DO YOU KNOW THIS DEAD MAN

Unidentified Body of Suicide Found in High Park is at the Morgue.

CARBOLIC ACID WAS MEANS USED When Discovered by Policeman Body Was Still Warm, But Life Extinct.

By his own hand a stranger died in High Park yesterday. He was dead when a policeman found the body, and carbolic acid was the means employed for his self-destruction.

The body was still warm, and Dr. Griffiths was summoned. Hope that prompt measures might avail to save his life, but to no purpose.

When the unfortunate man's clothes were searched there was found only a Roman Catholic prayer book and two \$5 bills. There was no clue to his identity beyond a silver plate in his hat with the initials "S. V. W."

An inquest will be held by Coroner McConnell at No. 6 Police Station to-day.

Description of the Body. At a West Queen-street drug store, where he purchased the fluid, he signed "James McKeen, 40 Lakeshore-st." The name and address were fictitious, as on inquiry by the police it was found he was unknown there.

The dead man is about 30 years of age, and has the appearance of a mechanic. The fact that he had an amount of money in his pockets, and from the general appearance of his clothes, it would seem that he was in at least fairly good circumstances.

He was of medium height, clean shaven, dark-complexioned and of medium proportions. An expired railroad ticket good from Toronto to Hastings, and a baggage check were also found in one of his pockets. The body is at the Morgue.

LEONARD SUCCEEDS TAIT. Montreal, April 14.—The announcement of the appointment of J. W. Leonard, superintendent of the Canadian Pacific Railway at Winnipeg, as manager of transportation to succeed Thomas Tait, will be made at the end of the present week.
