FOR RECIPROCITY WITH CUBANS**

Theodore Roosevelt Presents His Message to the Extra-Ordinary Session of Congress—Forecast for Canada.

Washington, Nov. 10.—(Genate.)—Today's session of the Senate was devoted exclusively to the reading of the President's message in support of reciprocity with Cuba.

The President's message says: "I have convened the Congress at this time to put into operation the commercial treaty with Cuba, which was ratified by the Senate at its last session, and subsequently by the Cuban government. I deem such legislation demanded not only by my interest but by our honor. We cannot with propriety abandon the course upon which we have so wisely embarked. When the acceptance of the Platt amendment was required from Cuba by the action of the Congress of the United States, this government thereby definitely committed itself to the policy of treating Cuba as occupying a unique position as regards this country. It was provided that when the island republic should stand in such close relations with us as to require international policy, and it necessarily followed that she must also be treated as a republic within the lines of our economic policy.

Situated as Cuba is, it would not permit the strategic abuse of the island by any foreign military power. We must therefore impose upon her financial policy, and that naval stations have been ceded by her to the United States. The negotiations as to the details of these matters have been completed.
