THE PROSPECTS OF HURON.

In speaking of the prospects of the County of Huron we do not refer to its material progress. Of politics and political discussions our people have had a surfeit during the past four or five months, and in the absence of anything in a local way more exciting than the electoral fracture of the leg of Mrs. Thompson's grey goose, or a series of "blind stagers" developed in one of former Plod's best pigeons, it may prove interesting to take a glance at the material prospects of our noble County.—Our electioneering rambles during the summer and recent visits to the best Agricultural exhibitions have given us ample opportunity of judging as to the position occupied by our farmers generally, and the progress they have made during the past few years.

Viewing the County, as a whole, and taking into consideration the difficulties to be encountered, we verily and sincerely believe that no section of Canada has made such rapid progress during the past few years. It is true that we have amongst us so-called farmers who would not the first clear idea as to what constitutes progressive Agriculture—men who sow wheat from year to year in the same spot, and by the blame to Providence when they observe the gradual decrease of the quantity of grain harvested, and who look upon what they term book-farming with its underlining, rotation of crops and improved seeds and stock with the most supreme contempt. But these men, we are happy to say, are a decided minority, the greater number of our agriculturists being men who live with their eyes open, and who are always ready to take advantage of any improvement in the way of implements, stock or seeds, from whatever source it may come. Hence, they prosper, and their journey in almost any direction through the County is enough to convince a care-

ful observer that the farmers are, generally, enjoying a great deal of prosperity. In most sections the old shanty is giving way to the neat and commodious brick dwelling, surrounded by fine frame barns and out-buildings and splendid orchards. The fact is that, in point of good husbandry, our county compares favorably with any other section of Canada or the United States, and there is a consequent abundance of individual wealth and general prosperity. Should a stranger spend three days, respectively, in Goderich, Clinton and Seaford, and see the immense quantities of grain brought to those leading markets, he would have an evidence of the truthfulness of our assertion of the most indubitable nature. But while our farmers should be thankful for the degree of prosperity they have enjoyed, they should remember that a virgin soil does not always remain such, and that unless certain conditions of cultivation are complied with it will certainly become impoverished in the course of time. The rotation of crops and an abundant use of clover can alone, with careful manuring, prevent a serious deterioration of those elements, whose absence would be fatal to the successful growth of the great staples of the county.

It is a fact of no mean importance that, within the past five or six years, a great improvement has taken place in the horses, sheep, cattle and swine raised by our best farmers, and too much praise cannot be awarded to such men as J. J. Fisher, H. Seel, and the Dalles, Anderson, and others who, at considerable expense, have introduced improved stock, by which the farming community is being benefited to a very material extent. The comparatively small size of our Canadian farms, and the nature of our agriculture, demands that farm stock should be of the most improved breeds.—On the Western prairie, where grass is abundant, and where two or three thousand acres of corn are dominated a mere "patch," it may pay to raise droves of cattle of old half-bred, hardy breeds, but it will not do for those who farm their one hundred acres, and the man who, to-day, owns half-dozen seragay cows, and a lot of mungy sheep and racer hogs, proclaims to every passer-by that he is about fifty years behind the best. And after all, good stock pays the best. A few animals of good breed and feeding will invariably bring more in the market than twice the number of brutes which "eat their heads off" and are poor at the end. This principle is generally understood and acted upon by every Huron farmer worthy of the name, and the consequence is that the stock of this County cannot be surpassed in many respects by men who carry on farming on a very large scale.

The County of Huron is at present as near self-sufficiency as it is possible to be. We raise our own bread, feed, common clothing, &c., and we can produce our own sugar, salt and other necessities of life, while our internal improvements in the shape of gravel roads, railway, &c., are unsurpassed. It is most desirable, now that the agriculturists are enjoying such a marked degree of prosperity, that home manufactures of all kinds should be supported and fostered to the utmost possible extent. If the agriculturist implements made in Goderich, Clinton, Seaford, &c., are at all suitable, they should be purchased. If Goderich salt can be bought nearly as cheap as the inferior American article, it is agents should be patronized. And if it is at all possible to establish large woolen and other manufactures, men of enterprise should be encouraged to invest their capital amongst us. "Support home manufactures," should be the motto of every man who has a dollar to spend, for it is thus and thus alone that agriculture and commerce can go on hand in hand to develop the resources of the county and add yearly to its wealth.

The prospects of Huron are truly encouraging and we have no doubt that the exercise of intelligence and the use of every legitimate means of material progress, the County will enjoy, in the future, a still greater degree of prosperity.
