The Local Legislature. SPEECH OF THE HON. M. ADAMS, SURVEYOR GENERAL, ON THE Non-Confidence Resolution of Mr. SAYRE. Reported for Advocate by Herman H. Pitt.

Resolution. Resolved that from the reports of the Surveyor General, the returns laid upon the table and the question of hemlock and other timber lands, this House is not satisfied with the manner in which the public lands in the public interest and cannot approve of the action of the Government in the premises.

HON. M. ADAMS, continuing the debate said:—The representatives for Kent appear to be divided on this question. While one condemns the policy of the Government the other approves of it.

And in numerous cases, Mr. Speaker, I have also added "you are to supply us with the amount of spruce and pine on the lot," and more particularly in reference to the sale of timber and hemlock lands.

I found, Mr. Speaker, that when this resolution was introduced, the change was noticeable in the number of applications and the character of them. Before this time there had not been a resolution to be introduced.

Mr. RYAN—That would be rather a good idea. Mr. ADAMS—Yes, you will have to trouble to get clear of us, having, as we are told, a large quantity of timber.

In discussing this matter with Mr. EDWARD JACK, who I consider has as good knowledge and interest in the Crown Lands as the hon. gentleman Mr. SAYRE, we concluded that further knowledge of the country was necessary.
