

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REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

FOR THE YEAR 1873.

The Committee of Management in retiring from Office have the honor to lay before the Members the 38th Annual Report of the proceedings of the Society.

The number of distressed persons to whom aid has been extended during the past twelve months is somewhat less than during the previous year, yet from the peculiar nature of several of the cases the amount expended has been slightly in excess. Ninety-two (92) persons, comprising 37 men, 16 women and 39 children, have been relieved, and the total amount expended in charity is \$627.10. Details of this expenditure will be found in the Report of the Sub-Committee of Charity.

The Treasurer's Report affords full information as to the financial affairs of the Society.

Seven new Members have been added to our list during the past year.

Five Members have been removed by death, viz: Mr. John Musson, a Past-President and Original Member of the Society; Rev. George Mackie, D.D., for many years Chaplain to the Society; Mr. William Eadon, a Past-President; Mr. Hugh Hatch, one of our Life Members, and Mr. B. S. Prior, also a Life Member.

Your Committee addressed a letter of condolence to Mrs. Mackie on the occasion of the death of her husband, Rev. Dr. Mackie, expressing the regret of the Members at the news of his decease, their appreciation of his interest in, and services to, the Society, and their sincere regard and respect for his memory.

The Anniversary Service was held in the Cathedral on the evening of St. George's Day, when a Sermon in aid of the Charitable Fund was preached by Rev. G. V. Housman, M.A., and prayers read by Rev. M. M. Fothergill, Chaplains to the Society, the ladies and gentlemen of the Choir and others, under the direction of Mr. J. W. Warman, Organist, kindly undertaking the Musical portion of the Service. The collection amounted to \$82.30.

Your Committee would express their satisfaction in regard to the arrangements in existence with the Finlay Asylum and Ladies' Protestant Home.

They have also the pleasure of noticing that twenty-seven dollars have been returned to the Society in various sums. This feature is so unusual that it is worth recording. There are not wanting, however, numberless promises of a return of the amount granted as soon as the parties shall have reached their destination, which promises, from various causes, are seldom or never fulfilled.

During the year a neat railing has been placed round the Society's lot at Mount Hermon Cemetery, and all that is now

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wanting is an appropriate design to identify it as the property of the Society. Thanks are due to our Treasurer for his valuable exertions in regard to this nicely-situated lot of ground.

We are indebted to the Richelieu Company for two free passages to Montreal, and to numerous friends for their very kind ald towards the Charitable objects of the Society.

In conclusion, your Committee must express their regret that the Membership of this Society is comparatively so limited and that a greater interest should not be taken in its affairs generally. They respectfully submit that there are enough Englishmen and their descendants in this city to place the Society on a still firmer footing of usefulness if they would extend to it that support which Englishmen in other cities of the Dominion consider it their duty to extend to their National Society. By so doing, not only would they advance the Charitable undertakings of the Society, but our National Anniversary could be better observed and honored than it has been of late.

Your Committee anticipate a change for the better in this respect, and would suggest that each Member of the Society should endeavour to secure at least one new name during the ensuing year.

Of the above amount twenty-seven dollars (\$27) have been returned to us.

Four applications for relief were refused, the applicants being considered undeserving, but the Sub-Committee regret that notwithstanding all precautions to avoid being imposed upon, in four other cases where aid was granted they have since discovered that they have been deceived.

They would strongly impress upon Members generally the necessity of examining into both sides of a story before supporting any application with their own recommendation, as such recommendation necessarily goes a great way in determining the Sub-Committee as to their action in the matter.

They consider that all other cases relieved were cases of actual want. One or two letters of thanks have been received, in one of which the writer states that before the succour of this Society was extended to them, she had been driven to dispose of her wedding-ring in order to provide for the wants of her children, and that the whole family had often been twenty-four hours at a time without food of any kind.

The Right Revd. George Jehosaphat Mountain, D. D., D. C. L., Lord Bishop of Quebec, was the second son of Bishop Jacob Mountain, the first Anglican Bishop of Quebec. He was born 27th July, 1789, at Norwich, England, came to Canada with his father, 1793, and died after a brief illness at Barfield, his country seat, on 5th Jany, 1863. He was nieteen years Rector of Quebec, and was consecrated Bishop, 14th February, 1836. He was a diligent visitor among his flock. And in the dreadful visitations of cholera in 1832 and 1834, he literally lived night and day among the dying and the dead, while in 1847, when the province was visited with the plague of typhus fever, and the poor emigrants were dying by thousands at the Quarantine station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Isle regularly with the rest of the clergy; and again when the cholera visited Quebec, in 1849 and 1854, he was diligent in visiting the hospitals. During many years and up to the time of his death, Bishop Mountain, besides his life membership, contributed regularly to the Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptions, and at all times he took a great interest in its proceedings.
