## York County and Suburbs

### N. TORONTO AND YORK COUNCILS TOGETHER

Talk Parallel Roads and Agree on Basis—County and Suburban News.

NORTH TORONTO, June 22.—(Special.)—At the conference tonight between the councils of the town and York Township to discuss informally the "parallel roads" question good progress was made. The meeting was called primarily to arrive at some equitable basis between the two municipalities as to the relative share of the cost to be borne by each, and this was happily adjusted, after a lot of discussion pro and con.

From the very outset of the negotiations there has been perfect unanimity as to the absolute need of the highway, and the only question was as to the share that each of the municipalities would be expected to pay. The arrangement mutually arrived at for the cost of the expropriation and other proceedings will ensure the vigorous prosecution of the work.

It was pointed out to-night by Reeve Henry that the opening up of this new route would be of immense benefit to the town and incidentally the farming community, and this view was generally shared.

A number of citizens were present, including A. W. Armstrong, H. H. Ball, W. G. Ellis, D. D. Reid and others. Councillor Parke was prevented from being present through indisposition.

Three specially conducted cars passed thru the town this afternoon with a large number of the delegates of the International Council of Women, en route to Roach's Point, where they were the guests of Lady Edgar.

The return trip was made in good time, the party arriving in the city shortly after 10 o'clock, loud in praise of the courtesy accorded by the Metropolitan Railway.

C. L. Wilson personally conducted the party.

#### WEST TORONTO.

WEST TORONTO, June 22.—Superintendent Osborne of the C. P. R. discredits the reports that the merchants of the north side of the ward intend to patronize the G. T. R. with their freight traffic if the C. P. R. persists in keeping the old paths across the railway tracks closed to the public. The officers, together with the executive committee, will meet shortly and prepare the by-laws and other matters incidental to the new association. The Weston Board of Trade starts out with splendid prospects looking to the future interests of the town.

#### YORK TOWNSHIP COUNCIL.

Reeve Henry presided at the regular meeting of the York Township council with Messrs. Watson, Barker, Nelson and Jackson all present.

Prior to the meeting of council the board of health, composed of the Reeve, W. A. Clarke, Mr. Watson, Henry Duncan and the medical health officer met for a short time, but the general health of the township is so satisfactory that there was little for the members to do.

Representing a number of Runnymede ratepayers Mr. Clouston, Mr. Durrant and three or four others appeared to protest formally against any action on the part of the council looking to the closing of Jane-street.

Mr. Clouston spoke briefly, as did Mr. Durrant, the latter representing the board of health, and pointed out that in the event of the installation of a vehicular subway some portion of the cost of construction and maintenance might be assessed against the township, by the railway board, which in the end would probably be the arbiters in the matter.

The township, said the Reeve, "will do nothing rash and ample notice will be given of any movement. Our rights will be carefully safeguarded in the matter."

Mr. Clouston, Mr. Maclean and the other members of the deputation expressed satisfaction with the statement of Reeve Henry.

T. N. Phelan, representing Mr. McMurray, asked council to consider favorably the opening up of the old Dave's road from the Massey farm northerly thru Mr. McMurray's property. Scarborough council are now said to view the matter favorably.

Mr. Gordon of McCarthy, Osler & Moss, opposed the assessment for the Spadina-avenue sewer against the Toronto and Niagara Power Co. on the Davenport power station. Assessment stands.

A deputation from Wychwood consisting of Wm. Dewar, John Hall, W. H. Stephenson, J. E. H. and John Stibbald asked council to assist in the establishment of a volunteer fire brigade, allowing the use of the fire engine and the sum of \$6000, the estimated cost of installing the plant. It is proposed to secure water from the city, and the cost of the expense will be borne by the district. Insurance rates are said to be almost prohibitive in the district, one of the deputation stating on a \$200 risk the premium was \$3 for three years.
