Among the changes would be one making any moose or elk moose until it was three years old, and had horns with three points not less than four inches long.

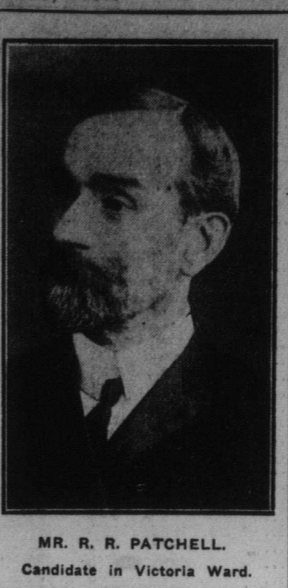

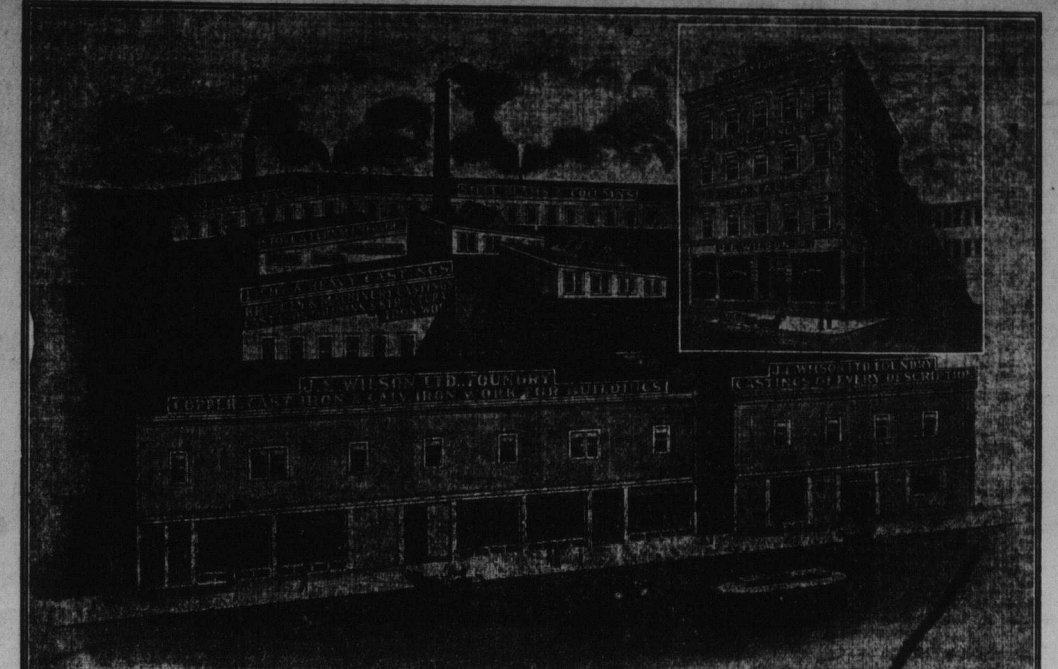
