MARCONI'S NEW CLAIM

Predicts That in a Year He Will Further Revolutionize Transatlantic Telegraphy.

St. John's, Nfld., Dec. 17.—Marconi, who is highly pleased with his success in transatlantic wireless telegraphy, said to-night that he expects to be able within a year to send two different messages over the same apparatus simultaneously between Cornwall and St. John's.

GOVERNMENT VISITS MARCONI.

St. John's, Nfld., Dec. 17.—Marconi was visited officially at Signal Hill to-day by Governor Boyle, Premier Boyd and the Executive Council. They were shown the wireless apparatus, which was explained to them. No attempt was made to get signals from England, because of the hostility of the Anglo-American Cable Company. The government officials before visiting Marconi had to consider the prospect against their going made by the superintendent of the Anglo-American Cable Company, who claimed that the government should not identify itself with the scientific aspect of the Marconi plan.

KEELEBY DOES NOT DOUBT.

Ottawa, Dec. 17.—D. H. Keeleby, head of the government telegraph service, said to-day that he did not doubt the ultimate success of trans-Atlantic wireless telegraphy. To work the telegraph a station between Belle Isle and the mainland, 20 miles, an electrical energy equal to one-quarter horsepower is used. It has been working since last fall.

**FREIGHT RATES ARE EXCESSIVE**

**Arch. Campbell Will Protest Against Yukon Railway Tariff.**

The freight rates that are to be put in effect on the Yukon and White Pass Railway are exorbitant, say the members of the Railway and Transportation Association of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association. At a meeting of the committee yesterday afternoon the rates were discussed. It was pointed out that the rate on flour will be \$2.15 per cwt., although the railway is only 95 miles long. The rate on flour from Toronto to Montreal, a distance of 323 miles, is only 15¢ per cwt. It was claimed by the committee that the rates being put into operation.

In the town of Chertwell and surrounding country the damage will reach \$200,000. Scarcely a building was left standing. The fine home of the late Sir George Clifford was wrecked.

**SELL RAILWAY FRANCHISES.**

**Cleveland Mayor Proposes to Grant Privileges to Electric Companies.**

Cleveland, O., Dec. 17.—An ordinance which has been introduced in the City Council, which would be read today, provides for the granting of franchises for at least 15 new street car routes, some of which will parallel the present two electric systems, and the remainder of which will traverse new territory. A condition of the grant is that they shall be sold to the highest bidder and not three cents fare charged.

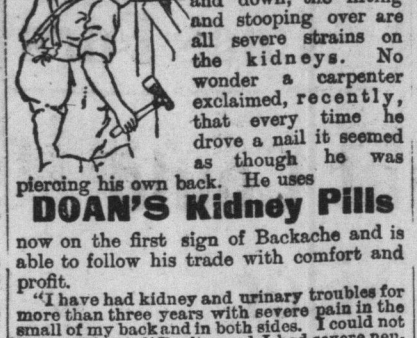
