ECLIPSES IN 1844.

This year there will be three Eclipses of the Sun and two Eclipses of the Moon.

1. Total Eclipse of the Moon, May 31st—invisible.
2. Partial Eclipse of the Sun, June 15th—invisible.
3. Partial Eclipse of the Sun, November 10th—invisible.
4. Total Eclipse of the Moon, November 24th—visible—Beginning 6 min. after the Sun sets, at 4h. 44m. afternoon, ending at 8h. 34m.
5. Partial Eclipse of the Sun, December 9th—invisible.

WEATHER TABLE.

The following Table (ascribed to Dr. Herschell, and revised by Dr. Adam Clarke), constructed upon philosophical considerations of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, and confirmed by experience of many years' actual observation, furnishes the observer, without farther trouble, with the knowledge of what kind of weather there is the greatest probability of succeeding, and that so near the truth, that in very few instances will it be found to fail.

Explanation.—It will be seen from the above, 1st. That the nearer the time of the Moon's change, First Quarter, Full, and Last Quarter,

is to *Midnight*, the fairer will the weather be during the seven days following; the space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.

2dly. That the nearer to *Midday*, or *Noon*, these phases of the Moon happen, the more foul or wet the weather may be expected during the next seven days; the space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to summer, though they affect spring and autumn to a considerable extent.

3dly. That the Moon's Change, First Quarter, Full, and Last Quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, *i. e.* from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the *wind*, as it is noted in the Table.

Though the weather is more uncertain in the latter part of autumn, the whole of winter, and the beginning of spring; yet, in the main, the above observations will apply to those periods also.

The two following observations are from the ingenious Dr. Kirwan:

1. When there has been no particular storm about the time of the Spring equinox (March 21), if a storm arise in the East on or before that day, or if a storm from any point of the compass arise near a week after the equinox, then, in either of these cases, the succeeding summer is generally *dry*, four times in five.

2. But if a storm arise from the S.W. or W.S.W. on or just before the Spring equinox, then the summer following is generally *wet*, five times in six.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

A Letter with one enclosure is double; and with two or more, if it does not weigh an ounce, is treble. Letters weighing an ounce are chargeable with four single rates; and for each quarter of an ounce above that weight, a single rate is charged.

Letters mailed for the United States must be paid to the lines, and those intended for Europe *via* New York or Boston, must be paid to those places respectively.

The postage on letters intended for England to go by the Halifax Steamers, can be paid or not, at the option of the sender; due notice is always given at the Post Office, and in the public papers, of the time of closing the mail by these steamers. The mail for them that goes by way of Boston (and on which the postage to Boston must be paid,) is in general made up about a week after that which goes by Halifax.

Newspapers, Magazines, and other Printed Papers not subject to letter postage, must be paid at the time of mailing at the rate of one penny per sheet, or for every 16 pages; otherwise they will be charged full letter postage.

Newspapers published in the Colony can be sent to Great Britain either by way of Halifax, Boston, or New York; by Halifax they are free of postage if sent within seven days from the date of publication,—by New York or Boston, the sender must pay two pence on each. It is recommended that the name and address of the party for whom they are intended should be written on the margin of the paper, as well as on the wrapper or cover in which they are enclosed; this ensures their delivery in case of the cover becoming destroyed; but it is to be particularly observed that newspapers intended to go free *via* Halifax, must have no *mark, initials, or date* on the directions, but the address *merely*, or they will be chargeable with full letter postage.
