

BY-LAWS.

- 1. The President shall be, ex-officio, chairman of all meetings, ordinary and special, when he is present.
- 2. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall preside, but in the absence of both, then the chairman of the Committee or other member of the Association as shall then be nominated by the members present, may preside, and said chairman shall, for the time, be clothed with all the powers of the chairman.
- 3. In case of two members rising at the same time to address the meeting, the presiding chairman shall decide who has the floor.
- 4. Any member addressing the meeting shall do so through the presiding chairman, and shall not occupy the floor more than fifteen minutes without permission.
- 5. At all meetings the chair is to be taken punctually at the hour appointed, and in case thirty minutes elapse without a quorum, the meeting may stand adjourned until such time as the members may name and appoint.
- 6. It will be the duty of the Secretary to keep the minutes of all meetings of the Association and read them at the next meeting, in order to their correction and confirmation; to conduct all the correspondence of the Association. It will also be the duty of the Secretary to make a full annual report, at the regular or adjourned annual meeting, of the proceedings of the Association for the preceding year.
- 7. The Treasurer shall take charge of all funds and keep a correct account of the same, disbursing them under the direction of the Association, being prepared at any regular meeting with a statement of the finances and making an annual report at the regular or adjourned annual meeting.

CONSTITUTION.

1st. This Association shall be called the "Pioneer and Historical' Association of the Province of Ontario, Canada."

2nd. Its objects shall be to unite the various Pioneer and Historical Societies of the Province in one central head or organization, thereby the better to promote intercourse and union of all such societies, for the better preservation of historical and other records and memorials of the Province, for the forming of new societies for such purposes, and for the promoting and extending the influence and benefits thereof. Also, this Association shall publish an annual report, containing the names of all the members of each and every affiliated society, with such other matters as may be required, each such affiliated society to receive copies thereof.

3rd. Its membership shall consist of delegates from all the various Pioneer and Historical Societies of the Province, of such as are now in existence and of those that may in the future be formed.

4th. The affairs of this Association shall be managed by a President, one Vice-President, a Secretary, Treasurer, and an Executive Committee of five; all of whom shall be appointed from among the regular members of the Association. The officers being, *ex-officio*, members of the committee, all of whom shall hold office until their successors are regularly appointed.

5th. An annual general meeting of the Association shall be held at such place in Ontario as shall be appointed at each preceding annual or adjourned annual meeting, such annual meeting to be held on the first Wednesday in June in each and every year, to receive the annual reports of the Association, and taking proper action thereon; for the nomination and election of officers, the committee and two auditors,

and to transact such other business as may be required. Five members

to form a quorum; for the committee, three.

6th. It is not the intention of this Association to exercise any control in governing or directing any of the affiliated societies, or in any way to interfere in their private working; but in case any question is referred to this Association by any of the affiliated societies, then jt will

be competent for this Association to consider and decide upon any such question or reference.

7th. No portion of the Constitution or By-Laws of the Association may be altered, added to, or repealed, until approved of by two-thirds of the members present at the meeting; and for such proposed alteration, adding to, or repeal, notice thereof shall be given to the Secretary in writing and signed by such requirer, at least one month before the said meeting; and the Secretary shall immediately, on reception of said notice, send copies of such proposed alterations, adding to, or repeal, to each member of the Association.

8th. Each and every affiliated society shall pay into the funds of this Association an annual sum, as dues, of ten cents for each and every member of such society; but when the number of members of such society exceeds one hundred, or ten dollars, then no further annual dues, namely, than ten dollars per annum for such affiliated society, will be required; said dues to be due and payable at each annual meeting, and if not paid, the delegate from such society will not have a vote until such arrears are paid.

9th. Honorary members not living in Ontario may be elected on the recommendation of the Executive Committee, but such honorary members shall not vote or hold office except as an auditor. Nor shall such honorary members have a voice in the regular business of the Association, except by permission.

10th. A special meeting of the Association may be called by the chairman upon a requisition signed by three members, which meeting shall be competent to entertain no business except such as it is called for.

11th. No subjects involving differences in religion or politics will on any account be considered proper for discussion.

12th. Each and every affiliated society may send to this Association not more than five delegates, but as soon as nine different societies are represented, this section of the constitution will be null and void, and section, 12 will read as follows, viz.:

Each and every affiliated society will be represented in this Association by one delegate regularly appointed by such affiliated society, the Secretary of this Association being notified in writing by the Secretary of such society of the appointment, with name and address of same.

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THE PIONEER AND HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION OF THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO, CANADA.

The Annual General Meeting of the Association was held in the concert hall, Brampton, Wednesday, June 3rd, 1891. In the absence of the President, the chair was occupied by Mr. Eli Crawford, Vice-President.

The following representations of affiliated societies were present: W. H. Doel, Wm. Rennie, R. H. Hodgson, F. W. Fearman, and Rev. Canon Bull. There were also a good number of prominent members of York and Peel societies present, who took part in the discussions on several important matters that were brought before the meeting. The Mayor of Brampton tendered the Association a hearty welcome.

Minutes of last meeting were read and adopted.

The correspondence was then read.

Reports of Secretary and Treasurer were read and adopted.

Mr. Fearman then addressed the meeting.

It was moved by Mr. Doel, seconded by Mr. Hodgson, That the words *Historical* and *Province* be added to the name of our Association, so that it will be known as the "Pioneer and Historical Association of the Province of Ontario, Canada." Carried.

Rev. Canon Bull read a paper and addressed the meeting, advocating that "Canadian History should form a part of the curriculum in the colleges and universities of Ontario." This recommendation was heartly endorsed by the meeting.

Dr. Canniff addressed the meeting, advocating the establishing and maintaining of a museum by the Ontario Government, and that this Association wait on the government and ask a grant of money for this object, and that we endorse the action of the Historical section of the Canadian Institute in their petition to secure a grant.

The following resolution was passed: "That this Association wait on the Government at an early date and ask to have a Provincial Museum established and maintained for the preservation of documents, relics, etc., connected with the early history of our country." ATION Da.

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tion wait Provincial ocuments, Mrs. S. A. Curzon read a paper on the "History of an odd corner," which was enthusiastically received. The writer stated that the work of the historian was in odd corners, among old musty papers, stowed away in old boxes, cupboards, etc. The writer mentioned getting in a second-hand store, for thirty cents, a fine painting of Niagara Falls as they were sixty years ago. In this picture (on the bank), was a group of four persons, evidently a man, his wife and two daughters. Their costumes illustrate the age in which they lived. The back of the picture was pasted with strips of newspaper from the Montreal *Courier* of 1833. Some of the articles and advertisements were interesting and amusing.

A vote of thanks was tendered Mrs. Curzon, Rev. Canon Bull, and Dr. Canniff for their valuable and interesting papers, which was carried enthusiastically.

Rev. Canon Bull gave notice of motion to have the By-Laws amended at our next meeting, to appoint a 2nd Vice-President and a Corresponding Secretary.

Mr. Campbell, M.P.P., was called on to address the meeting, which he did right royally, and was heartily received.

The following resolution was passed by a standing vote: That the Secretary be instructed to telegraph the following to Lady Macdonald, Ottawa:—

"The Pioneer and Historical Association of the Province of Ontario desire to express their deepest sympathy for you under your present sore trial and affliction."

The following reply was $r\epsilon$ -ved by wire:

"Lady Macdonald desires me to ask you to convey to the members of the Pioneer and Historical Association of Ontario her grateful thanks for their kind message of sympathy."—JOSEPH POPE.

On motion of Rev. Canon Bull it was decided to hold the next Annual Meeting in Toronto.

After singing the National Anthem, as Pioneers can sing it, the meeting adjourned.

A general meeting of this Society is held annually, on the first Tuesday in March, for the reception of financial and other reports and for the election of officers, committee of management and auditors, and for despatch of business on the first Tuesday of each month at the hour of two o'clock p. m., in the Canadian Institute, Toronto.

From the Annual Report of the YORK PIONEER AND HISTORICAL SOCIETY, for the year ending 28th February, 1891:

Average attendance at monthly meetings thirty-five, being two over the previous year.

Number of members deceased, fifteen; new members elected, fortyfour. The Annual Excursion, made this year to Brampson, took place on the 18th of June, and was thoroughly enjoyed by all who took part in it, and a grand reception we met with at that enterprising town.

At the Exhibition in September, the visitors to the Pioneers' Cabin were numerous, and the interest shown in the proceedings of the Society appears to be every year increasing.

In December, 1890, the Society was incorporated and the name changed from that of York Pioneer Society to York Pioneer and Historical Society.

A quantity of handsome emblematic certificates of membership have been lithographed, and all members in good standing are entitled to have one at cost. To the families of deceased members who were in good standing a copy will be sent free.

The following gentlemen read essays on various subjects of interest at the monthly meetings during the year: Rev. Dr. Scadding, President, D. B. Read, Dr. Canniff, and Mr. Chas. Durand.
