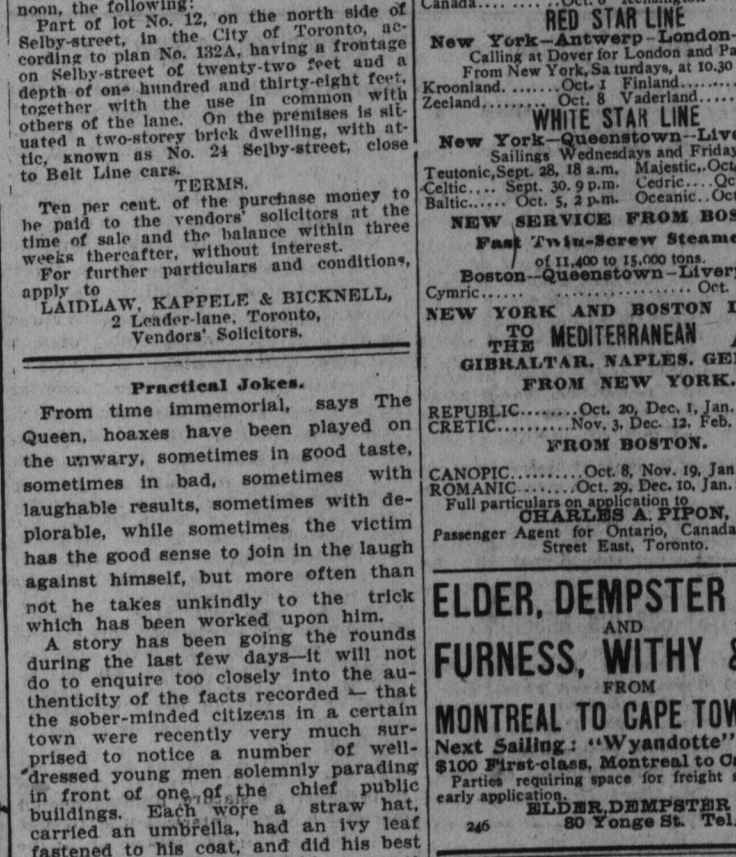

### SAYS BORDER ALIENATED HIS WIFE'S AFFECTIONS

#### Charles Stickle Suing Charles Flick for Unstated Damages for Alleged Improper Behavior.

A case of trials, tribulations and domestic woes reached the assize court yesterday in that of Charles Stickle against Charles G. Flick. The action is for unstated damages for alienation of Mrs. Stickle's affection, and a number of other charges, which go to make a sensation.

The only witness yesterday was Mr. Stickle, the complainant. His evidence was mostly hearsay and what he had been told by his sister, his cousin, his daughter and a young woman who was formerly an employe of the Robinson House. Also the defendant Flick had been an inmate of his house for some years he had never seen any wrongdoing or any actions that aroused his suspicions that Mrs. Stickle and Mr. Flick were on too intimate terms.

Witness did not state that after coming to Toronto to reside his wife became fond of the defendant. Flick was in the habit of keeping liquor in his room. He asked his boarder not to furnish Mrs. Stickle with liquor, but it did not seem to have much effect. After a time the boarder and the wife became more friendly. The husband admonished with both of them, and was assured that everything was right and proper.

Mrs. Stickle, witness said, was fond of society, theatres and the races. He frequently asked Flick to take her and act as her escort to various places of amusement.

Also witness claimed that his wife had been on too friendly terms with three different men residents of Hamilton, in the years 1887 and 1888. He was not told of it until this year. His relatives claimed to have known of these alleged acts at the time, but they said nothing to him, about it.

Wrongdoing, which is alleged occurred with Flick, was also in 1888, but he was not advised of it until a few months ago.

**REDUCE FRUIT FREIGHT RATES.**  
Railways Make Concessions as Result of Recent Protests.

As a result of the complaints of the Fruit Growers' Association at the recent session of the railway commission, the freight rates will be materially reduced. The railways have communicated these reductions to W. H. Bunt, president of the Fruit Growers' Association, who in turn has sent the statement to H. E. Cowan, editor of The Canadian Horticulturist.

The reductions made are material in car lots shipped from larger sections, principally Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal, Quebec and Winnipeg. Special rates are also made for half car lots of 10,000 pounds or over. The concessions made are equal to about 40 per cent. on fruit from Toronto and Montreal, and about 38 per cent. to the Northwest. In addition to these concessions the rate for ice on cars destined for Manitoba has been lessened. Hereafter the shipper will be charged only the actual amount of ice used. Apples, whether in boxes or barrels, will be carried at the same rate, and it is understood that pears in boxes or barrels will be in the same class as apples in the future.

While these concessions are not all that the committee representing the fruit industry asked for and considered reasonable, they are a measure of relief to a very serious situation.

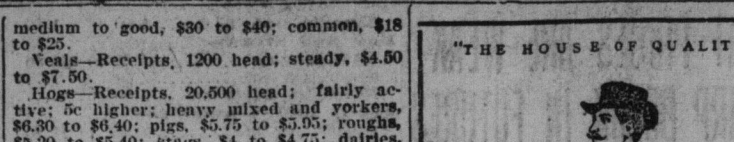
