Large Deficit in N. B. Coal & Railway Co. Line for Year

EARNINGS LESS; EXPENSES MORE

Report Presented to Legislature—Development of the Coal Areas in Quebec—Track and Rolling Stock Declared Never in Better Shape

The report of the commissioner of the New Brunswick Coal & Railway Company was presented to the house this afternoon by Premier Fleming and gives some idea of the operations of the railway for the year ended on October 31st last. It shows that there was a deficit of \$22,638.38 on operating expenses for the year and that \$4,363.90 was expended on capital account.

SLUMP TO SEVENTY-TWO COSTS BOSTON & MAINE STOCKHOLDERS MILLIONS

Boston Report Says Dividend Likely To Be Passed

Boston, March 14—There is no confirmation of a report that receivers for the Boston & Maine Railroad will be appointed. The general belief is that road will pass its dividend. A tremendous slump of stock to 72 cost the stockholders \$4,740,038 during the last two days. The stock is now at its lowest in thirty-seven years. The passing of the April dividend would mean cutting off of the support of many families in New England. Receivership would involve the Maine Central and Washington Company roads controlled by the Boston & Maine, and would cause a heavy loss to the New Haven System, which in turn, controls the Boston & Maine.

CEDAR HILL MATTER TAKEN UP AGAIN; NEW RECOMMENDATION

Mr. Connor to Get \$2,400, Remove House and Prepare Land

Fredericton, N. B., March 14—The corporations committee met last evening at 10 o'clock and the bill to incorporate the Cedar Hill Cemetery Company was considered. John Connor said that he had objected to the bill, but desired to protect his rights. He was willing to accept \$2,500 as agreed and surrender the house now standing on the property, but the house must be removed within six months and made suitable for building purposes. If that was not satisfactory to the committee supporting the bill, he was prepared to accept \$2,500 as agreed and remove the house at his own expense and make the site of the house ready for burial purposes. As a third proposal he would be willing to reduce the compensation for all lands under review to \$1,500, and retain the house and the building lots. If any of these proposals he was prepared to withdraw all opposition to the bill and have it passed, but desired that the boundaries of the property should be confined to the company's own purchases and made clear.

One-half cup sugar creamed with 1 tablespoon shortening, 1/2 cup molasses, salt, 1 cup sour milk with 1 teaspoon soda dissolved in it, 1 teaspoon ginger, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon extract of lemon, 2 cups sifted flour.

CORN BREAD
One cup granulated cornmeal, 1 cup flour, 1/2 cup sugar, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/4 cup melted butter. Mix soft and bake in rather quick oven.

GRAHAM MUFFINS
One teaspoon flour, 1/2 teaspoon graham flour, 1/2 cup sugar, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 cup milk, piece of butter size of egg melted. Add the butter last thing.

Several worthy citizens have lately been expressing a hope that the naval question may be taken out of politics. It has never been out of politics in England, Germany, the United States or any other country which has a navy.

The news from England is entirely in favor of the Liberal contention with regard to the navy. A London cable to the Canadian press last night said that the ship-building resources of the old country are so taxed that they do not permit of a larger constructional programme than has been laid down by the British government.

It has already been demonstrated that steel vessels can be built in Canada, and there is no reason why a steel ship-building plant should not be established at St. John. A native of St. John who is now in British Columbia, in a letter to a friend in this city, tells something of a friend in the Canadian Pacific Railway Company who is doing in this line.

Some very thoughtful Conservatives argue that a ship-building plant should not be established in Canada, because it is such an expensive undertaking. What is the difference between sending \$35,000,000 to Great Britain, to be followed every year by other millions, and spending this year in Canada? The money is to be spent in Canada.

The people of St. John are very deeply interested in this matter. We have the reports here, at which ship-building could be carried on with success. The policy of the Borden government, if adopted, would strike a deadly blow at the Canadian ship-building industry.

STOCK EXCHANGE COUNSEL CRITICAL OF NEW BILLS New York, March 14—Sharp criticism of some of the bills before the legislature at Albany for regulation of stock exchanges is made in a statement given out by the New York Stock Exchange over the signature of its counsel, John G. Milburn and Walter F. Taylor.

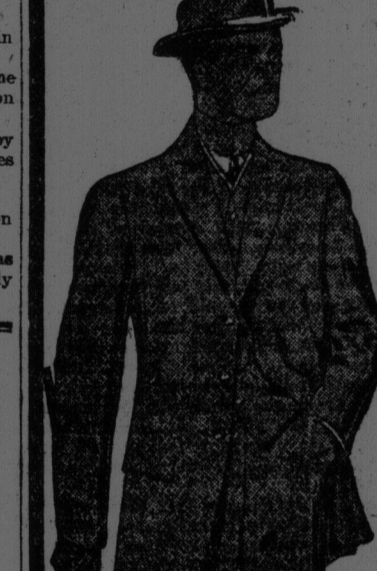

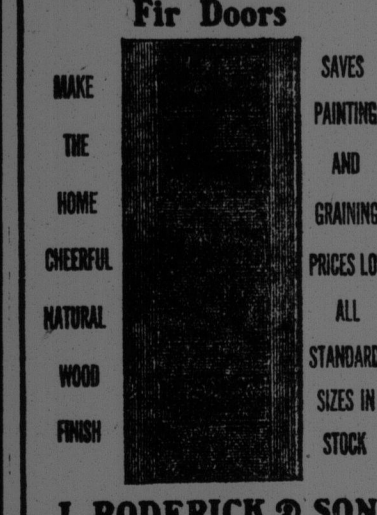

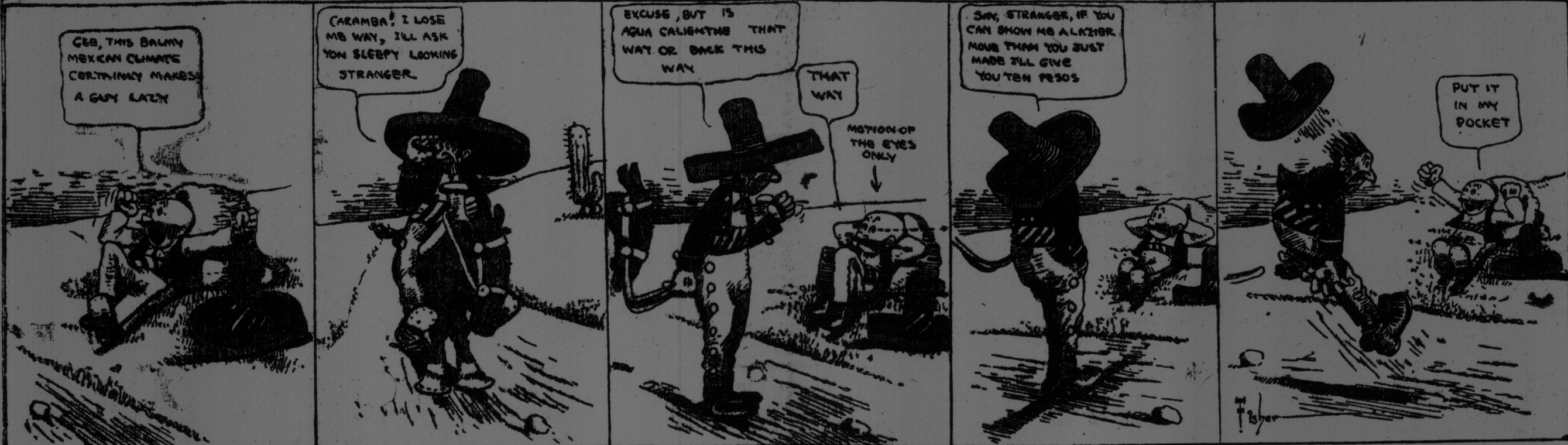
