#### MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING

The Twenty-first Annual Meeting of the Congregation was held in the Church, on Wednesday, 31st January, 1900.

The Rev. A. L. Geggie, Pastor, opened the meeting with devotional exercises.

Mr. E. W. Day was appointed Secretary. Minutes of last Annual Meeting were taken as read and approved.

Mr. Gall read the report of the Session, and upon motion it was adopted.

. Mr. Geggie having requested the meeting to appoint a Chairman in his place, Major Carlaw was chosen.

The Poor Fund report was read by Mr. Nicholson and adopted.

Mr. Winchester moved, seconded by Mr. Wilson, and it was resolved, that the open collections taken at the Communion services be paid to the Session as heretofore, and be used by them for the following purposes: (1) Communion and Session expenses; (2) Poor Fund, and (3) for such other purposes as the Session may consider proper in the interests of the Church.

Upon the motion of Mr. Mackenzie, seconded by Mr. Laurie, the Poor Fund obligation of the Board of Managers to the Session was cancelled.

Mr. Gall moved, seconded by Mr. Laurie, and it was resolved, that the various reports of the Societies in connection with the congregation as revised by the Session's Committee on Reports, together with the Minutes of this Meeting, be printed in the Annual Report by the Managers.

Dr. Clemens having sent in his resignation as a Manager, it was upon motion reluctantly accepted.

The Managers' Report was received and adopted upon motion.

A motion of Mr. Asher, seconded by Mr. Wilson, that \$100 be added to the estimates for Sunday School singing instructions was lost.

#### SESSION REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS:

In the multitude of God's tender mercies, as a Church, we have been brought to the close of another year. Mixed experiences have been our lot, but in cloud and sunshine God has been with us.

Early in the year the Rev. D. C. Hossack, who had been our Pastor since 18th April, 1893, felt it to be his duty to sever the pastoral tie on account of ill-health, and tendered his resignation to the Presbytery on the 7th March, 1899, but in answer to the plea of the congregation he permitted his resignation to remain in abeyance for six months. However, on the 4th July, the acceptance of his resignation being pressed for, the Presbytery reluctantly agreed to accept it and the Church was on the 16th July declared vacant. Rev. L. H. Jordan, Pastor of St. James' Square Church, was appointed by the Presbytery, Moderator of Session during the leave of absence and subsequent vacancy.

The congregation at a meeting duly called, appointed a committee of supply and authorized them to engage a Minister to take oversight of the Congregation, in addition to the providing for the Sabbath services. The Committee appointed Rev. Robert Leask, one of our members, for this work, and it is gratifying to testify to the faithfulness with which he performed the services required of him.

On the 5th September the Presbytery permitted the Moderator of Session to moderate in a Call, and on the evening of the 18th Sept. a Call was unanimously extended to the Rev. Andrew Logan Geggie, Minister of St. Paul's Church, Truro, N.S. This call, signed by 609 members and 158 adherents, was presented to the Toronto Presbytery at a special meeting called for the purpose, and held on the 29th September, and was there cordially sustained.

On the 7th November Mr. Geggie having accepted the call was duly inducted into this charge by the Moderator and mem-

bers of Presbytery. The Call was made by the congregation after much prayer for spiritual guidance and direction, and the Session have every reason to believe that the selection was so made by the congregation and accepted by Mr. Geggie under the inspiration of Divine Providence.

Notwithstanding the vacancy the membership of the congregation has not suffered during the year.

During the year 15 members of the congregation were removed by death, of whom five were in full communion. Two members of the Session have in this way suffered severe affliction and bereavement; Mr. John Winchester in the death of a beloved wife, and Mr. Alex. Duff in the death of a beloved son. Our late Pastor, Rev. D. C. Hossack, has also been greatly bereaved in the death of a beloved mother. With these brethren, and with other sorrowing friends in the congregation, who mourn the loss of loved ones, the Session sincerely sympathize and trust that the Divine promises may sustain and comfort them

Fifteen children and two adults received the rite of baptism during the year.

The Communion of the Lord's Supper was dispensed four times during the year, at all of which there was a large attendance.

The Session regret that they have again to call attention to the fact that the Schemes of the Church have not been maintained as they should have been. The attention of the congregation is specially directed to the report of the Missionary Committee on this subject.

The Session desire to recognize the faithful work done in the Sabbath School and Bible Class, and to call attention with extreme thankfulness to the erection and opening of the new Sabbath School. The desire of the Session is, that with greater facilities for the carrying on the work among the children of the flock, the result will be the ingathering of many souls unto Christ and into the Church. The Session would encourage and heartily commend to the prayerful sympathy and support of the congregation the faithful Teachers and Officers of the School in their important and responsible work.

The thanks of the Session are cordially given to those ladies and gentlemen who have greatly aided the Service of Praise in the sanctuary by their voluntary and helpful service in leading this part of Divine worship.

A word as to the Managers: They have many responsibilities in connection with the office they fill; they are men who have the welfare of the congregation at heart, and are giving much time and thought to its interests, and we bespeak for them the cordial and loyal co-operation of every member of the congregation. There are great financial responsibilities resting on the Church, but if each member and adherent will conscientiously do all in his or her power there will be no difficulty. God has wonderfully blessed us in the past in this repect and we are assured He will continue to bless us in the future.

At the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, held in Hamilton in June, 1899; the greatest and noblest work our Church has engaged in during the Nineteenth Century, was undertaken; namely, the raising of a million dollars for the purp.ses of the Missionary, Educational, Benevolent, and Home work of the Church: \$600,000 is to go to the Common Fund, or Missionary, Educational, and Benevolent work; and \$400,000 to the Debt Fund. In consequence of our circumstances during the past year nothing has been done by the Session towards this work. Early in the year 1900 the Session purposes to enter upon this great campaign with energy, feeling confident that the congregation will not only do their duty nobly by giving liberally of their means, but that they will also reap richest blessings in doing so.

In conclusion, we are now entering upon the last year of the 19th Century. From far and near the cry comes rising up to the ears of Him to whom no heart ever cries in vain

#### **Board of Managers Report**

It is a source of satisfaction to your Board, to be able to state that although beginning the financial year with a deficit of some \$400, they have discharged that liability, have provided for the ordinary expenses of the congregation, and the Report of the Treasurer, hereto annexed, will show, that excepting a small amount owing to that officer, we meet the new year with a comparatively clean sheet.

The amount contributed for ordinary purposes was the least since 1892, being below the \$6,000 mark, which may be taken as a fair average for this congregation. There was however, \$1,000 inserted in the Estimates for S. S. Extension last year, which may fairly be called an extra, and which has been mostly secured and paid over to the Treasurer of that Fund.

the least be taken lowever, st year, mostly With the new year come new responsibilities. We had to increase our Mortgage in connection with the building of the Sunday School, thereby increasing our interest charge by \$275. One of the conditions upon which the Presbytery sanctioned the new loan, was that we pay \$1,000 upon the principal annually. The Estimates submitted to you, which have been very carefully considered, provide as you will see, for the payment of both these sums, and aim 11 keeping our ordinary expenditure at \$6,700 for the year 1900.

With the increased accommodation you now have, and in the present circumstances of this congregation, there should be no-difficulty in raising this amount, and the Board has every confidence, that through your liberality it will be enabled to discharge in full the liabilities accruing for the current year.

It appears from the Envelope Secretary's Report that there are 256 contributors on his book. As we have 275 families, and some families have three and four contributors, it is evident that a number of families are not contributing by envelope. We would strongly urge that every seatholder should appear as an envelope contributor, and that some action should be taken to secure that result.

The seating capacity of the body of the Church is almost entirely allotted. There are some pewholders, however, having sittings in excess of the number of their families. In such cases it will be necessary to allot such spare sittings to applicants in order that all may, as far as possible, be accommodated.

The following members retire this year but are eligible for election: Messrs. Milne, Laurie, Bryce, Dods, Hooey, and new members in place of Messrs. Little, Spriggs, Palmer, removed.

## REPORT OF MISSION COMMITTEE

Last year most regretfully we drew the attention of the congregation to the fact that our congregational contributions to the different Schemes of the Church had fallen most seriously below the contributions of previous years. What can we say when we have this year to announce that the contributions are little over half of what they were last year? We need only refer to this fact to cause searchings of heart amongst the many faithful who are seeking in some measure to do His will in their lives. While deploring the apparent lack of vital interest in the Schemes of the Church, we are not unmindful of the drain on your liberality caused by the building of our new Sunday School premises. And yet these things ought we to have done and not have left the other things undone.

A very small percentage of the membership of the con-

gregation are seemingly interested in this department of the Church's work. Of the amount contributed for the Missions and other Schemes of our Church (some \$500 in all), \$341.86 were contributed by 22 members and families in the congregation, leaving a balance of \$150 to be accounted for by the liberalities of the rest of our large and prosperous congregation. We feel keenly the necessity of having to state ourselves as we do, but the situation shames us, and especially when we compare ourselves with the liberality of other congregations in our Presbytery, less able than we are to help on the work of the Lord at home and abroad. We have this confidence, however, that when the situation is fairly grasped and understood by you that you will unite in a more general and generous response to the appeal, not of your Committee but of the Lord Jesus Himself, who said "Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature."

If we had any suggestion to offer, it would be that the congregation contribute as members rather than as heads of families. We have only about 90 subscribers to the aforesaid funds, which gives us about 12 per cent of our actual membership, contributing to the various schemes. As, however, many who contribute, are heads of families, a larger percentage may be acknowledged. And yet the percentage thus recognizing their obligations is not large enough to remove the feelings of regret that the necessity is laid on us to thus present to the congregation this appeal. We would urge on all the members and adherents of the congregation to consider their obligations to the Lord in this department of our congregational responsibility, and endeavor, by the help of God, to come up to the help

of the Lord against the mighty.

The Presbyterian Church has a record to maintain in this department of Christian activity. She is second to none among the larger denominations of the Christian Church, in fact, is easily first in her interest in Home and Foreign Missions. We must do our duty in maintaining that record, aye, we must in this age of unfolding opportunities do more than maintain our reputation, we must try and outstrip past achieve-

Your Committee have much pleasure in reporting that with the help of the Great Head of the Church they have been enabled to erect a beautiful and commodious Sunday School without accident of any kind.

The corner-stone was laid by the Chairman of your Committee on the 10th day of June 1899, and the building was occupied by the scholars on the 19th November last, when it was opened by our Pastor the Rev. A. L. Geggie and others. It is a substantial white brick building in keeping with the Church, and adds much to the appearance of the Church property. There are also large and spacious halls, which not only act as an outlet for the School, but are so arranged as to be used in connection with the Church. There is also a large basement fully equipped with kitchen and all necessary appliances to meet the social requirements of the congregation.

The construction of the building cost \$13,355.16, while the fixtures, etc. amount to \$1,004.81, making together a total cost of \$14,359.97. To meet this expense a sum of \$5,500 was raised by increasing the mortgage debt upon the Church property by that amount and \$4,356.37 was paid by contributions, etc., leaving a sum of \$4,503.60 to be raised by the congregation immediately. Towards this sum \$875 has been subscribed and the balance of \$3,628.60 is now asked for.

Your Committee desire to return their thanks to the congregation for their valuable assistance, financial and otherwise cordially extended, and hope that the same interest will be shown the Managers in aiding them to pay off the balance due and in reducing the mortgage debt.
