

Mr. J. W. Weart, of Vancouver, has been in Ottawa with the object, it it is said, of interesting the government in a million-dollar wheat elevator to be erected on Deadman's Island, in Vancouver Harbor, immediately. It is stated that Mr. Weart has already made all arrangements with the C. P. R. for trackage facilities to the elevator. The plans for harbor improvement now under consideration of the government will provide for deep water approach to the island, and it is expected that there will be little trouble in arranging a treatle railway approach to the island.

R. is to erect large car-building shops which will corm the nucleus of a plant that will ultimately turn out finished locomotives built from British Columbia iron and steel. The shops will be built on the line of railway at Westminster Junction, about 20 miles from Vancouver.

## HERESY HUNT EXTENDS TO TORONTO UNIVERSITY

S. H. Blake Raises a Storm by Declaring University College Cannot Legally Teach Religious Knowledge-Rev. E Harris Also Objects-The Other Side.

(Toronto Telegram)

What Rev. Elmore Harris designates as an "acute situation" exists in University College. It arises from the character of the religious knowledge imparted to the students.

the religious knowledge imparted to the students.

Rev. Mr. Harris says his attention was first called to the nature of their teaching by a professor in one of the affiliated colleges who claimed that he had been informed by a minister who had attended some of the lectures that the students were being indoctrined in the most radical type of higher criticism. Later a student complained to Mr. Harris and others complained to Hon S. H. Blake.

Finally a deputation, consisting of Dr. N. W. Hoyles, K. C., Rev. Principal Mc. Laren, Rev. Dr. Carman and Rev. Mr. Harris waited on the president of the University regarding the "illegal" and clandestine nature of his teaching. The president was "courteous," but nothing was done. Recourse to the board of governors remained. Nothing has been done, and Dr. Harris thinks "immediate action should be taken to put an end to the illegal state of things."

The Rev. D. Bruce Macdonald, who is the convener of the special committee of the Board of Governors, said:

"If you look up the calendar of 1904 you will find, I have no doubt, that this course did not come into the University College by any back door.

"Our committee has had two meetings already and we have been working for ten days. It is not probable that we will be able to report at the meeting of the board on Thursday, for we are going thoroughly into the matter.

"We are not only taking up the question of legality, but we are also taking up the question of what has been taught."

PRESIDENT FALCONER SPEAKS

President Falconer said that the appointment of Dr. Eakin had been made before 1906 by the government, presumably on the representation of the president. He said that the lectures had not
