DIPLOMATIC APPOINTMENTS

The Right Honourable Joe Clark, Secretary of State for External Affairs, announces the following diplomatic appointments:

Mr. Reginald H. Dorrett (54), born in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan as Ambassador to Korea.

Mr. Dorrett [B.A., University of Saskatchewan, 1953; Certificate of Public Administration, Regina College, 1957; Certificate of Business Administration, Regina College, 1958] joined the Department of Trade and Commerce in 1970. He has served abroad in Düsseldorf, Jakarta and Tokyo. In Ottawa, from 1978 to 1979, he was Director, Operations (Trade Commissioner Service); from 1979 to 1981, Secretary, Sub-Committee on Foreign Operations; and from 1981 to 1982, Assistant Under-Secretary, International Marketing Policy Group. Since 1983, he has been Ambassador to the Phillipines. Mr. Dorrett replaces Mr. D.W. Campbell who has returned to Ottawa.

Mr. Robert Elliott (57), born in Regina, Saskatchewan, as Ambassador to Hungary.

Mr. Elliott [B.A., University of Saskatchewan, 1949] joined the Department of External Affairs in 1956. He has served abroad in Beirut, London and Lagos. From 1973 to 1976, he was Ambassador to Algiers; from 1976 to 1980, Minister, Paris; and from 1980 to 1983, Ambassador to Egypt. Since 1983, he has been Director General, Middle East. Mr. Elliott replaces Mr. T.C. Arcand who has returned to Ottawa.
