nickel can probably be bought for 25 cents or less. Specimens of wrought and forged nickel were exhibited by Mr. Wharton at the Philadelphia Exhibition in 1876. The metal was discovered in 1751, but had seldom been seen in its pure state until Mr. Wharton took hold of it. The use of nickel as an alloy of steel gave it great economic importance. The compound is tougher and much more ductile and elastic than steel itself, and does not rust under water. English metallurgists employed it in the manufacture of gun barrels, but the real credit of "bringing out" nickel steel belongs to the Navy Department at Wash-ington. The experiments with armor plates instituted by Mr. Tracy soon attracted at-tention in England. At first the English ordnance experts were disposed to pooh-pooh the extraordinary results obtained at the Indian Head proving grounds, but last year the Admiralty virtually admitted that Mr. Tracy had taught it something -a confession not often made by that body.
