The Strikers Making an Attack on Non-Union Men Working in the Colorado Mine—Three Killed. Leadville, Col., Sept. 21.—Leadville was a battle ground to-day, and the Colorado mine was the scene of a desperate engagement between strikers and the 20 men who were working in and living at the mine.

At the El Paso also the men were attacked by strikers but they were not shot and sought cover under the bushes close by. Here they were snatched by the strikers, but the latter did not come near the property, contenting themselves with firing about 100 shots into the shaft house.
