



He was a man of not very great force of character, devoid of ambition for distinction and particularly averse to the pursuit of practical politics and to mixing himself up in the contentions and squables of the period, and yet the fates had fixed upon him to be a figure-head is one of the bitterest political contests ever fought in

the bitter set policical contests ever fought in the states. The leaders of the party of that queer smalgamation of Knownothingism and Free Soilism known as the American party, out of which was afterwards born the Repub-lican party, at the Philadelphis Convention of 1856, in casting about for a candidate for Congress in the Sacond Chio District, ht upon John Scott Harrison, and without an effort on his part, almost without his knowl-edge while the plas was hatching, he was nominated and elected. Old "Pap" Taylor, editor of The Evening Times, the organ of radical Knownothingism, and candidate for Mayor on the "American" city ticket against Jae J. Faron, by whom he was de-feated, was oredited at the time with the discovery and resurrection of the son of old Tippecance, and probably de-nerved the distinction. Mr. Harrison served one term in Congress schieving no distinction, and again returned to pastoral pursuits at North Bend.
