Crowell Swartz threshed 175 bushels of corn from three acres last week, for Chas. Coombs, London township. This 55 1/2 bushels to the acre.

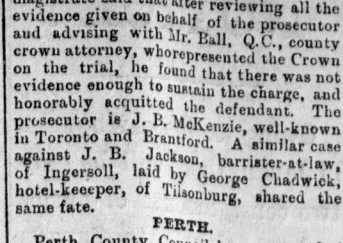

That is a narrow spirit which would deny to one portion of the English-speaking people those reasonable rights to local self-government which other portions have been freely conceded. He is a contracted and illiberal man who asks that a statesman of one country shall be suspected of lack of patriotism because he stands well in the estimation of citizens of another land, and they largely his own kith and kin.

Dr. L. H. Wertz, a prominent Coldwater practitioner for many years, died at Los Angeles, Cal., of consumption. Miss Mae Lapham, of Northville, has purchased and placed a \$1,000 piano in the ladies' library rooms at that place.

One side of South Haven's brick Masonic temple is to be erected on a massive foundation. It will be rebuilt. Traverse City has sold \$21,000 worth of bonds to a Detroit bank and will subsidize a new factory and a projected railroad.

Arthur Hill, of Saginaw, accepts the appointment of superintendent of the Michigan forestry exhibit at the World's Fair. Phineas Stewart, of Howell, is 95 years old. Until recently he has been chock full of youthful vigor, but his death is now hourly expected.

C. B. Banton, of Bear Lake, shot a deer with long ears, short legs and other peculiarities that made it look like an overgrown jack rabbit. The total retail and water shipments from Muskegon for the season are \$70,000,000.

The United States fish hatchery at Northville has secured over 1,000,000 trout eggs this season. Water shipments from Bay City are \$20,000,000 feet.

A Chelvey county man declares that a mixture of wildcat grease and kerosene oil will knock galleys west the worst case of scurvy in the ever known. Modern iron mines cost about \$100 a foot, so that a shaft 1,500 feet deep represents the neat little sum of \$150,000 put into a hole in the ground.
