 10 and 25 centimes each, the old copper coins being withdrawn as fast as the new pieces are put into circulation. The old issue consists of 7,000,000 of francs worth of copper coins and 10,00,000 francs worth of copper coins and 10,00,000 francs worth of 25 centime pieces in sickel.






