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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "The Ontario Rifle Association."
2. That the membership fee be \$1 per annum, and that all memberships be paid at that rate.
3. A donor of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as a life member of the Association.
4. Associations shall pay \$5 per annum for the privilege of affiliation, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, entitling an Association to a badge, and to free entrance for Team Prizes in the Affiliated Associations Match.
5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council. The Lieut.-Governor of the Province of Ontario, for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
6. There shall be a President.
7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents,—one for each Military District.
8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows :
 - 1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected primarily at this meeting, and hereafter at the annual meeting.
 - 2nd. The ex-Presidents of the Association.
 - 3rd. The District Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia for Ontario.
 - 4th. The Brigade Majors of Militia for Ontario.
 - 5th. The Presidents of local Affiliated Associations and Clubs, being members of the Association.Five of whom shall form a quorum; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

9. Members of the Council may be represented at its meetings by written proxies, containing limited or full powers as may be expressed therein

Such proxies to be held by members of the Association only, the signature to be duly witnessed, and no member to hold more than one proxy.

10. The Council shall choose from its members the President of the Association.

11. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such districts, and who shall be elected by the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any case altered, nor new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

15. The annual prize meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

16 the prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.

17. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

18. There shall be an annual meeting, to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

19. No change
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19. No change shall be made in the Constitution except at the annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been sent to the Secretary three months previously, and also posted on the Bulletin Board at the opening of the annual matches.

BY-LAWS.

The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto on the second day of the Annual Match.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of all members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure for sums of current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

REPORT OF COUNCIL OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

1879.

In submitting their Report of the proceedings of the Association for 1879, your Council have great pleasure in recording the entire success of the Prize Meeting, which, being favoured with good weather, an increased prize list, and a painstaking staff, proved perhaps the most satisfactory competition ever held under its auspices.

Owing to the close proximity of the Exhibition Buildings, and the number of boats passing in front of the ranges to and from them, it was deemed prudent to raise and extend the background in rear of the targets. This, with the assistance of a grant from the Militia Department, was accomplished before the matches were held, and was the means of greatly improving the ranges for shooting purposes, as well as enabling us to put up three additional targets, still leaving room for two more if required.

Besides the ordinary matches, an "Extra Series" was again put on the list; but, though still very popular with competitors, a great difficulty was found in procuring a sufficient number of prizes, consequently one series (500 yards) could only be offered. For this match your Council beg to thankfully acknowledge the following donations:

The "Grand Aggregate" was divided into three series; to the first of which His Excellency the Governor General, immediately on his arrival in Canada, announced his desire to contribute a silver and a bronze medal; and your Council feel they have the support of every marksman in the Province in heartily thanking His Excellency for his generosity, and for the encouragement given to the cause of rifle shooting through the interest thus so tangibly evinced.

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 Association amount

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The system of fines for firing on the wrong target and for challenging shots, introduced at this meeting, and most rigidly enforced, tended greatly to making men more careful of endangering the lives of the markers, and less liable to interrupt the firing in search of presumed "hits."

Another new feature in the meeting was the introduction of the telephone, furnished by the Montreal Telegraph Company, between the firing points and the butts. By this means instantaneous communication was had between these two points, and disputes were settled, in the case of challenges, with scarcely any stoppage of the firing. The cost of the telephone another year, unless extended, will be much less, the poles and wires being now the property of the Association.

The receipts from pasturage are less than last year, the privilege having been given to one individual only for a lump sum, instead of to several, as heretofore, at so much per month; but, whichever plan is adopted for the coming year, we shall look for a better return.

Previous to the Review held on the ranges on September last, your Council asked for tenders for the privilege of erecting a grand stand, the best offer received was from Mr. Loveys, of Toronto, viz., one-fifth of gross proceeds. This was accepted, the share of the Association amounting to \$212 60.

In presenting the Balance Sheet, wherein a smaller balance in actual cash is shewn than last year, attention must be called to the amount of ammunition still on hand, as per inventory of stores to be seen on page 17; and, as this represents its equivalent in cash, the available assets have decreased but very little since the last statement. Your Council consider this fact a matter of congratulation, inasmuch as the usual repairs, new firing points, new background on the ranges, an increased staff required to work the additional targets at the match, together with a larger (by nearly \$500) prize list, had led them to think that, although great encouragement might be given to rifle shooting through these improvements, a much reduced balance would likely face them at the end of the year. It was also found necessary to purchase four more field glasses for the register keepers; and a chance offering of obtaining two of "Steward's" telescopes, with stands, at a bargain, they were bought.

In the aggregate the entrance fees were greater than the previous year; while the fees for sighting and fouling shots, ammunition, etc., shew a decided increase.

The list of Affiliated Associations has been increased by three, the membership by eighteen, over the year 1878.

In April last an appeal was made to the various Municipal Councils of the Province for a small grant in aid of the prize list, and though only fourteen appear to have taken the subject into consideration at all, ten of these generously complied with our request, and contributed \$10.00 each, the amount being placed to the credit of the 4th or "Ontario" match.

The grateful acknowledgment of your Council is due to the under-named for donations in aid of the Association:—The Dominion Government, the Provincial Government, the Canada Company, the City Councils of Toronto and Hamilton, and County Councils of Frontenac, Hastings, Lincoln, Ontario, Renfrew, Welland, Wentworth and York.

To the Staff, through whose attentive and zealous efforts the success of the late competition is entirely due, your Council desire to convey their most cordial thanks, viz.:—Lieut.-Cols. Moffatt and Worsley; the Executive Committee; Major Miller, the Statistical Officer; Lieut.-Col. Jarvis, the Executive Officer; Major Macdonald and Captain Gibson, Range Officers; Lieut. Kersteman, Assistant Secretary; Surgeons-Major De la Hooke, Thorburn and Richardson, with Surgeon Diamond, the Surgeons; Lieut.-Col. Arthurs and Captain Graham, the Auditors.

Also to the managers of the several railway companies, who granted reduced fares to competitors; and to the proprietors of the *Globe* and *Mail*, for full and complete daily returns of the various matches, we are greatly indebted.

In conclusion, your Council have with much regret to announce the resignation of their late President, His Honour Judge A. Macdonald, of Guelph, necessitated through a severe illness. Actively connected with the Association from its formation, Judge Macdonald has been one of its most steadfast friends and supporters, ever ready to forward its interests, extend its usefulness, and encourage and advise its members.

Lieut.-Col. Allan Gilmour, of Ottawa, succeeds Judge Macdonald as President.

REGULATIONS
FOR
THE ANNUAL PRIZE MEETING
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION,
25th AUGUST, 1879, and following days.

MEMBERSHIP.

The Membership Fee is \$1, and all memberships must be paid for at that rate.

Associations shall pay \$5 for the privilege of affiliation, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, entitling an Association to a badge, and to free entrance for team prizes in the "Affiliated" Match.

EFFICIENCY.

Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates competing in the "Maiden" and "Militia" Matches will be required to produce Certificates from the Commanding Officer or Adjutant of their Corps that they are regularly enrolled and efficient members of the same.

TRANSIT.

By special arrangement with the Grand Trunk, Great Western, Northern, Toronto and Nipissing, and Toronto, Grey and Bruce Railways, Competitors will be carried to and from the Match at Single Fare; on the St. Lawrence and Ottawa, and Canada Central Railways, at One and a Third Fare, on being furnished by the Secretary of the O. R. A. with Certificates before leaving home; and by the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company at Single Fare (meals and berths extra), or One and a Third Fare (meals and berths included).

CAMP.

1. Competitors desiring camp accommodation will be furnished with the same on application to the Quarter-Master. One Tent and twelve Blankets will be issued to every six Competitors on payment of \$1. Any person drawing a Tent, Blankets, &c., will be held responsible by the Association for its safe return.
2. Refreshments may be procured at the authorized places on the ground.
3. All Competitors on the ranges and in camp will be subject to Police regulations.

1.—GENERAL REGULATIONS.

The Meeting shall be under the direction of an Executive Committee, composed of the chairman and two members of the Council, to be nominated by the Council, and the following regulations are to be observed, together with such directions as may be given from time to time by the Executive Committee.

I.—All Competitors must be members of the Ontario Rifle Association.

II.—The Matches will take place, if possible, in the order of publication. Any deviation from the Rule will be posted on the board at the Secretary's Hut. Temporary discontinuance on account of bad weather will be at the discretion of the Executive Committee.

III.—The firing shall begin daily at 9 a.m., and cease when the mid-day gun has fired at 12 noon. It shall be resumed at 1 p.m., and cease at 6 p.m. except on the second day, when the firing will cease at 5 p.m., to enable members of the Association to attend the Annual General Meeting.

IV.—Two guns shall be fired for the "Commence," one ten (10) minutes before the named hour, to warn Competitors to move to the firing points, the second being the signal that firing is to begin; two guns also at the "Cease fire," one ten (10) minutes before the named hour, after which no Competitor will be allowed to begin his score, the second as a signal that all the scores begun before the first gun are completed.

V.—All Competitors shall be subject to the Executive Committee, Officers, or Non-Commissioned Officers in charge of their respective ranges or squads, the camp Police, and the General Regulations for the conduct of the Meeting; and any Competitor infringing the rules or disobeying orders shall be debarred from further competition, pending the decision of the Executive Committee.

VI.—Officers and men of Militia Corps, competing for Prizes restricted to the Militia, shall appear in the authorized full dress or undress uniform of their Corps, with a waist belt. Officers need not wear sword belts, but Officers of Rifle Corps must wear cross belts. Cap covers allowed. Uniforms to be fastened, and the heel-plate of the rifle to rest against the outside of the uniform when firing.

VII.—Competitors shall submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

VIII.—No hair triggers shall be allowed.

IX.—No fixed artificial rests shall be allowed, the forearm and hand being clear of all support.

X.—Competitors may wipe out or clean out their rifles, during any competition, between distances only.

XI.—No two Competitors shall shoot with the same rifle in the same match.

XII.—Every Competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and, unless otherwise specified, not oftener than once for any prize.

XIII.—No member of a squad or firing party shall absent himself without leave during firing. Any Competitor delaying the squad will be passed by.

XIV.—No Competitor to *cap*, or, with breech-loader, to *load*, until called to the front to shoot.

XV.—Should a Competitor lose his firing ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity given him of competing for the Prize for which his ticket was issued, his claim on the Association in regard to such competition shall be cancelled.

XVI.—Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the General Regulations of the Meeting; as also with the conditions attached to the Prize or Prizes for which they have entered, *as the plea of ignorance of such Regulations and Conditions will not be entertained.*

XVII.—They must have any orders have been

XVII.—They must refer to the Notice Boards daily, and ascertain whether any orders have been issued which alter or affect the original detail.

XVIII.—They must attend at the Firing Point punctually at the hour detailed on the Register Ticket or Notice Board, and deliver the ticket to the Register Keeper.

N. B.—Unless a Competitor produces his Register Ticket at the Firing Point, he cannot be allowed to fire.

XIX.—In all competitions restricted to the use of Breech-Loading Rifles, Competitors shall be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately*, and only one file at a time shall be allowed within the firing ropes.

XX.—Where only one Competitor is present, he shall necessarily fire his shots consecutively, and without undue delay.

XXI.—In competition open to "Any rifle" the Competitors shall be formed in a squad, and fire shot for shot in the order in which their names are called.

XXII.—A Competitor challenging a shot must deposit with the Range Officer the sum of 50 cents, which will be refunded if he prove correct, otherwise it will be forfeited.

XXIII.—In Individual Competition, a Competitor may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided his doing so is not allowed to delay the shooting, but no person except the Register Keeper shall be permitted to speak to a Competitor after he has taken his place at the firing point.

In Matches shot for by "representative" Teams, the members of each Team will be permitted to "coach" or "spot" for each other, and to use binoculars or telescopes for the purpose, provided that their doing so is not allowed to delay the shooting.

The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a Team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his Team in like manner, and to appoint a spotter or spotters to assist him; but no person, with the above exceptions, will be permitted within the ropes, or allowed to offer advice or instructions to the Competitors.

Any violation of this rule, or any part of it, shall be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the Officer in charge, who shall caution the offender, and on any other repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Committee, who shall deal with the case as laid down in the Regulations under the head of Penalties, and may remove any person advising a Competitor from the ground.

XXIV.—No practice will be allowed on the ranges, either before or after the days firing, during the continuance of the Match.

XXV.—Any Competitor protesting against the ruling of the Officer of the Range, or feeling himself aggrieved in any way, must make a statement of his grievances in writing, giving the names of two or more members of his squad who can bear him out in his statements, and hand it to the Secretary; but his firing must not be delayed for that purpose.

2.—PENALTIES AND FINES.

Disqualification.

1. Any Competitor—

- (a.) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b.) Who shall fire twice for the same Prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
- (c.) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d.) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind to an employée of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or

- (e.) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider to be discreditable ; or
- (f.) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having elsewhere been guilty of any of the aforesaid offences ;
- shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Executive Committee, forfeit all his Entrance Fees and Prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association.

Exclusion from further Competition during the Meeting.

2. Any Competitor—
- a. Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or
- (b.) Who shall discharge his rifle within the enclosure, except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except on the ranges and within the hours of shooting ; or
- (d.) Who shall discharge his rifle accidentally, either by his own want of care or by reason of any defect in his rifle ; or
- (e.) Who shall act in any way that may prove dangerous ;
- shall upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the Meeting, and shall forfeit all his Entrance Fees.

Disallowance of Score.

3. Any Competitor—
- (a.) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular Prize ; or
- (b.) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the Meeting while shooting for any particular Prize ;
- shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular Prize disallowed.

Fines.

4. Any Competitor—

3.—ENTRIES.

Entries for the first seven matches and the grand aggregate must be made upon forms supplied by the Secretary, on or before Saturday, 23rd August. Entries must be accompanied by the fees.

4.—POST ENTRIES.

1. Post entries will not be squadded until the regular entries have been provided for.
2. Post entries will be detailed to fire according to the number on the ticket issued, but the Council cannot hold themselves responsible should the holders of such tickets find it impossible to shoot before the close of the competition ; in such case the entrance fee will be returned.
3. No post entries shall be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

10 —POSITION.

Any position at all ranges, provided the rifle has no rest or support other than the person of the Competitor.

11.—SIGHTING.

Tickets for sighting shots, price 10 cents each, will be sold at the office provided for that purpose, They shall be delivered up to the Register Keeper—two allowed at each range—before a shot is taken. Such tickets to hold good in any Match during the continuance of the Meeting.

12.—TIES.

The names of Competitors who have to shoot off ties shall be posted up daily at 8 a. m. and 12 p. m., on the Ties Notice Board.

Ties shall be decided as follows :—

 - (f.) If still a tie, by firing shot for shot at the same distance.
