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

HOPE TOWNSHIP.

THE Township of Hope occupies a desirable position in the County of Durham and Province of Ontario, and contains an area of about 64,000 acres. It is bounded on the north by the Township of Cavan; on the south by Lake Ontario; on the east by the Townships of Hamilton and South Monaghan, and on the west by by the Township of Clarke. The Township of Hope was first permanently settled in 1793, by the families of Messrs. Myndert Harris, Lawrence Johnson, Nathaniel Ashford, and James Stephens, United Empire Loyalists, so-called, who, at the close of the Revolutionary War, found themselves subjected to all manner of persecution by the triumphant insurgents, on account of their loyalty to the British Crown. Their several possessions were confiscated, and they were driven to seek homes elsewhere. Capt. Jonathan Walton and family, also, arrived at the above date; but he never was considered a permanent settler-returning a few years afterwards to Schnectady, N. Y., he opened up a profitable trade with our settlers, who, in the absence of any regular shop, were accustomed to barter off their produce for "store goods," which he brought from the other side. It is not necessary here to allude to the hardships endured by our pioneers on their journey from the United States to Newark (now Niagara), where Gov. Simcoe was then stationed. They were well received by His Excellency, who ordered a gun-boat to convey them and their families to Smith's Creek, then an Indian village of the Mississauga tribe, named "Cochingomink." The Township was, shortly after the arrival of our settlers, surveyed and laid out. During the same summer, the families of Almus Peek and John Trull arrived at the settlement.

During 1795-6, a Crown mill Patent of the land upon which Polt Hope now stands, was issued to Messrs. Elias Smith and Jonathan Walton, upon the conditions that they erect a grist and saw mill upon the excellent water privilege of the creek that flowed through the centre of the village. The work was undertaken in 1795, but owing to the raceway, constructed at the foot of the hill on the east side of the creek, freezing solid, the contractors were compelled to abandon their original plans, and move the frames further north. The mill was finally completed in 1797, the location chosen being the site of the present Stone

Mills, now occupied by Mr. G. B. Salter.

In 1810, the number of assessed ratepayers in the village and Township

was 67; total assessed value of property, £6,012 14s.

During and after the War of 1812, large numbers of Americans and their families arrived at Smith's Creek village, and settled upon lands in the Township.

In 1815, Jeremiah Britton opened up on Mill street, opposite the grist mill, a general store, the first in the settlement. In 1817 a Post Office was established, 'Charles Fothergill' receiving the appointment of Postmaster; and two years later (1819), at a public meeting of the inhabitants, the name of "Smith's Creek" was changed to that of its present one—Port Hope. The village and township at

this period contained about 750 inhabitants, who held Town Meetings on the first Monday in January of each year, in accordance with the English custom, -as practiced in the United States previous to the Revolution-when laws were made and Town officers appointed for Municipal purposes. The village and Township property was assessed alike, and the taxes collected therefrom, amounting to only a few dollars yearly, went into one common fund. The earliest record of Township matters the Publisher is able to find, is an old unbound book, made of common paper, containing the proceedings of Town Meetings from 1822 to 1836, together with the "Ear marks of sheep, cattle and hogs, belonging to the inhabitants of Port Hope and neighborhood." of which the following is a copy of the meeting held January, 1822:-

In 1834, an Act was passed by the Legislature of Upper Canada, then in session, "to define the limits of Port, Hope and establish a Police therein." When the village assumed the dignity of a town, and separated itself from the Township, municipally and otherwise, James W. Fox was retained as Township Clerk, who held the office until 1838, when Wm. H. Allen was appointed to that position.

In 1846, James Harvey Hagerman was elected Clerk of the Township, which office he filled until 1851. Since that date, and up to 1850, nothing of importance transpired within the Municipality. In accordance with an Act of Parliament, passed during the session of 1849-50, "to provide for the erection and establishment of rural municipalities," the late Newcastle District Council, by By-law No. 168, divided the Township into five Rural Wards, and established therein a responsible form of government. An election was held—the first in the Township—resulting in the return of S. S. Powers, Ward No. 1, Town Reeve; Alex. Morrow, Ward No. 2, Deputy Town Reeve; Samuel Dickinson, Ward No. 3, Thomas Campbell, Ward No. 4, and John McMurtry, Ward No. 5, Councillors. In 1851, Duncan Cleghorn was appointed Township Clerk.

At a public meeting of the Ratepayers of Hope, held at Wm. S. Marsh's Inn, on the 2nd of September, 1852, it was "resolved"- principally by Port

Hope people present—to grant a bonus of £15,000 in aid of the construction of the "Port Hope and Peterboro' Railway," and on the 6th of the same month the Council, on motion of Thos. Campbell, decided to pass a By-law to that effect, which was carried out at a regular meeting, held on the 28th December of the same year.

In 1853-4, By-laws were passed subscribing for 440 shares—\$8,826—of stock in the Hope Consolidated Gravel Road Company, from which the Township derives an annual revenue.

From 1835 up to 1854, the Township Council were accustomed to meet at Wm. S. Marsh's Inn, on the York Road, now the residence of Mr. Charles F. Powers, and from the latter date at the present place of meeting, Irvine's Hotel, formerly Eli Crawley's, Canton.

In 1864, John Foott was appointed Clerk, and the Township was divided into two Electoral Sub-Divisons for municipal purposes, abolishing ward elections. It would occupy too much space to give in detail the names of the several Municipal officers from 1850 to the present time. In 1851, Nathan Choate was elected Town Reeve; 1853, R. B. Marsh; 1855, Robert Bedford; 1857, John Rosevear; 1863, John Walker; 1864, John Rosevear; 1866, Matthew Bragg. During the year 1866, the Reeve was—at the December session—on motion of Councillor Rosevear, authorized to sign the necessary documents, transferring the stock held by the Corporation of Hope in the Port Hope, Peterboro' and Lindsay Railway to the Company.

In 1867, John Rosevear was again elected Reeve, 1868, R. A. Corbett, M.D.; 1869, E. Allan Powers, (and the same year, Nicholas Peters was appointed Township Clerk); 1870, John Rosevear; 1872, William Moon,

In 1872, the Township was divided into six Electoral Sub-Divisions for Parliamentary, and in 1876-7, for municipal purposes.

In 1874, John Rosevear again filled the Executive Chair; 1875, George B. Salter; 1876, Henry Elliott, with James H. Parsons as Township Clerk.

The following statistics are compiled from the revised Assessment Roll of the Township for 1877:—

Number of voting Ratepayers, 1,029; number of acres resident, 62,873½; number of acres cleared, 48,119; number of acres non-resident, 608. Total number of acres, resident and non-resident, 633,581½; value of resident lands, \$2,506,955; value of non-resident land, \$34,825. Total value of resident and non-resident lands, \$2,541,786. Value of Personal Property, other than income, \$95,050; amount of taxable income, \$7,100. Total value of personal property and taxable income, \$102,150. Total value and amount of Real and Personal property and taxable income, \$2,650,080. Nuumber of dogs, 398; number of bitches, 82; number of horses, 1,956; number of cattle, 9,376; number of sheep, 5,476; number of hogs, 1,640. Population, about 3,800, of which 360 are Canada Methodists; 203 Presbyterians; 186 Bible Christians; 160 Church of England, and 17 Roman Catholics. Rate in the \$, 2,4-5 mills, producing \$7,420,22,4-10., which is the best evidence that can be given of the prosperity of the Township of Hope.

TOWNSHIP POST OFFICES.

DALE P. O.—Better known as Bletcher's Corners, or Marysville, is situated upon Lots 2 and 3, in the 2nd and 3rd Concessions of Hope, two and a quarter miles from Port Hope, on the Peterboro' Gravel Road. The "Corners' was first settled by the families of Messrs. Samuel and Carlton Gifford, Jonathan and Paul Bedford, Barnabas Bletcher, Johiada Boyce and J. Brown, in 1798-9. The first school house in the Township, now School Section No. 3, was built on the corner where the old Bletcher tavern stood. In 1819-20, Boyce built the saw mill now owned by James McCallum. There is an M. E. Church, built several years ago; a cider mill, owned by John Bassett; a carpenter's and black-smith's shop; Levi Reynold's brick yard, and John W. Stevenson's Hotel. A Post Office was established a few years ago, named Dale, with Daniel Lindsay as Postmaster. Population, about 150.

WELCOME P. O.—Welcome village, better known as the "Guide Board," is situated upon Lots 12 and 13, in the 3rd and 4th Concessions of Hope, two and a half miles from Port Hope, on the Toronto Gravel Road. The village and adjoining lands were first settled in 1805-10, by Messrs. Hagerman, Low, Crippin and Bedford. In 1825, Noah Wood commenced the blacksmith's business, which he afterwards sold to Mr. Wm. Parsons, who in a few years again sold to Thomas Qke. In 1830 Westlick built the wagon shop, now owned by Francis Northcott, and known as "Welcome Carriage Works." In 1837, Allen's Tavern flourished at the Guide Board. On or about 1833, the Bible Christians erected on a lot adjoining Mr. John Brownscombe's Pottery Works, at the foot of the hill, a frame meeting house, which formed the nucleus of the present large con-The fine brick edifice now used by that body was built in 1856. In 1847, Mr. William Monaghan moved from Canton and opened a boot and shoe shop. John Grimison's wagon and Found's blacksmith's shops were also established at an early date. School Section No. 4 is situated a short distance to the east of the village. About ten years ago a Post Office was established, William Hill being the present Postmaster. Population, about 200.

CANTON P. O.-Canton village, formerly "Hope Church," is centrally located upon Lots 12 and 13, in the 4th Concession of Hope, five miles from Port Hope, and was settled in 1805 by the families of Messrs. Harris, Hawkins, and Callender—shortly followed by those of Messrs. Bowen, Johnson and others. In 1820 Reuben P. Grant, father of R. C. Grant, built a house on the corner, where the Post Office now stands—the first in the village. During 1825 Potter completed his saw mill, immediately west of where the flouring mill now stands, which he sold to R. P. Grant, who, in 1835, conveyed to Joseph Ayers the privilege of erecting a grist mill upon the same dam. Mr. Ayers dying, the business was carried on for some years by his father-in-law, Emanuel Mann, who in 1844. transferred the property to the late Peter Salter, uncle of G. B. Salter, who built an addition thereto and otherwise improved what is now known as "Durham Mills." In 1820 a log school house was built upon the corner of Mr. Hawkins' lot, where James Rutledge taught school for many years, and which, until 1832, was used as a place of public worship by the Wesleyan Methodists. During 1832 Hope Church was built, in which religious services were held until last March, when the new brick Church, erected at a cost of over \$7,000, was dedicated. In 183
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Ross MOUNT P. O.—This Post Office was established two or three years ago, and is located at Brown's Corners, in the 6th Concession of Hope, 61/2 miles from Port Hope, on the Peterboro' Gravel Road. Joshua Lill, Postmaster.

Perrytown P. O.—Perrytown village is pleasantly situated upon Lots 14 and 15, in the 7th and 8th Concessions of Hope, 9 miles from Port Hope, and was first permanently settled about the years 1820-1, by the families of John Perry (better known as "Saw-Log Perry," after whom the village was named), and Samuel Caldwell, Sr., who, a 'ew years afterwards, were joined by the families of Asa Callender, Robert Corbett) the grandfather of Dr. R. A. Corbett, the present Postmaster), Nathan Choate, James Rutledge, and others. A Post Office was established about 1850, the late Aaron Choate being the first Postmaster. There are four Churches, viz: the Canada Methodist, Presbyterian, Bible Christian, and Church of England. The industries are J. D. Caldwell's carriage and wagon shop, Samuel Sleep, Jr. and Sr.'s, blacksmith shop, William Purcell's boot and shoe shop. School Section No. 12 is located immediately west of the village. Population about 150.

GARDEN HILL P. O.-Garden Hill Post Office and village is situated on Lots 16 and 17, in the 7th and 8th Concessions of Hope, and on the line of the Midland Railway, 10 miles from Port Hope. The village was originally named Waterford, but owing to a similarity of Post Offices of that name, was, at a public meeting of the inhabitants held in 1870, changed to Garden Hill. The land in the immediate neighborhood was first settled about 1830, by the families of Messrs. Kilpatrick, Leith, Corbett, Hamill, Seaton, and others. In 1861, Mr. Francis Beamish built a mill on the fine water privilege, which he leased to a firm from the United States for the purpose of manufacturing hats, etc. This industry was, about two years subsequent, unfortunately destroyed by fire. Mr. Beamish again re-built his mill, which he fitted up with machinery for the manufacture of lumber, shingles, etc., and afterwards moved it to where it now stands. In 1869, Mr. James Dyer, of Orono, Clarke, purchased Mr. Beamish's interest in the village, and erected, at considerable expense, the extensive woolen mills, which have, during the late commercial depression, been run to their full capacity. In 1870, a Post Office was established, Mr. Dyer receiving the appointment of Postmaster, who opened in connection therewith a general store. Salem Lodge, I. O. G. T., own and meet in a neat, substantial building; also, Garden Hill L. O. Lodge, No. 385. The only place of public worship in the village is the M. E. Church, erected principally through the exertions of Mr. Dyer. In 1872, Mr. John McElroy, Jr., completed his flouring mill, of two run of stones, which he carries on in connection with his saw and planing mills, doing a good business, and supplying a want that was long felt in the neighborhood. There is also a carriage and blacksmith shop of recent date, and at Adams' Corners—now Garden Hill—Mr. James Fair's carriage and pump factory, a Hotel, etc. The village is rapidly increasing in population, registering at present between 400 and 500, and bids fair to become one of considerable importance in the Township of Hope.

ELIZABETHVILLE P. O.—Elizabethville village and Post Office is situated upon Lots 28 and 29, between the 8th and 9th Concessions of Hope, 15 miles from Port Hope. The village and neighborhood was settled about 1825–30, by Messrs. Smith, Barkwell, McMurtry, Oke, Trew, and Diamond. In 1848–9, John McMurtry built the grist mill now owned by J. McGregor Young, a d further down the creek Wm. McMurtry built the present saw mill. About 1850, a Post Office was established, named Elizabethville, in honor of the estimable wife of the first Postmaster, John McMurtry. Thomas Tamblyn's carriage and J. Palmer's blacksmith shops were also established at an early date. There are two Churches—the Canada Methodist and Church of England, and a general store, owned by Johnson Beatty, who is the present Postmaster. School Section No. 13 is also situated in the village. Population, about 100.

OSACA P. O.—The village of Osaca is situated upon Lots 26 and 27, in the 5th and 5th Concessions of Hope, 10 miles from Port Hope, and was first settled by the family of the late James Elliott, about 1830. In 1869, Mr. Henry Elliott, the present Reeve of the Township, erected upon the excellent water privilege of the creek, the Osaca Flouring Mills, of three run of stones, which is at present carried on by the firm of H. & T. Elliott. During 1871, a Post Office was established, with Mr. David Gordon as Postmaster, who also keeps a general store. Mr. Alex. Crothers is the "village blacksmth," and a short distance up the creek is the saw mill of Mr. Samuel Parsons. Population, about 100.

Port Britain—Is situated on Lots 21 and 22, on the Lake Shore Road, 3 miles from Port Hope, and was first settled in 1895—6, by the families of Messrs, S. Marsh, Leonard Soper, and others. During 1800, Mr. S. Marsh built a saw mill upon the site of the present mill carried on by Mr. R. Bickle, which he afterwards converted into a distillery, and in 1801 he built a grist mill, the first in the Township—the location being the site of the present mill, owned by Mr. R. E. Sculthorp. In 1856, a Joint Stock Company was formed, under the name of "The Port Britain Harbor Company." Prospectus and plans were issued, setting forth the natural advantages of the position as a harbor, etc. Village lots were held at fabulous sums, but with the exception of the sale of a few lots to outsiders, the scheme fell through, and Port Britain of to-day is what might be termed a "finished" town. Mr. Barker carries on the grist mill, and Mr. Hoar the blacksmith shop. There are several market gardeners in the village, who raise a large amount of garden stuff. There is one Bible Christian Church. Population, about 100.

ZION P. O.—Zion Post Office is of recent date, and is situated upon Lot

31, in the 3rd Concession of Hope, eight miles from Port Hope. Stephen Taylor, Postmaster.

WESLEYVILLE P. O.—This Post Office was established a few years ago, and is located upon Lot 30, in the 1st Concession of Hope, five miles from Port Hope, on the Lake Shore Road. Elijah Barrowclough, Postmaster.
