NOTES FROM OTTAWA. Difficulties in the Way of the Scott Act - Quebec Ammunicions - The Winter Post Question.

OTTAWA, Feb. 5. - The Gazette to-day contains a proclamation appointing April 18th as the polling day for the Scott act in Hamilton.

The Gazette also contains new regulations regarding all signatures to petitions under the temperance acts to be separately numbered and witnessed, and several other regulations which will greatly increase the difficulty of getting up petitions.

An influential delegation from Halifax, consisting of Mayor Tobin and several leading bankers, merchants and ship-owners, arrived here this morning to confer with the government on the winter port question.

Sir Hugh and Andrew Allan are also here, it is believed in connection with the same subject.

THE LAW COURTS TO-DAY. COMMON LAW CHAMBERS.

Before Mr. Dalton, C. C. C. & Q. B. Louni v. Canada Farmers - Judgment summons absolute to set aside writ of execution against the defendants, a final insurance company, on the ground that they were issued within three months of judgment, contrary to the provisions of R. S. O. C. 161, sec. 51. Mr. Holman for summons, Mr. Stoddart (Canada & Co.) contra.

Grathen v. Bell - Summons to amend a plea moved. Order made to amend plea. Mr. Aylesworth for the summons, Mr. Delaney contra.

Carroll v. Carrigan - Company v. Mason Manufacturing Company - Mr. J. E. Rose obtained a summons calling upon the sheriff of Wellington to withdraw from possession of goods "situated in Orangeville" which lies in the new county of Dufrain, the goods having been seized since the proclamation.

Connell v. Reid - Holman moved absolute a summons to set off judgments. Aylesworth showed cause. Reasons given. Mr. Reid v. Reid - Mr. Reid obtained a summons by way of appeal from Mr. Dalton, whose ruling was that a plaintiff in judgment was not judgment creditor for the purposes of examination and garnishment.

CHANCERY CHAMBERS. Before Mr. Dalton, C. C. C. & Q. B. Paris v. Moffatt - Mr. Moffatt moved to remove a next friend of the plaintiff on the ground of his insolvency. Hoyle contra. It appeared that one of the plaintiffs was a married woman not bound to sue a next friend. Motion refused. Order made striking out the name of next friend. Costs to be costs in the cause.

Petrie v. Guelph Lumber Company - This case has been occupying the attention of the court. The petition filed this morning and is not yet concluded. Hoyle for the defendant. McLean moved to dismiss for want of prosecution and to grant for the plaintiff judgment for leave to amend and to examine all the defendants at Toronto. H. Cassels for defendants, other than McLean.
