The French army is to be increased by 12,000. London business men are memorializing the government against bi-metalism.

There was a heavy fall of snow in among the Westmorland hills, England, last week. The Government of New South Wales has ordered one hundred lancers for service in India.

Jan. D. Farquharson will likely become premier of P. E. Island in succession to premier Peters. The Western Union Telegraph Company has a surplus of \$7,647,154.93 for the year June 30th, 1897.

The engineers of the colony of Victoria have voted \$5,000 to help the striking engineers in Great Britain. It is said that Fitzsimmons has agreed to fight Corbett again, he to receive \$15,000, whether he wins or loses.

Pratt's fire has caused a loss of several lives near Winnipeg, and destroyed an immense amount of property. Charles A. Dana, editor of the New York Star, died at his home in Glen Cove, Long Island, New York, last night.

The British Government has declined to summon a special session of Parliament to deal with the exceptional distress in Ireland. The Paris correspondent of the Times says France failed to get Russia's support in opposing England's occupation of Egypt.

The Sultan is said to be making strenuous efforts to obtain the withdrawal of American missionaries from the interior of Asia Minor. Lieut. Governor McIntosh, of Northwest Territories asks that a new ministry be formed. The writs for elections have been issued.

The court of arbitration which is to pass on the British-Venezuela boundary has been completed by the selection of M. Martens, the distinguished Russian jurist, as umpire. The New York Morning Register says that W. M. McKay, of St. John, N. B., is now the largest lumber shipper in the world.

Having shipped 300,000,000 feet last year. Rain which fell on Sunday throughout Illinois and Western Indiana marked the end of the long drought that has for months harassed the farmers of twenty of the corn producing or cattle raising states.

Finance Minister Fielding has placed the new £2,000,000 Dominion loan on the London market at 2 1/2 per cent. interest. The principal will be repaid to be paid on Oct. 1, 1917. The minimum price is placed at 15. Nine hundred and seventeen lighthouses dot the British coasts. There is a lighthouse for every fourteen miles of coast in England, thirty-four miles in Ireland, and thirty-nine in Scotland.

Canadian Pacific land sales for the first nine months of the current year will exceed by over \$100,000,000 the total sales of 1896. A feature of sales this year has been that many sections and posts additional land to enlarge their holdings. A Canadian militia general order, issued last week, provides that all appointments for commanding officers are for five years. Any extension of contracts will be for three years.

The order also contains a dispatch from Mr. Chamberlain saying that jubilee medals should be worn with uniform after all English decorations and before all other medals. Croquet Golf. English society has developed a new game called croquet golf. It is played on an ordinary lawn tennis court. Six hoops of peculiar shape are set in a row on either side, with three flag poles down the centre. In play light mallets are used, and balls about midway between golf and croquet balls in size.

The object of the game is to pass each hoop, across the lanes, while the ball strikes each post, with the fewest possible strokes. Each time the ball goes over the outer lane it costs a stroke or more to bring it back. On a really good ground with skilled players it may be done in 14 to 20 strokes, but less adept performers error of judgment in play may raise the score to twice or thrice that figure. It may be played in sides, by partners or "all against all," and provision is made for handicapping a weak player. Croquet has become scientific and serious even to tediousness and lawns tennis is far too violent exercise for all but the most enthusiastic. It is claimed for the new game that it is brisker and more energetic than the former and does not involve the fustian and the exertion of the latter, while it shows off pretty games to advantage, promotes friendship and even flirtation, and keeps people moving, all of which things the wise hostess regards as important.

Behring Sea Conference. London, Oct. 16. - The British Foreign Office to-day intimated to the United States ambassador, Col. Hay, that a meeting of sailing experts of Great Britain, Canada and the United States will occur, as agreed upon by the Marquis of Salisbury. Professor V. Frey Thompson, the seal expert of the British Foreign Office will start for the United States immediately. The Review of Reviews says that Mr. W. T. Stead, while in Washington recently, discovered that unless the sealing question is speedily settled the United States Government will order the destruction of the seal-bird of the outer border of the Pribilof Islands.

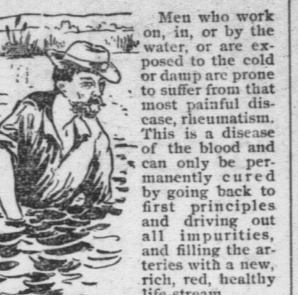
