

West Indies North Coast of Cub — Establishment of a Light is shown since June 1st, on Rencheria Point on the western shore of Cayo de Hiccacal, to the eastward of the Boca de Sagua.

It is a red painted pole 112 feet from the shore, 157 feet above 1bw water, 46 feet above the ground, and can be seen, in the ordinary state of the atmosphere, 8½ miles. It is to lead ships drawing less than 3½ feet, into the Boca de Sagua, and to indicate a refuge in bad weather for ships intending to enter through the Boca de Marillanes.

The keeper's quadrangular dwellinz, built of bick, has a flat roof, through the centre of which the above pole runs. To the ensuward of the house are six fishing huts, five of which are of palms and boards.

In steering for the Boca de Sagua, which is 16 miles in width, vessels must keep within the sector of light embracing an arc of 96 decrees between the bearings S 47 deg W, and S 49 deg B from the ship.
