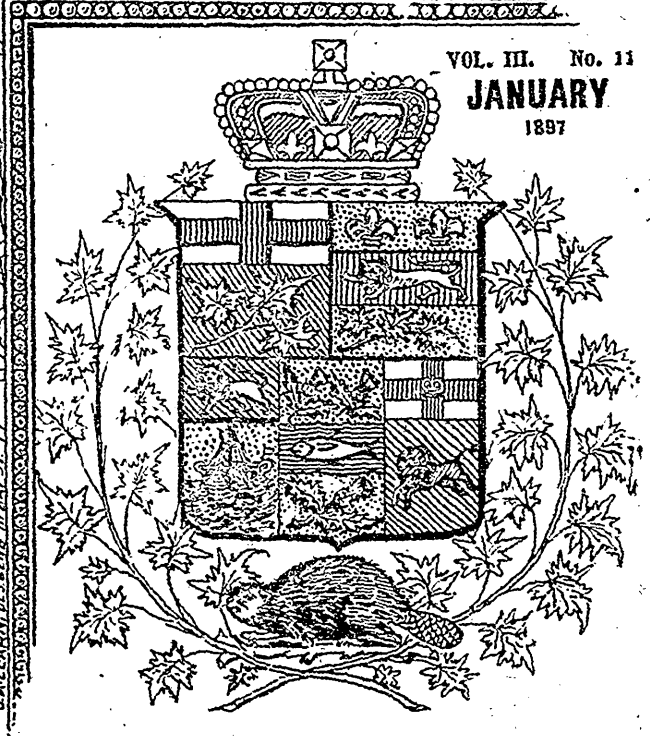

## WHAT WE SHOULD COLLECT.

During an experience as a collector and dealer, of over twenty-five years ; I have seen many changes in the way or style or manner which you may please to ascribe it, of collecting and classifying the stamps of the world.

In a short retrospect I will try to give as full a list of the rise of philatelic periods as possible and afterwards tell you how I should collect if I were to start again. Many years ago say twenty-five, when there were no such thing as price catalogues, nor yet such a thing as a descriptive catalogue of the world, stamps were collected altogether as curious works of art, only one of the same design, or maybe color being desired, and these were well and securely glued (to stay) on the pages of some pocket note book, or sometimes put in a picture scrap book. There were very few stamp albums made in America at that time, and it was very seldom that European albums such as Lalliers, Gibbons, Moens Rou-sins, Grays or even Oppens were seen.

At that time the stamp collecting world knew only the stamp as a curiosity of design, and beyond that they did not care to come, being well satisfied with the knowledge that there was plenty of varieties (5000 to 6000 postage and revenue being in existence at that time) to keep up a greed or ambition without looking for such as tints, papers, water-marks, perforations etc., etc. At that time such stamps as the 1857 and the 1858 (perforated, 6d Canada were of the

same value (on sheets at 5 or 10 cents according to liberality of the party who had them up for sale, but never more). It was about, or maybe shortly after this that the first idea and commencement of specialism originated, it had its beginning by some three or four dealer collectors in the United States confining themselves only to the stamps of the United States, both postage and revenue ; such names as Sterling, Adams, Boyntan, etc. may be mentioned as some of the pioneers in the great field of specialism. Some little while after the United States specialism broke out an album for only one variety of each denomination issued, independent of perforations etc. etc., was put on the market, which, although called the common-sense album, was the opening up of variety in its many branches. Since it somewhat aroused the curiosity of even the humblest collector why such things should exist and still no place for them in the album.

At this period (say 1876—1878) such a thing as pricing a stamp at one dollar or more was unknown, as can be seen by referring to a few old price lists will show. I think it was in 1880 that the boom, or specialism first struck Canada, in that year a Mr. — of Quebec, in a list of his Canadian duplicates in which he showed shades, perforation papers and so forth, which was surprising in their number and distinctness, as also the price of some. This circular was really the starter, as it were, of the idea in Canada, and which has been ably added to by many larger lists and catalogues of the

stamps of this country.

About 1881 or a year later a boom for the labels of South America got up which continued for some years, more or less in strength.

From that time (say 1883-4) there has been a boom on the move which has struck a different spot every year, sometimes the force of the strike is not very strong, but just enough to raise the price of paper a couple of times its former value.—But did I not say I was going to tell you how I would collect if I were to start again?

If I were to start a collection to-morrow, I would commence with buying the stamps which everybody, or very few in fact, were not very particular about as they were priced low and had very little show to get up in the world as it were; I would select countries which had always been too common even to look at, they and not the high priced stamp of the present day, will be the varieties of say 19 to A.D.

**STRAITS SETTLEMENTS**—Comprising Singapore, Penang and Malacca, are situated on the west coast of the Malay Peninsula, of which the whole southern portion, comprising about 25,000 square miles, is now under the control of the British Government; the total area of the colony proper is 1,542 square miles; population, 512,342; capital, Singapore,

imports, \$141,427,952; exports, \$134,637,707.

**TASMANIA**.—Is an island at the southern extremity of the continent of Australia, from which it is divided by Bass' Straits 120 miles wide; the area of the colony is 26,215 square miles, and its population, 153,144; capital, Hobart; imports, £1,497,161; exports, £1,346,965, public debt, £7,399,000.

**TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO**.—The island of Trinidad lies about 16 miles east of Venezuela, and has an area of 1,754 square miles; the colony now includes the Island of Tobago which is the most southerly of the Windward group of the West Indies; the population of Trinidad is 200,000 and of Tobago 18,353; capital, Port of Spain; imports (Trinidad), £2,086,380; exports, £2,258,063; imports, (Tobago), £15,888; exports, £13,744; public debt (Trinidad), £608,820; public debt (Tobago) \$5,000

**TURKS AND CAICOS ISLANDS**.—These islands lie between 21 and 22 deg. north latitude and 71 and 72 deg 37 min west longitude; their area is 169 square miles, and population 4,744; imports, \$25,388; exports, \$27,336.

**VICTORIA**.—Is situated at the south-east of the continent of Australia; its extreme length from east to west is about 490 miles, and its greatest breadth 300 miles; the area of Victoria is 87,884 square miles, nearly equal to Great Britain; population, 1,167,373; capital, Melbourne; imports, \$17,174,545; exports, \$14,214,546; public debt, \$46,711,287.

**WESTERN AUSTRALIA**.—Comprises nearly one-third of the Australian continent, namely, all that portion west of 129th degree of east longitude; the total area is 75,920 square miles; population, 58,674; capital Perth; imports \$1,391,109; exports, \$882,148; public debt, \$1,261,864.

**WINDWARD ISLANDS**.—The Windward or southern group of the West India Islands includes the following islands; St. Lucia, St. Vincent, Barbadoes, the Grenadines and Grenada;

Barbadoes is a separate colony and will be found in its alphabetical order; the total area of the combined colony is 524 square miles, and its population about 113,000; imports (Grenada), \$158,702; exports, \$264,681; imports (St. Lucia), \$173,024; exports, \$179,056; imports (St. Vincent), \$102,980; exports, \$117,571; public debt (Grenada), \$96,575; public debt (St. Lucia), \$147,850; public debt (St. Vincent), £15,250

ZULULAND —Is the territory lying to the north of Natal, from which it is divided by the River Tugla; the estimated area is about 12,000 square miles, population, estimated 160,000.

Have never seen any B.F. or J.F. date cancelled before 1887, so it is evident they must have used the C.F. and B.F. and C.F. and J.F. until 1887, and then got the plain stamp without surcharge and made the B.F. and J.F.

These stamps were issued in 1885, as the die of the first type (9 scrolls) could not be found. It was, however, found a short time after, so that only a few were used of the C.F. The balance of the issue then had the surcharges B.F. and J.F. put on. No \$2 is known of in these issues.

The issues of Manitoba are priced at net value, as has been the case with all the other listed revenues.

BRITISH COLUMBIA.

This province possesses but very few revenues, and these consist of two sets of law stamps, issued at different times. The design is a figure of Justice, whose left hand has a sword pointed downwards, "British Columbia Law Stamp" in two curved lines at the top, and has numerals of value in lower corners, with value, in words, between, completes the design.

NEW BRUNSWICK.

The stamps of this province are also brought into use by the Courts of Law, and whether the people of New Brunswick are more careful, and need not the services of these who live by law, the fact cannot be disputed that New Brunswick stamps are scarce.

In 1884, four values were issued, and these have the typical figure of Justice. Later on three of the values were printed in other colors.

NOVA SCOTIA.

Unlike the other provinces of Canada the revenue issues of Nova Scotia were not specially made at first. It was only upon the discovery that certain parties who had a keen business sense, and had, upon noticing the difference in the currency rates of the province of Nova Scotia and its sister provinces, whereby they could advantageously sell in Nova Scotia, and accordingly bought elsewhere.

This state of affairs, upon discovery, resulted in the third issue Bill stamps

of Canada being surcharged "N. S." in shaded antique type.

It is confidently anticipated that this measure of re-organization will meet with favor, and that in the near future the Canadian Philatelic Association will become, as in the past, the leading philatelic Association of Canada.

IN the report of the Dominion Philatelic Association convention in Toronto, we are credited with seconding a motion moving for a permanent official organ, "because there was no immediate prospect of amalgamation." As a matter of fact, we did not attend the meeting in question, and nobody was instructed to represent us.

OWING to the indisposition of Mr. B. L. Beard, of Montreal, he has to postpone the issuing of his Directory until January, 1898. Every collector is requested to send his name and address for free publication.

A SIGHT not often seen in any city was a strip of three of the rare ten cent green, 1861 issue, of the United States. It is in the possession of a local collector, and is not for sale.

ON another page appears the report of the president of the Canadian Philatelic Association. We hope, now that amalgamation has been shelved, to again see the pioneer society of Canada amongst the foremost.

THE auction sale which appears elsewhere, is worthy of perusal by readers of this journal. The goods were not owned by one individual, and collectors will wait

and hunt a long time ere they can gather the collection of Canadian revenues. By sending in bids for them now you may get them. The demand lately for this class of stamps has been very great, and the supply just the opposite.

SIR OLIVER MOWAT, the Minister of Justice for Canada, has decided that John R. Hooper must serve the sentence imposed on him some years ago. The Minister of Justice of the late Conservative government also decided in the negative, and now comes the judgment of the Liberal government. Sir Oliver is a man who gives every possible doubt to the accused, that will favor them, as witness his late judgments in pardoning and commuting to life imprisonment those who were found guilty of crimes against life. While it is quite proper to sympathize, we must remember that sympathy may be misplaced, and no one should sign their name to a petition for pardon, because of Mr. Hooper at one time having been a leading light amongst collectors. Belief of innocence is another matter.

OUR February issue will complete Vol. III, 12 numbers to the volume.

THE Catalogue of Canadian Revenues which Mr. Adams will issue in March, will be found to contain more than he advertises.

THE postage stamps of Canada will soon be commenced in this paper, maybe next month. It is hardly possible that we will price them, as they are not like the revenues—hardly known. However, should we price them, impartial figures may be expected.

SOME papers have it that the contract to print and engrave Canada's stamps has been awarded to an American firm. Mr. Burland, the present contractor, has put his tender in this form: "To accept the contract at the figures of the lowest tenderer." Should this be the case, we can safely rely on the work being given to the Canadian firm.

# Auction Sale of Good Stamps.



It is with pleasure your attention is called to the undermentioned stamps, which, while none of them can be considered rare, in a number of cases are not to be found when wanted.
